# MINUTES OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING OCTOBER 14, 1967

### Minutes Board of Directors Meeting

#### October 14, 1967

- Ml. The Board of Directors of Texas Technological College met in regular session on Saturday, October 14, 1967, at 9:30 a.m., in the Mesa Room of the Student Union Building. The following Directors were present: Chairman Roy Furr, Vice Chairman C. A. Cash, Mr. Alvin R. Allison, Mr. Marshall Formby, Mr. Harold Hinn and Mr. Retha R. Martin. Also present were Executive Vice President W. M. Pearce, Vice President for Academic Affairs S. M. Kennedy, Vice President for Business Affairs M. L. Pennington and Secretary J. Roy Wells.
- M2. The meeting was called to order by Mr. Furr, who called on Dr. Pearce to offer the invocation.
- M3. Upon motion made by Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. Formby, the Board by a unanimous vote approved the Board Minutes of the Board Meeting of August 26, 1967.
- M4. Upon motion made by Mr. Cash, seconded by Mr. Allison, the Board by a majority vote ratified administrative action not previously submitted to the Board. Mr. Formby requested that his vote be recorded "no" on Attachment No. 79 "Faculty and Staff Parking Regulations for 1967-1968". (Items Al through Al62; Bl through B87; Cl through Cl07; Dl through D70; El through E194; Fl through F26; Gl through Glll; and Hl through H276.)
  - M5. Mr. Formby, reporting for the Academic Affairs Committee, requested that the following items be placed on the agenda for consideration at the December Board Meeting. (1) The Code of Student Affairs; (2) The Proposed Charter of a Faculty Council; and (3) The Platform for the Growth and Development of Texas Technological College.
  - M6. Upon motion made by Mr. Formby, seconded by Mr. Hinn, the Board by a unanimous vote adopted a Resolution of Endorsement of Amendment No. 6 (H.J.R. No. 27) to be presented to the voters of Texas on November 11, 1967 (Constitutional Amendment No. 6). A copy of the Resolution is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 117.
  - M7. Mr. Hinn, Chairman of the Campus and Building Committee, gave the report for this committee. The next eleven (11) items record the official Board action and/or progress on several projects.
  - M8. The project architects, O'Neil Ford and Associates, for the Architecture and Art Facility have been requested to proceed with design development utilizing the number of buildings needed for the solution and to report to the Campus Planning Committee when they have something to show.
  - M9. The project architects, Pitts, Mebane, Phelps and White, for the Chemistry Building addition have been requested to proceed with the development of the plans as rapidly as possible and to report to the Campus Planning Committee as soon as drawings are available.
- MIO. Mr. Harold Hinn, Chairman of the Campus and Building Committee, requested the project architects, Harrell and Hamilton, for the Law School Building to make a brief presentation showing the proposed design.
- Following the presentation by Mr. Hamilton, Mr. Allison made a motion that the Law School Building be located at the corner of College Avenue and Nineteenth Street. The motion was seconded by Mr. Martin. Chairman Furr called for a vote, and the motion failed to carry.
- M11. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Formby, the Board by a unanimous vote instructed the Campus Planning Committee and the Campus Architect to make a study as rapidly as possible of all the elements in connection with locating the Law School at the corner of College Avenue and Nineteenth Street and to be prepared to give Mr. Cash and Mr. Hinn a report on November 18, 1967.

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- M12. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Allison, the Board by a unanimous vote approved the preliminary plans for the Law School Building and authorized the project architects to proceed with the final plans and specifications.
- M13. Mr. Hinn reported that satisfactory progress was being made on the installation of additional campus lighting and walks.
- M14. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Martin, the Board by a unanimous vote approved the plans for the remodeling of the Snack Bar area of the Student Union and authorized the Campus Planning Committee to proceed with the necessary work to accomplish the remodeling at an estimated cost of \$74,778.00.
- M15. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Cash, the Board by a unanimous vote approved the schematic plans prepared by Howard Schmidt and Associates for the Textile Chemical Research Laboratory and authorized the architects to proceed with final plans and specifications.
- M16. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Martin, the Board by a unanimous vote requested the Campus Planning Committee to make a thorough-going study pertaining to the building of a number of swimming pools suitable for year-round use in connection with the dormitory complexes on the campus.
- M17. The Board discussed briefly the vehicular traffic problem at Fifteenth Street and College Avenue and requested the Campus Planning Committee to explore the entire traffic picture with the city.
- M18. Mr. Hinn made the following statement in connection with The Wiggins Complex, Phase II:
  - "We didn't discuss the matter of the additional dormitory buildings, but it was believed to be prudent, due to the fact that one of the halls is empty, to wait one more year and then take a look at it. I think everyone automatically had the same general feeling about it."
- M19. Upon motion made by Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. Formby, the Board by a unanimous vote approved the recommendation of the Finance Committee that the Texas Technological College Utility Plant Student Fee Revenue Bonds, which are to be sold on December 9, 1967, be sold under the dealer bid method as recommended by the fiscal agent.
- M20. Upon motion made by Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. Cash, the Board by a unanimous vote adopted a Resolution approving the action of the Texas Technological College Foundation Board of Directors accepting the offer of the City of Lubbock in the amount of \$132,100.00 for the McClellan Property located at Nineteenth Street and College Avenue and authorized the Chairman and Secretary to sign the necessary Resolution and other papers necessary to complete the sale. - M21. Dr. George G. Heather, Dean of the School of Business Administration, gave a report on the School of Business Administration. A copy of the report is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 118.
- M22. Chairman Furr called on Dr. S. M. Kennedy for his report. The text of the report is given below:

