

USUALLY WORLD SERIES WEATHER IS EXCELLENT. SELDOM IS A GAME POSTPONED BECAUSE OF BAD WEATHER.

BUT IN 1925 THE SEVENTH AND DECIDING GAME OF THE FALL CLASSIC AT PITTSBURGH WAS THREATENED. A COLD RAIN HAD TURNED THE FIELD INTO A NEAR SWAMPLAND WHEN THE SENATORS AND PIRATES TOOK THE FIELD.

BUT THE UMPIRE BELLOWED "PLAY BALL" AND THE CONTEST WAS ON. VIC ALDRIDGE WAS THE PITTSBURGH PITCHER WHEN THE SENATORS CAME TO BAT IN THE FIRST INNING. HE HAD ALREADY POSTED TWO VICTORIES IN THE SERIES.

A STEADY RAIN FELL ON FORBES FIELD AND THE SENATORS TOOK ADVANTAGE OF IT. ALDRIDGE GAVE UP A COUPLE OF WALKS AND A HIT. THEN ANOTHER WALK....THEN A WILD PITCH. THAT WAS ENOUGH FOR THE HOMESIDE PITCHER. ALDRIDGE WAS RELIEVED BY JOHNNY MORRISON. HE UNCORKED A WILD PITCH TOO...AND THE SENATORS HAD ANOTHER RUN.

MORRISON WAS ABLE TO RETIRE THE NEXT BATTER...BUT THE SENATORS SENT ANOTHER RUN ACROSS WHEN A PIRATE INFIELDER SLIPPED IN THE MUD ON A ROUTINE GROUNDER.

WALTER JOHNSON WAS THE SENATOR PITCHER. HE WAS SEEKING HIS THIRD WIN IN THE SERIES. HE RETIRED THE PIRATES IN THE FIRST TWO INNINGS BUT RAN INTO TROUBLE. PITTSBURGH SCORED THREE TIMES.

BY INNING NUMBER SEVEN THE FORBES FIELD AREA WAS COVERED BY MIST, AND THE RAIN CONTINUED. AT THIS POINT THE SENATORS LED, 6-4.

THE WEATHER AFFECTED PLAY IN THE SEVENTH. WASHINGTON SHORTSTOP ROGER PECKINPAUGH SLIPPED WHILE GOING BACK FOR A FLY BALL. A DOUBLE SCORED ONE RUN AND A TRIPLE BY PIE TRAYNOR ADDED ANOTHER. NOW IT WAS TIED AT 6-6.

QUARTERBACK JOHNNY UNITAS (YOO-NIGH-TUHS) OF THE BALTIMORE COLTS HOLDS THE NATIONAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE RECORD FOR MOST TOUCHDOWN PASSES IN A CAREER.

... TO THE DAY HE FIRST BROKE THAT RECORD.
BUT WASHINGTON NUDGED AHEAD IN THE EIGHTH WHEN PECKINPAUGH SOCKED A HOMER. BUT THE PIRATES BOUNCED BACK. A COUPLE OF DOUBLES SCORED ONE RUN TO SQUARE IT AT 7-7.

BEFORE LONG THE SENATORS LOADED THE BASES. A MIGHTY WET AND TIRED WALTER JOHNSON FACED KIKI CUYLER. CUYLER PICKED OUT A FAST BALL AND DRILLED IT ALONG THE FIRST BASE LINE FOR A DOUBLE. TWO RUNS SLIPPED ACROSS AND THE PIRATES HAD THE LEAD, 9-7.

THAT'S THE WAY IT ENDED. THE PIRATES CLINCHED THE 1925 WORLD SERIES WITH A SOGGY VICTORY OVER THE SENATORS.

QUARTERBACK JOHNNY UNITAS (YOO-NIGH-TUHS) OF THE BALTIMORE COLTS HOLDS THE NATIONAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE RECORD FOR MOST TOUCHDOWN PASSES IN A CAREER.

BUT LET'S GO BACK TO THE DAY HE FIRST BROKE THAT RECORD.

IT WAS SEPTEMBER 18TH, 1966. THE COLTS WERE AT ST. PAUL-MINNEAPOLIS TO PLAY TO MINNESOTA VIKINGS. UNITAS WAS IN HIS 10TH N-F-L SEASON.

THE COLTS SPOTTED MINNESOTA 16 POINTS BEFORE DENTING THE SCORING COLUMN. TOMMY MASON REELED OFF A 52-YARD TOUCHDOWN RUN IN THE FIRST QUARTER AND FRED COX FOLLOWED WITH THREE CONSECUTIVE FIELD GOALS.

BUT UNITAS HIT JOHN MACKY WITH A 38-YARD TOUCHDOWN PASS ON A THIRD DOWN AND 17 PLAY. LOU MICHAELS ADDED A 44-YARD FIELD GOAL BEFORE THE HALF.

