I, John H Hardy do hereby make application to the Commissioner of Pensions for a pension to be granted me under the Act passed by the Thirty <sup>3rd</sup> ~~3rd~~ Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved ~~March 26~~ <sup>1913</sup> A. D. ~~1905~~, on the following grounds:

The records show that John W. Hardy, private, Company E (not found on rolls of Company A), 20th Alabama Infantry, Confederate States Army, enlisted September 10, 1861. On the roll for January and February, 1863, last on file, he was reported present.

On a muster roll of a detachment, Company (L), 23d Mississippi Infantry, Confederate States Army, dated June 30, 1863, J. W. Hardy, private, Co. E, 20th Alabama Infantry, Confederate States Army, is reported "absent, sick hosp., Canton."

The records also show that J. W. Hardy, private, Company A, 20th Alabama Infantry, Confederate States Army, was paroled May 2, 1865, at Salisbury, North Carolina, in accordance with the terms of the military convention of April 26, 1865.

### CONFEDERATE ALABAMA TROOPS

#### 20th Regiment, Alabama Infantry

**OVERVIEW:** 20th Infantry Regiment completed its organization in September, 1861, at Montgomery, Alabama. The men were recruited in the counties of Jefferson, [Greene](#), Bibb, Perry, Dallas, Hale, Tuscaloosa, Washington, and Russell. After serving at Mobile the unit was brigaded under Generals Barton, Tracy, and S.D. Lee. It moved to Kentucky, but prior to the Battle of Murfreesboro it was ordered to Mississippi. Here it took an active part in the conflicts at [Port Gibson](#) and [Champion's Hill](#) and was captured on July 4, 1863, when [Vicksburg](#) fell. Exchanged and reorganized, the 20th was placed in General Pettus' Brigade, Army of Tennessee. It was involved in various battles from [Chattanooga](#) to [Nashville](#) and ended the war in North Carolina. This unit contained 836 men in December, 1861, sustained 58 casualties at Chattanooga, and totalled 526 men and 376 arms on December 14, 1863. During January, 1865 there were 305 present, and it surrendered with about 165. The field officers were Colonels Charles D. Anderson, James M. Dedman, I.W. Garrott, and Edmund W. Pettus; Lieutenant Colonels John W. Davis and Mitchell T. Porter; and Majors John G. Harris and Alfred S. Pickering.