"Dr. Murray asked me to give his report.

"First of all, you've heard from Dean Heather the details of Business Administration enrollment. We had a total of 18,646 students registered. The significant shifts, in my opinion, are that the lower division enrollments are down, and the upper division and graduate enrollments are up rather significantly—another indication of the maturing of the student body. The actual data: freshmen, down 221; sophomores, down 8; juniors, up 693 (this is the impact of our junior colleges; we can look forward to a much larger increase in the number of junior students); seniors, up 130; graduates, up 275.

"The Governor has written a letter to each institution and urged them to be prudent and to exercise economy in preparing requests. He also made a statement that those who exercise prudence would have their requests looked at with greater favor.

"The data on the research activities of the institution are worthy of mention. We now are operating at a rate of in excess of one million dollars a year. This is the first time it has happened here. It may be another plateau which is a benchmark in our maturing. Private funds account for a quarter of a million and federal funds for one-half million. From state sources we're getting a substantially increased amount over last year. State sources are about \$750,000.00--a little more from all sources. There will be mailed to you copies of the research report given to the Academic Affairs Committee yesterday. Dr. Murray wanted you to know that the search for a Vice President for Research in proceeding with considerable speed, and he has had recommendations on 25 people who are outstanding in this area.

"There has been in process for some months a program to develop the Department of Mathematics. Through the National Science Foundation an institution can select an area and try to develop it with a special grant. This department is very important to other areas on the campus. We think we can present an excellent application. Competition will be keen.

"The Placement Service has issued an excellent report. Last year was their busiest year--growing at a rate which indicates the employers of the nation are aware of our products.

"An educational television policy committee is in the process of being appointed. Dr. Murray's list will be out very shortly. The work for the Western Information Network continues.

"Probably the most significant thing is the distribution to you of The Platform for the Growth and Development of Texas Tech, which will be discussed at the December meeting. This is a philosophical basis on which to cast a look ahead. It takes into account where we have been and indicates some directions and guidelines on how to make the growth that those who support the institution want to make.

"There are two other items: Dr. Pearce and Mr. Pennington will report."

DR. PEARCE: "Dr. Murray asked me to inform you that action has been taken to insure that dormitory residents are properly instructed as they register on the location of fire extinguishers, exits, procedures to follow, etc. in case of fire."

MR. PENNINGTON: "The residence hall occupancy as of October 13, excluding Coleman Hall which has 572 spaces and no occupants, is 93.4 percent. The men's occupancy is 92.3 percent with 276 vacancies, and the women's is 94.2 with 277 vacancies.

"The Centrex telephone system was switched over on October 3. There was little mechanical difficulty. This is the largest that Southwestern Bell has installed for one customer. Some additional trunk lines are in the process of installation. This system has 6,030 instruments."

DR. KENNEDY: "This is all, with the exception of a report which I just got from Dr. Murray. He expresses again his regrets for his inability to attend this meeting."

M23. The meeting adjourned at 11:45 a.m. until the next regular meeting on December 9, 1967, Texas Technological College, Student Union, at 9:30 a.m.

#### FACULTY AND STAFF PARKING REGULATIONS

#### 1967-68

#### INTRODUCTION

Texas Technological College recognizes the use of a motor vehicle as both a convenience and a necessity and will attempt to provide a reasonable amount of convenient parking spaces in keeping with resources and available sites.

The college must hold the faculty and staff members responsible for the proper registration, use and operation of their vehicles.

#### 1. VEHICLE REGISTRATIONS

- a. Each University faculty or staff member who wishes to park a motor vehicle (automobile, motorcycle, motor scooter, or motor bike) on the campus must register the vehicle with the Traffic Security Department before he is permitted to park on the campus.
- b. Application for parking privileges may be secured, beginning the first week in September at the Traffic - Security office.
- c. All faculty and staff members desiring parking privileges will be permitted to register the first vehicle without charge for the permit. Those members desiring to register additional vehicles will be required to pay \$10.00 for the second vehicle and \$20.00 for the third vehicle. This charge will be for a twelve month period. The vehicles registered by faculty and staff are not to be used for parking on the campus by their sons or their daughters enrolled at the University.

#### NOTE

- d. Faculty and staff should obtain a special permit when they find it necessary to park an unregistered vehicle on the campus for a limited time.
- e. Faculty or staff who are enrolled for not more than one course will be eligible for staff parking privileges.

#### 2. WHERE TO PARK

a. The parking areas are designated and marked with appropriate signs. A certain portion, within the marked parking areas, is reserved for faculty and staff, visitors and physically handicapped people. Also, the University faculty and staff members may park on the Stadium - Coliseum - Auditorium parking lot (area) with a valid vehicle permit. An agreement has been made with the Coliseum - Auditorium Board of the City of Lubbock to use the lot as long as the privilege is not abused and does not interfere with the normal use of the facilities. The first six single rows of parking spaces nearest the Auditorium - Coliseum (west end of parking lot) must be reserved at all times for the use of patrons who will have need to visit the facilities. On special occasions and upon notification from the manager of the Coliseum - Auditorium, the entire lot must be reserved for the use of patrons of the Coliseum - Auditorium for the time specified.

#### 3. RESERVED PARKING AREA

- a. The University faculty and staff members may purchase a reserved parking space permit for an academic year on the first come, first served basis. Those faculty and staff members presently holding a reserved parking space on an academic year basis will be given priority in reservations for the following summer session and subsequent academic year.
- b. A charge of \$20.00 is payable at the beginning of the fall semester at the Traffic-Security Department for a reserved parking space in the following areas:

- The parking lot immediately north of the Agriculture Engineering Building.
- 2. The double parking lot west of the BA Building.
- The parking lot southwest of the Library.
- 4. The parking lot behind the West Engineering Building.
- c. University faculty and staff members who are not employed for the spring semester or the second summer session, who possess a reserved parking area permit, may be refunded either \$10.00 or \$4.00 dependent upon the original charge. This may be acquired by having the Traffic-Security remove the reserved area permit.
- d. Persons purchasing a designated reserved parking space will be guaranteed this space only from 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. weekdays and 7:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon Saturdays. Reserved parking spaces will be open to anyone from 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. weekdays and 12:00 noon Saturdays to 7:00 a.m. Mondays.

#### 4. GENERAL REGULATIONS

- a. Every person operating a vehicle on the campus of Texas Technological College is held responsible for complying with the traffic rules and regulations of Texas Technological College, the City of Lubbock traffic ordinances and of the State of Texas laws regulating traffic and parking on the campus.
- b. The registrant of a vehicle is held responsible for the safe operation and proper parking of his vehicle, regardless of who may be the driver or operator.
- c. Beginning with the first day of classes of each semester, all cars without a valid parking permit will be subject to ticketing.
- d. All vehicles must be parked properly.
- e. Towing and Impounding System: The University faculty or staff violating any rule or regulation concerning parking on the campus will be subject to having his vehicle towed away and impounded. A clearance from the Traffic-Security Department must be secured before the vehicle is returned to the operator or owner.

#### NOTE

The faculty and staff have a vested responsibility to observe and comply with published Traffic and/or Parking Rules and Regulations. Members of the faculty or staff are expected to adhere, in an exemplary manner, to its regulations as prescribed.

- 5. VIOLATIONS TO TRAFFIC AND PARKING RULES AND REGULATIONS WILL BE PENALIZED AS FOLLOWS:
  - a. Moving traffic, i.e. speeding, reckless driving, disregarding stop signs and traffic signal lights, etc. will be cited for infractions under the state Uniform Code or City of Lubbock ordinances with appropriate fines as decreed by court.
  - b. Parking violations are subject to citations by the University Traffic-Security Department; also, vehicles are subject to impounding and citations for the following:
    - Improper parking in designated areas.
    - 2. Parking on the turf.

- 3. Parking on the sidewalk.
- 4. Parking in any loading zone.
- 5. Parking in or upon any service drive.
- 6. Parking in any manner which obstructs traffic.
- 7. Parking in a No Parking Zone.
- 8. Parking in a fire lane.
- 9. Parking and obstructing a marked trash container.
- 10. Parking and obstruction of any crosswalk.
- 11. Parking in violation of any posted sign.
- c. Parking violators will be penalized in accordance with the following schedule:

First Citation	\$1.00
Second Citation	2.00
Third Citation	4.00

A fourth citation will cause the matter to be brought to the attention of the appropriate administrative official of the College.

