DENTON (VALLEY) COMMUNITY

IN 1854 G. W. DENTON PATENTED A LARGE AMOUNT OF LAND IN CALLAHAN CO. TO BE KNOWN AS DENTON COMMUNITY AND LATER CALLED DENTON VALLEY. LOCATED NEAR THE CORNER OF HWY 36 AND FM 604 WAS A GRIST MILL, COTTON GIN, POST OFFICE, BLACKSMITH SHOP, GENERAL STORE, TWO CHURCHES, TWO CEMETERIES AND A SCHOOL. NORTH OF HWY 36 ON FM 604 - 2.5 MILES THE OLD CEMETERY, NOW CALLED PLEASANT VALLEY, WAS IN USE IN THE 1880'S - 5 MILES KENDRICK CEMETERY ON LAND DONATED BY HARVEY KENDRICK IN 1926 - 5 MILES THE BAPTIST CHURCH BEGAN IN 1910 ON LAND DEEDED BY T. W. KEBLINGER AND IS STILL IN OPERATION - 1 MILE THE METHODIST CHURCH ON LAND DONATED BY TACK HOLLAND STARTED IN 1882 AND BURNED ON JAN. 5, 1974.

THE DENTON SCHOOL DISTRICT WAS PETITIONED ON APR. 13, 1899 BY TRUSTEES T. B. HOLLAND, WORTH WILLIAMS AND MAT CRAWFORD. THE FIRST SCHOOL WAS LOCATED 1.5 MILES SOUTH OF HWY 36 ON FM 604 ON LAND DONATED BY C. H. WILLEFORD. IN 1923 DENTON, ROUGH CREEK, PLEASANT VIEW AND EAGLE CAVE CONSOLIDATED AND MOVED 1.5 MILES NORTH OF HWY 36 ON FM 604. LATER DUDLEY CONSOLIDATED WITH DENTON IN 1938. THE SCHOOL CONTINUED UNTIL NOV. 14, 1956 WHEN IT WAS ANNEXED TO THE CLYDE SCHOOL DISTRICT AND CLOSED.
