# Judge Ireland Portrait Is Unveiled

**Ceremony Held In Courtroom  
Saturday Morning Before  
Bar Association Members**

CATLETTSBURG: An excellent portrait of Judge William Crutcher Ireland who served as circuit judge of Boyd county for a six-year term beginning in 1874, was unveiled with appropriate ceremonies during Saturday morning's Circuit Court motion hour. The portrait was presented to the Boyd County Bar Association by Judge Ireland's only grandson, Ireland Hampton, a well-known attorney of Fort Worth, Texas.

A tribute to the memory of Judge Ireland, written by Mrs. John F. Hager of 1304 Bath avenue, Ashland, was read before the Bar Association by Attorney Frank C. Malin. It will appear in full in a later edition of the Independent.

The addition of Judge Ireland's portrait to the collection on the south wall of the circuit courtroom brings the judicial gallery to seven. Other former judges whose portraits have been unveiled previously are Stephen G. Kinner, George N. Brown, John M. Burns, John M. Rice, William C. Halbert and Henry L. Woods.