- d. Where to submit penalty payment:
  - Office of Traffic and Parking Counsellor, located in the temporary building X-82-B, southwest of the Agricultural Pavilion.
  - Payment by mail: make check payable to Texas Technological College and forward to the office of Traffic and Parking Counsellor,
     P. O. Box 4595, Tech Station. Please sign and enclose the pink copy of your citation.

#### 6. REGULATIONS GOVERNING ENTRY STATIONS

- a. Time of Operation
  - From 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Mondays through Fridays and from 7:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon Saturdays.
- b. Vehicles Allowed to Enter
  - 1. Faculty and staff
  - 2. College service personnel
  - 3. Business vehicles delivering and servicing equipment
  - 4. Public transportation
    - a. Commercial buses and taxicabs
      - To be used only for pick up and delivery of passengers to the inner part of the campus and not to be used for chartered buses or for taxicabs passing through.
  - 5. Private transportation
    - a. Private vehicles will not be allowed to enter the entry stations for the purpose of a short cut through the campus to other parts of the city.

#### 6. School buses

a. Visiting school and chartered buses will be allowed through the entry stations for loading and unloading only and will not be allowed to park in the inner part of the campus.

#### 7. Vendors

- a. Salesmen from business firms, not to include magazine or book salesmen calling on students.
- b. Insurance representatives, not to include those calling on students.

#### 8. Visitors

#### a. Museum

- (1) Visitors to the Museum should enter the campus at the 9th Street and College Avenue entrance and park in the parking lot east of the Museum.
- (2) School buses with school children visiting the Museum will be allowed to unload in front of the Museum and then move the bus outside of the entry stations while school children are visiting the Museum.

#### b. Post Office

(1) Post Office patrons will be given special parking permits until all Post Office boxes are taken by the College or College employees. The special parking permits will be issued for the 10 minute Post Office zone only.

#### c. Library.

(1) Visitors to the Library will be routed to the parking lots designated for off-campus students.

#### d. Bookstore

(1) Visitors are welcome to visit the Bookstore and may park in the Bookstore parking lot or the Infirmary parking lot for a period of 30 minutes by obtaining a visitors permit at the entry station.

#### e. Conferences and Seminars

(1) Visitors attending conferences or seminars on the College campus when such conferences are being held at the Student Union or other building on the inner part of the campus should be sent a special parking permit by the faculty or staff member in charge of such conference or seminar. Special parking or guest permits may be obtained from the Traffic-Security Department. When all of the parking spaces on the inner part of the campus are filled to capacity, these people will be sent to other parking facilities available on the College campus.

#### f. Sports Events

(1) Visitors attending any sports event will be directed to the nearest available parking lot by the employees of the Traffic-Security Department. There should be no occasion for persons attending any sports event to enter the campus at any entry station.

- g. Guest Speakers, Lecturers or Other Invited Guests
  - (1) Visitors who have been invited by any faculty or staff member will be allowed to enter at any entry station and will be issued a visitors pass validated for one day only.

#### h. Sightseers

(1) Visitors wishing to enter the entry stations for the purpose of sightseeing are welcome and will be furnished maps and other information by the entry station officers. THE STATE OF TEXAS Y

#### AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, controversies exist between Bennett Construction Company, Frank O. Bennett, Jr., the Estate of Frank O. Bennett, Sr., all of Lubbock County, Texas, and Texas Technological College of Lubbock, Lubbock County, Texas, Marshall L. Pennington, of Lubbock County, Texas, and Pitts, Mebane, Phelps & White, sued as a partnership composed of Lewellyn W. Pitts, Mike Mebane, Russell R. Phelps, and Robert White of Beaumont, Jefferson County, Texas, in relation to that certain contract dated December 18, 1965, including all addenda, general conditions, special provisions and other contract documents, concerning the construction of a Foreign Languages-Mathematics Building, specifically that part of the construction concerning the following:

- Chalk and tack boards;
- (2) Face Brick, interior and exterior;
- (3) Exposed aggregate cast stone work;
- (4) Alignments of light fixtures and installation of acoustical plaster ceiling;
- (5) Pre-cast treads on central stairway;
- (6) Cast stone benches;
- (7) Cap brick;

and such parties desire to submit the above mentioned controversies, as well as all controversies which may hereafter arise between the parties concerning the construction, meaning, or effect of the above described contract, including all contract documents, and any work performed thereunder, to an arbitration by the arbitrators hereinafter named; provided, however, that the agreement to submit future controversies to arbitration shall in no way affect the powers, duties and responsibilities of the Architect/Engineer under the contract and contract documents:

I.

#### Arbitration

NOW, THEREFORE, We, the undersigned, do hereby agree and covenant to and with each other:

- (1) That the above listed controversies and all controversies that shall arise in the future in reference to the performance of that certain contract dated December 18, 1965, by and between Texas Technological College as Owner and Bennett Construction Company as Contractor shall be and the same are submitted to H. A. Padgett, Jr. and James Atcheson of Lubbock County, Texas, by whom all of said controversies shall be determined and settled, and the award of the arbitrators or the third arbitrator as hereinafter provided shall be final and binding upon the parties hereto, their heirs, executors, administrators and assigns.
- (2) The parties hereto shall have the right respectively to submit to the arbitrators at a time or times and a place to be fixed by the arbitrators and under such conditions as they may impose evidence and testimony in support of their said claims so made, and shall have the rights upon hearing of such evidence and testimony to be represented by their respective counsel. If any party hereto desires arbitration of any controversy which may hereafter arise between the parties, such parties desiring arbitration shall give notice of same to all other parties hereto and to the arbitrators herein named. Such notice shall set forth with particularity the item or items concerning which arbitration is requested. The arbitrators shall thereafter proceed as specified in this contract.

- (3) The parties hereto do agree and covenant to and with each other that the award to be made by the said arbitrators, or any two of them, shall be valid and binding upon them, and shall well and faithfully be kept, observed, and performed by each of them and the heirs, executors, administrators and assigns of each of them.
- (4) The decision of the arbitrators shall be in writing and a copy delivered to each of the parties and such decision shall be binding.
- (5) The costs and expenses of the arbitration shall be shared equally, one-half to be paid by Texas Technological College and one-half to be paid by Bennett Construction Company.
- (6) If, before the matters submitted to arbitration are determined, any arbitrator dies, or refuses or becomes incapable or unfit, or for <u>five</u> consecutive days fails to act as an arbitrator, the parties may by writing appoint a mutually agreeable arbitrator in his place, with all of the powers, rights and duties of the arbitrators as herein specified.
- (7) Any notices required to be given in connection with this agreement or the arbitration proceedings held hereunder shall be delivered by mailing a copy of such notice to the parties hereto at the following address:

Pitts, Mebane, Phelps & White; c/o Robert White Beaumont Savings Building Beaumont, Texas

or by delivery of such notice at the same address.

- (8) The powers given hereunder shall not be terminated or revoked by the death or incapacity of any of the parties hereto, but such arbitration shall be continued and such award shall be made and shall be binding and conclusive upon the parties and those claiming under them, notwithstanding such death or incapacity.
- (9) If the arbitrators herein named are unable to agree as to any specific controversy submitted to them for arbitration, they shall select a third arbitrator and a majority agreement between the three shall be final as to the specific matter in controversy. The authority of the third arbitrator shall extend only to those matters in controversy upon which the two arbitrators can not agree and he shall have no vote on any matter in which the arbitrators herein named have agreed. All matters which can be agreed upon by the two arbitrators herein named shall be first determined before remaining matters shall be submitted to the third arbitrator for majority action.
- (10) This arbitration agreement shall in no way be construed to alter, amend or change the contract between Bennett Construction Company, Frank O. Bennett, Jr., Frank O. Bennett Sr. and Texas Technological College dated December 18, 1965, and the addenda, general conditions, special provisions and other contract documents made a part of such contract. The agreement to submit future controversies to arbitration shall in no way affect the powers, duties and responsibilities of the Architect/Engineer under the contract and contract documents. The matters herein specified to be submitted, or to be submitted in the future to the arbitrators, are or will be submitted to arbitration for the express purpose of determining compliance with such contract in its entirety, but not to change such contract in any way.

- (11) The submission to arbitration of any of the matters hereinabove enumerated and specified may be waived by instrument in writing executed by all parties hereto so that in the event any of the specific matters are disposed of in a manner satisfactory to all parties, the same shall not be arbitrated.
- (12) That no action or legal proceedings shall be commenced or prosecuted by any of the parties hereto, or their executors, administrators or assigns, concerning any of the said matters now in dispute or that may hereafter arise under the performance of said contract. If any party fails to agree to submit any matter in controversy to the arbitrators, the other party may submit such controversy to the arbitrators and the decision of the arbitrators shall be final and binding.
- (13) As to any future arbitration, if requested by any party hereto, it is expressly agreed and understood that same shall be limited to controversies between the parties to this instrument and Contractor by executing this agreement, is in no way obligating himself to arbitrating disputes between Contractor and any sub-contractors on this job, and no such disputes, if any shall be submitted to arbitration under the terms of this agreement.

II.

#### Mutual Agreements

- (1) Frank O. Bennett, Jr., the Estate of Frank O. Bennett, Sr. and Bennett Construction Company shall have the right to remove 10,000 yards of dirt from Texas Technological College campus on or before September 24, 1967. If the said Frank O. Bennett, Jr., the Estate of Frank O. Bennett, Sr. and Bennett Construction Company fail to remove said dirt on or before September 24, 1967, they shall lose their right of removal therefrom and said dirt shall belong to Texas Technological College.
- (2) Texas Technological College agrees to pay to Frank O. Bennett, Jr., the Estate of Frank O. Bennett, Sr. and Bennett Construction Company all sums due for back estimates, except for the contract retainage and for work that has not been approved by the Architect/Engineer.
- (3) Liquidated damages as provided for in said contract and contract documents, shall be and are hereby waived up to and including September 24, 1967.
- (4) Frank O. Bennett, Jr., the Estate of Frank O. Bennett, Sr., and Bennett Construction Company agree to immediately resume work on the above mentioned project and to complete the same in accordance with the contract and contract documents.
- (5) From this date until September 1, 1967, Texas Technological College shall have the right to enter the above mentioned project site and install equipment so long as such installation does not interfere with the work of the Contractor. After September 1, 1967, Texas Technological College shall have an unqualified right to enter said project site and install equipment.

III.

#### Dismissal and Release

That certain suit now pending in the 137th District Court of Lubbock County, Texas, Cause No. 54448, styled Bennett Construction Company vs. Marshall L. Pennington, Texas Technological College and Pitts, Mebane, Phelps & White shall be dismissed with prejudice to the right of the plaintiff to maintain any further cause of action as to any matter set forth in the plaintiff's petition filed in said suit, reference to which is hereby made. Frank O. Bennett, Jr. individually and d/b/a Bennett Construction Company, the Estate of Frank O. Bennett, Sr. and Bennett Construction Company for and in consideration of the

parties submitting such matters in controversy to arbitration, and the further consideration of the other agreements herein contained, the adequacy of such consideration being hereby acknowledged and confessed, do each hereby fully RELEASE, ACQUIT and FOREVER DISCHARGE Marshall L. Pennington, Texas Technological College, Pitts, Mebane, Phelps & White, sued as a partnership, composed of Lewellyn W. Pitts, Mike Mebane, Russell R. Phelps, and Robert White, defendants in said cause, as well as any and all other persons, firms or corporations, who might or could be liable therefor, in whole or in part, directly or indirectly, of and from any and all claims, demands, causes of action of any kind or character which we, or any of us, could have in connection with said suit, whether specifically mentioned in said petition or not.

Maryland Casualty Company joins in this agreement evidencing its approval of this agreement and agrees that its performance bond and payment bond shall remain in full force and effect.

#### REPORT OF ARBITRATION PROCEEDINGS

Bennett Construction Co. vs. Texas Technological College

and after examining the work under arbitration, we make the following recommendations:

#### 1. PRECAST TREADS ON CENTRAL STAIRWAY:

We are of the opinion that the stair treads and landings do not comply with the requirements of the Contract Documents in that the exposed aggregate is not of the gradation specified, nor does it agree with the sample which was mistakenly presumed by the Contractor to have been approved for the work. The Owner is within his right to require that the treads and landings be replaced with materials to comply with the Contract Documents.

#### 2. CAST STONE BENCHES:

The aggregate used in the benches is not as specified and does not afford the smooth finish required. It is evident that the manufacturer of the benches overlooked the addendum item pertaining to the aggregate to be used. We concur in the suggestion that a sample of the material be ground and finished for the approval of the Architect and if acceptable, that the benches be finished as per the approved sample.

#### 3. CAP BRICK:

There is a question as to the meaning of the addendum item as written, which states: "Sheet A-6 and A-7 - Wall Sections 12/A-6 and 10/A-7".

Add note: "The special solid cap brick shall be 7-5/8" in length and the vertical face shall match the face brick in texture and color. Furnish 7-5/8" by 7-5/8" mitered cap brick at all external corners."

Except for the external corners, there is room for doubt, in that the arbiters were not in agreement as to the meaning of the addendum item. One interpretation would have resulted in a rowlock type cap brick made standard length, sloped on top and job clipped on the back to work to the off-set in the wall. The other interpretation would have resulted in a brick with a standard size face exposed, sloped on top, of a depth as required to work to the off-set. The brick used did not meet either of these interpretations; however, the third interpretation - that of the Contractor - may well have been as logical as the other two. True, the Contractor should have asked for a clarification if in doubt as to the meaning of the addendum item; however, it is conceivable that no question existed insofar as he was concerned.

There is no evidence that these units were ordered because they cost less than those which were intended to be required.

While there is some variation in color of the cap brick (there are proportionately more dark brick than in the field), the variation is not extreme. We are of the opinion that the brick should be accepted from the standpoint of size, color, and texture.

#### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED PROGRAM

1. What is the title and nature of the proposed program?

A program of study leading to the degree of Master of Arts with a major in Latin language and literature.

2. What degree or certificate is contemplated, if any?

The degree of Master of Arts in Latin.

3. List the course offerings to comprise the program. Which of these courses will be new ones?

The following list comprises the course offerings for the program, with new courses marked with an asterisk:

Advanced Composition and Grammar Review Readings in Latin Literature I Readings in Latin Literature II

- \* Roman Historical Literature
- \* Roman Elegy and Epigram
- \* Cicero
- \* Roman Satire
- \* A Survey of the Golden Age Literature

- \* Teacher's Course in the Methods of Teaching Latin
- \* Studies in Latin Language and Literature I
- \* Studies in Latin Language and Literature II
- \* Master's Report
- \* Master's Thesis
- 4. Outline a semester-by-semester curriculum for the proposed program.

Since factors affecting each candidate, such as his previous studies, must be taken into account, it is not feasible to set up a semester-by-semester course of study applicable to all.

5. What special requirements will be enforced? If a graduate degree is contemplated, is a thesis required? If not, what will be substituted?

In addition to the general requirements of the College for admittance to the Graduate School, a reading knowledge of some foreign language other than Latin will be required. Either a Master's Thesis or a Master's Report will be required in this program.

6. Has the proposed program, or one similar to it, been offered in this institution at any time prior to this request? Similar programs leading to the degree of Master of Arts with a major in Spanish, French, or German are currently offered by the College.

Some of the course content of the proposed program is included in the program now offered by the College in partial fulfillment of the requirements for the degree of Master of Arts with a minor in Latin or Doctor of Philosophy with a minor in Latin.

A Master of Arts with a major in Latin was offered by the College before World War II.

7. How many similar programs are offered elsewhere in Texas, and where?

Only two programs leading to a Master of Arts in Latin are in existence at present in Texas, that of the University of Texas at Austin and that of Southern Methodist University.

8. Justify the need for the proposed program. Be precise.

The chief indicator of a need for a M.A. program in Latin at Texas Technological College is the greatly increased interest in Latin at this institution. The total of 18 students in Latin in the fall of 1953 grew to 109 in 1958, 205 in 1963, and 329 in 1966. The advancement has not been confined to students seeking to fulfill a language requirement; the number of students in advanced level courses has jumped from four in 1959 to 73 in 1966. The number of Latin majors in the fall of 1963 was five; in 1966 there were nineteen. In 1962 among the graduating class there were no Latin majors, one person with a teaching certificate in Latin, and one Latin minor. In 1966 the same three categories contained 15 graduating seniors.

A large percentage of Latin majors and those with teaching certificates in Latin go into public school teaching. Some of these people go into states which require an eventual master's degree and it would not be surprising for the state of Texas to require such a degree of its teachers in the near future. Many graduates of this institution will be interested in obtaining an advanced degree, but unfortunately the number of institutions in this state offering the M.A. in Latin is only two. No school within three hundred miles in any direction from Lubbock offers an M.A. in Latin and the closest state school offering such a degree is in Austin.

The interest already expressed by students at Texas Technological College practically guarantees the success of the proposed program. In addition to the guaduates of this institution, it can be expected that many teachers in the area, since it would be much more difficult to go elsewhere, would be eager to enter graduate work in Latin at Texas Technological College. Likewise, such a program would help relieve the serious shortage of qualified Latin teachers in the region and in the state. Annually the demand for secondary school teachers of Latin far exceeds the supply available with the result that Latin has been dropped from the curriculum of many regional secondary schools solely because there were no teachers available to meet the demand.

9. Is the proposed program approved by the institution's Board of Directors? When?

#### PROJECTED ENROLLMENT

10. Project the enrollment for the proposed program for the next five years. Explain the basis for this projection.

By the fall of 1972 the projected enrollment for graduate students working toward the M.A. in Latin should be from 15 to 20 students. At the present time there are six students who will be ready to begin an M.A. program in Latin in the fall of 1968.

The basis for this projection is formed on a comparative study of the present number of students working towards their B.A. in Latin with the number of Latin majors for the past four years. The number of Latin majors has gradually increased from five in the fall of 1963 to 19 in the fall of 1966. The number of students taking courses on the 400 level over the same period has risen from seven to 36. Besides the Latin majors, an average of four students per year have been graduated with Latin as a teaching field.

This comparison shows an increase of well over two hundred per cent during the past four years. By applying this same type of increase to the six students wishing to begin the M.A. in Latin in the fall of 1968 and projecting the percentage (280%) of increase over a five year period, by 1972 there could be expected to be about 20 graduate students working toward an M.A. in Latin. The figure of 15 to 20 students projected certainly seems to be a conservative one.