THE VIKINGS DROVE TO THE BALTIMORE ONE JUST BEFORE THE HALF ENDED. BUT THEY COULD NOT SCORE ON TWO PLAYS.

IT WAS ALL UNITAS AFTER THE INTERMISSION.

A CAREER RECORD WAS IN SIGHT AND UNITAS KNEW IT.

IN THE LAST HALF, THE BALTIMORE QUARTERBACK CONNECTED ON THREE TOUCHDOWN PASSES.

THE FIRST WAS A 40-YARDER TO RAY BERRY...THE SECOND A 26-YARDER TO MACKY...AND THE THIRD A FOUR-YARD TOSS TO TOM MATTE (MAT-TEE).

LINEBACKER MIKE CURTIS ALSO HELPED. HE RECOVERED A MINNESOTA FUMBLE IN THE END ZONE FOR A COLT TOUCHDOWN.

THE FINAL SCORE WAS THE COLTS 38, MINNESOTA 23.

(FR) BUT BACK TO UNITAS. HIS FOUR TOUCHDOWN PASSES ADDED UP TO A (RO) CAREER TOTAL OF 214, TWO MORE THAN THE PREVIOUS CAREER RECORD SET BY Y-A TITTLE.

FRAZIER'S ATTACK.

CHUVALO'S CORNERMEN WORKED FEVERISHLY TO STEM THE FLOW.

THE FACE OF THE THEN 29-YEAR-OLD CHUVALO WAS A MASK OF CRIMSON AND HIS RIGHT EYE WAS COMPLETELY CLOSED IN THE SECOND ROUND.

CHUVALO MANAGED TO STAGGER THE YOUNG PHILADELPHIAN WITH A BLOW TO THE TOP OF THE HEAD IN THE THIRD ROUND. BUT HE WAS BACKED AGAINST THE ROPES AS FRAZIER RESUMED THE RELENTLESS FLAILING.

WHEN CHUVALO WAS BACKED INTO HIS OWN CORNER AT THE START OF THE FOURTH ROUND, REFEREEE JOHNNY COLAN HELD UP HIS HANDS. HE HAD DECIDED THAT CHUVALO COULDN'T TAKE FURTHER PUNISHMENT. THE FIGHT WAS STOPPED AT 16 SECONDS OF THE FOURTH ROUND.

EVERYTHING CONSIDERED, HEAVYWEIGHT BOUTS ARE THE BIGGEST UNCERTAINTY IN BOXING.

A FIGHTER REPUTED AS A KNOCKOUT ARTIST OFTEN WINDS UP ON THE CANVAS.

IN 1967, HEAVYWEIGHT JOE FRAZIER STARTED THE YEAR BY KNOCKING OUT DOUG JONES IN THE SIXTH ROUND AT PHILADELPHIA. THEN HE WAS MATCHED WITH CANADA'S GEORGE CHUVALO (SHUH-VAHL-OH) FOR A JULY BOUT AT NEW YORK.

CHUVALO HAD THE BETTER BACKGROUND. IT WAS CHUVALO'S BOAST THAT HE HAD NEVER BEEN STOPPED OR FLOORED.

FRAZIER WASN'T IMPRESSED.

HE OPENED A SLIGHT CUT ON THE LEFT SIDE OF CHUVALO'S HEAD IN THE FIRST MINUTE OF THE FIRST ROUND. THEN HE OPENED ANOTHER CUT UNDER CHUVALO'S RIGHT EYE.

THE CANADIAN SEEMED STUNNED BY THE SAVAGERY OF FRAZIER'S ATTACK.

CHUVALO'S CORNERMEN WORKED FEVERISHLY TO STEM THE FLOW.

THE FACE OF THE THEN 29-YEAR-OLD CHUVALO WAS A MASK OF CRIMSON AND HIS RIGHT EYE WAS COMPLETELY CLOSED IN THE SECOND ROUND.

CHUVALO MANAGED TO STAGGER THE YOUNG PHILADELPHIAN WITH A BLOW TO THE TOP OF THE HEAD IN THE THIRD ROUND. BUT HE WAS BACKED AGAINST THE ROPES AS FRAZIER RESUMED THE RELENTLESS FLAILING.

WHEN AN ATHLETE CALLS HIS SHOT IN ANY SPORT HE GOES OUT ON LIMB... ESPECIALLY IN GOLF.

BUT IN 1931, TOMMY ARMOUR, THE GREAT SCOTTISH GOLFER, FLOUTED THE LAW OF AVERAGES AND PREDICTED HE WOULD WIN THE BRITISH OPEN THAT YEAR.

ARMOUR STARTED THE FINAL ROUND AT A DISADVANTAGE. JOSE JURADO (HOH-ZAY SHUHR-RAH'-DOH) FROM ARGENTINA HELD A FIVE STROKE LEAD AT THE END OF THE FIRST NINE. BUT ARMOUR WOULDN'T GIVE UP, EVEN THOUGH THE LAST NINE HOLES HAD TO BE PLAYED AGAINST A STRONG WIND.

