James fought for the south in the Civil War and received a pension from the state of Texas. The story is told that when his family decided to leave Mississippi and go to Texas about 1871, they walked all the way behind their yoke of oxen.

Shortly after Roxanna's death James Cullen married his brother Joseph "Joe" wife Gillian "Gilly" Angelina Rickman Hardin. The marriage was understood to be a marriage of convenience in order to provide parents for the children of both families. Once the children were raised they both lived in separate counties for the rest of their lives. James Cullen was known as "Uncle Cull" throughout the area of Kirkland in Childress County Texas where he lived after 1913.

I, *James C. Hardin* do hereby make application to the Commissioner of Pensions for a pension to be granted me under the Act passed by the 33rd Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, 1913, on the following grounds:

I enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that I did not desert the Confederate service, but during said war I was loyal and true to my duty, and never at any time voluntarily abandoned my post of duty in the said service; or that I was in the service of the State of Texas during the war, to protect said State against the Indians and Mexicans for more than 6 months.

That I was honorably discharged or surrendered. *When our Company learned of the surrender we disbanded in the latter part of May 1865. We were on a march - then near Duck Hill Miss*

I do further state that I do not hold any National, State, city or county office which pays me a salary or fees of \$300.00 per annum, nor have I an income from any other employment or other source whatever which amounts to \$300.00 per annum, nor do I receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value to the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does any one hold in trust for my benefit or use, nor does my wife own, nor does any one hold in trust for my wife, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the assessed value of over one thousand dollars, exclusive of a home of the value of not more than \$1000.00; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and that I am not an inmate of the Confederate Home, and I do further State that the answers given to the following questions are true:
