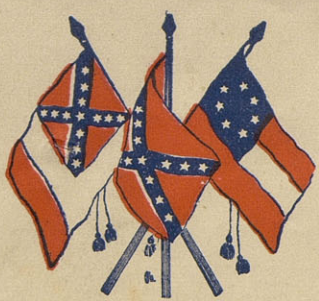

Bulls run but not in action at seven pines with
Heavy Loss. at Ganes Mill first day of the
seven days fight there we were with
Stonewall Jackson was with him till he was
killed I was shot at Sharpsburg was left
on the battle field 3 days my wound got full
of worms the sisters rescued me I was
in the Maryland road South Mountain at
the capture of Harpers ferry Seder run Fredericks-
burg my last fight was Gettysburg Pa I was
captured and sent to Fort Delaware there
our rations was 3 hard tacks and one
ounce of meat 2 a day 1 cup of soup 1 g^{stud} of
beans to 100 gallons of water I that
22 months was sent back to Richmond
they furlowed ^{me} I went to Vaughns dismounted
camp at Bristol they left me I stoped at
a private house and was recaptured by

William Stokes put in jail at Greenville Tenn
and tried for bushwhacking then to Knoxville
jail Chattanooga was then taken to Nashville
and put in the Penitentiary I got my freedom
on the 27th day of April 1865 - W. C. Allen