ARMOUR TOOK A FOUR ON THE TENTH HOLE, THEN BIRDIED THE ELEVENTH. THE NEXT HOLE WAS A TOUGH ONE...SURROUNDED BY SAND TRAPS. TOMMY REACHED THE GREEN IN GOOD SHAPE...THEN TOOK THREE STROKES TO GET DOWN.

ARMOUR BLEW ANOTHER EASY PUTT ON THE 15TH, ON THE 16TH HE REACHED THE GREEN IN TWO, THEN SANK A 30-FOOT PUTT.

ARMOUR COMPLETED THE BACK NINE AND FINISHED WITH AN OVERALL SCORE OF 296...THEN CAME THE WAITING.

WORD CAME BACK THAT JURADO WAS ON THE 14TH HOLE...NEEDING ONLY A TWO OVER PAR THE REST OF THE WAY TO WIN.

CAME THE LAST TWO HOLES AND ALL JURADO NEEDED WAS PAR...BUT IT WAS NOT TO BE. THE ACE FROM ARGENTINA WENT ONE OVER ON THE 17TH. HE COULD STILL WIN WITH A BIRDIE ON THE LAST HOLE. HE REACHED THE GREEN IN GOOD SHAPE AND THE GALLERY HELD ITS BREATH AS HE LINED UP TO PUTT.

JURADO TOOK HIS TIME. HE WALKED BACK, BENT DOWN AND LINED THE BALL WITH THE CUP. HE THEN APPROACHED THE BALL, BROUGHT THE PUTTER BACK SLOWLY, CAME FORWARD AND TAPPED THE BALL. IT ROLLED TOWARD THE CUP...RIMMED IT...AND DRIFTED AWAY.

IT WAS ALL OVER. TOMMY ARMOUR HAD WON THE 1931 BRITISH OPEN TITLE... JUST AS HE PREDICTED HE WOULD.

ONE THING ABOUT STANLEY KETCHEL...HE WASN'T AFRAID OF ANY MAN HE EVER STEPPED INTO A RING WITH.

ALTHOUGH ONLY A MIDDLEWEIGHT, KETCHEL EVEN FOUGHT HEAVYWEIGHT CHAMPION JACK JOHNSON...RATED ONE OF THE FINEST THAT DIVISION EVER PRODUCED.

THE FIGHT WITH JOHNSON BEGAN WITH A SMALLER KETCHEL WADING RIGHT IN, THROWING PUNCHES FROM ALL ANGLES. THEY DIDN'T SEEM TO HURT THE GIANT NEGRO CHAMPION BUT KETCHEL CONTINUED TO POUND AWAY THROUGHOUT THE ROUND.

KETCHEL FINALLY CONNECTED WITH A TELLING BLOW IN THE SECOND ROUND AND JOHNSON BACKED UP TWO STEPS. THIS SEEMED TO ANGER JOHNSON WHO SHOOK HIS HEAD, CAUGHT KETCHEL WITH A ROCKING RIGHT...AND DOWN HE WENT FOR A NINE COUNT.

KETCHEL BEAT THE COUNT...BUT REALIZED JOHNSON'S POWER AND CHANGED HIS TACTICS TO A DANCING, BOXING ATTACK.

THE ROUNDS ROLLED BY AND THE FANS SAT STUNNED AS KETCHEL DID SOMETHING THAT HAD NEVER BEEN ACCOMPLISHED...STAND UP AND BOX WITH THE GREAT JOHNSON.

CAME THE 12TH SESSION AND KETCHEL PULLED ANOTHER SURPRISE. THE REFEREE BROKE UP A CLINCH, KETCHEL STEPPED BACK, DUCKED A HOOK AND CAUGHT JOHNSON WITH A SAVAGE RIGHT. THE HEAVYWEIGHT CHAMPION WENT DOWN, A BEILWDERED, SURPRISED LOOK ON HIS FACE...AS THE CROWD ROSE TO ITS FEET SCREAMING IN AMAZEMENT.

SIMPSON'S CHIEF RIVAL FOR THE HEISMAN TROPHY IS EXPECTED TO BE RUNNING BACK LEROY KEYES OF PURDUE. KEYES FINISHED THIRD IN THE VOTING LAST YEAR, BEHIND U-C-L-A'S GARY BEBAN, NOW A PRO, AND SIMPSON. PURDUE AND SOUTHERN CAL ARE NOT SCHEDULED TO MEET THIS YEAR DURING THE REGULAR SEASON, SO THE BATTLE BETWEEN SIMPSON AND KEYES FOR THE HEISMAN AWARD WILL HAVE TO BE JUDGED ON THEIR SHOWING AGAINST OTHER TEAMS. BUT THEY COULD MEET IN THE ROSE BOWL ON NEW YEAR'S DAY, AND THAT COULD PRESENT AN INTERESTING HEAD-ON CONFRONTATION.
