Dear Son

read your letter Post marked A.S. Navy
stating you planned on getting to San F
Oct 1 you don't know how happy we
are Annie wrote you a long letter yesterday
but sent it to Nola's Address Salinas Calif

720 No Main I went down today and
got you a pretty Scheffer Pen & Pencil
set it is from Nova Annie & I hope
you like it. I've wrote you this before
but you may get this letter first
Bro Robertson had your letter sent to
Nola's Address he asked it to be sent Oct
4 which was a very short time given
them we also sent a box in Nola's care
with Sox socks, shirts (all the kind we could get)
3 pairs undershirts Bill fold from Nova money in
it from Dad The Blank Checks you can use

to check on your account but the United States Employees Compensation Commission issue a travels order to the point where you was taken from to make them advance a substantial sum for money due so that means you will be sent to Alameda Calif. for you will be paid for the time you were in custody of the Japs. and as I have already wrote you the Lord was good to us and gave us a good fruit crop sold more than \$4,000 worth of fruit and you will be able to start out farming with your dad he wants you & him to get some more land so can have more stock. he had to let so many things go for he was not able to do all there was to do we have near \$5,000 in the bank and \$2,500 or \$3,000 in Gov. bonds which is partly in your name I. M. Moore is not of the Army working for Warricks.

Now Son you have not changed any
more than the ones that are here at
home Dad & I had to work awful
hard to keep things going hired very little
help when you get here you have
a nice comfortable bed. I enclosed in
my letter this A.M. The letter Sally
wrote after she got married I wrote you
in a letter to be sent thro. The Red Cross
but you had not got it when you wrote
she sent the ring clock and camera
I must close and mail this we are
all well Dad is trying to sow his
wheat pasture have good moisture
and plenty to do. Son be careful with
your diet hope to see you soon

you but I wrote her you did not want
any one to you but she has a telephone
her address Salinas Calif 720 No Main
you can call her and please call

Dearest Mother & Daddy Capps -

I know you must think I am awful for not writing, but so much has happened since I last wrote you.

Both of my brothers from the Pacific came home last month and we have really been busy. Then too I got married on the 12th, to a kid who just came back. I wrote to him all the time he was gone but never dreamed I would be married to him now. They all 3 got their discharges under the point system. The two boys have been in and out of the hospital with malaria since their return. They look good to have spent 4/ months over there. Don was

more fortunate, he didn't contract any diseases while he was over there. He is really a grand person and I know we will be happy.

I do hope you have heard something from Arthur by now. I am sending you the ring he sent me from Los Angeles before he sailed. He told me in his last letter to send it to you in the event I changed my mind.

I do hope you won't think badly of me, but it seems that Alon and I have really always loved each other but it took this turmoil to make us realize just how much time we have wasted.

We have really been having some rotten weather lately. It rains almost every day just about the time I start home from work.

Please forgive me if I have hurt you in anyway. It has really been wonderful corresponding with you and I feel as if I had known you for years and years.

Arthur also left his little clock in my care and I am sending it too.