11. Explain the likely sources of students who will enroll in this program. (Will they come from existing programs or will they be attracted to the institution to enroll in the proposed program?)

The six students desiring to begin their M.A. program in Latin at this institution are either presently enrolled in the existing undergraduate program or have already graduated from this institution; it is probable that several others will wish to continue into graduate work. It is also most likely that an M.A. program in Latin will attract students from other institutions. Although many schools in Texas offer a B.A. in Latin, Texas Technological College would be only the third institution in this state to offer an M.A. in Latin.

13. Calculate the present student-faculty ratio in the subject matter field(s) or department(s) in which the proposed program will be offered. (Divide full-time equivalent students by full-time equivalent faculty.)

Faculty-student ratio in the Latin section of the Department: 1:22.7.

14. Project the need for new faculty required for the proposed program for the next five years. If the proposed program will be absorbed in part or in whole by the present faculty, explain how this will be done.

While the projected master's program in Latin would principally be given by present staff members who have been recruited with this eventuality in mind, it would be necessary to secure new staff members to take care of courses principally at the intermediate and advanced undergraduate levels currently assigned to the graduate faculty.

During the first year of the program at least one staff member at the rank of assistant or associate professor would be needed at a salary of about \$11,000.00. This addition would cover two or three courses assigned to the graduate faculty at this time and would also permit several staff members to direct the first reports or theses.

A second manner by which new faculty needs would be met is through the granting of teaching assistantships to master's candidates. Three assistantships at this level are projected for the first year. The stipend for each of these assistantships would be \$2,400.00 for teaching four-tenths of a full-time load. Teaching assistants with this level of preparation could be utilized at the beginning level, thereby allowing certain members of the graduate faculty to devote their efforts to the advanced undergraduate and graduate programs.

15. Will acquisition of new faculty for the program require an unusual outlay of funds or unique recruiting techniques? Explain in detail.

As detailed in the section above, no great outlay of funds or special problem in recruitment is anticipated in the implementation of this master's program in Latin. In the M.A. programs in Spanish, French, and German at Texas Technological College, teaching assistants of high quality have been attracted in numbers, permitting the Administration considerable choice. It is anticipated that the same experience will occur in the case of Latin. As indicated above, it is intended that the graduate faculty of the Staff shall gradually relinquish beginning courses to those of lower rank and assume the additional graduate courses which will be needed.

16. Describe the involvement of the faculty, present and projected, in research, extension, correspondence, and other activities. Are teaching loads of faculty reduced if they engage in these activities?

The members of the Staff who will conduct the proposed program are dedicated scholars who are busily engaged in professional activities, some related to the Department and the College, and others which are regional or national. All are listed in such biographical dictionaries as Who's Who in the South and Southwest, The Directory of American Scholars, and Who's Who in American Education. No member of the Staff is connected with any extension program, but two members instruct a few students by correspondence. An effort is being made to reduce the load of those who are doing considerable research or who have special responsibilities.

Professor Jirgensons will be on leave of absence in 1967-1968 in order to complete his Ph.D. He is expected to return in 1968. For the 1967-1968 academic year he will be replaced by <u>James E. Holland</u>, M.A., University of Washington, 1966. At the present time Mr. Holland is continuing to work toward the Ph.D. at the University of Washington.

#### LIBRARY

A. Are present library holdings in relevant fields adequate now to begin the proposed program?

Present library holdings in relevant fields <u>are</u> adequate now to begin the proposed program. The collection of books and periodicals in the Classical languages and literatures is recognized generally as one of the best in the Southwest. This has been made possible in part by a faculty active in the acquisition of books, by the great number of reprints now available and by the availability of library funds both from state and federal sources.

B. How will the library have to be improved to meet program needs in the next four years? (Refer to the need for books, periodicals, reference books, primary source materials, etc.)

The visitation committee of the Southern Association, referring to the Texas Technological College library collection as a whole, reported in 1962 that it was second in size only to the University of Texas, showed a remarkable rate of growth, reflected intelligent and consistent selection, and was good in reference works and periodicals. This very favorable evaluation of the size, expansion rate and content of the over-all collection would necessarily speak well for the individual departmental collections that comprise the total library holdings.

With reference to the holdings in Classics specifically, the library now has or has on order every significant publication, whether new or reprinted, which has been available in recent years.

This includes books of all kinds: editions of Classical authors, texts both critical and annotated, commentaries, criticism, special fields and reference. It also includes all current periodicals and all reprinted periodicals, many of which have, until recently, been unavailable.

This situation has been made possible because the faculty has been willing to expend much time and effort in the compilation of extensive purchase orders. In the future all that need be done is to continue the precedent thus established, and there is no reason to suspect that a faculty so active in the past will not be able and willing to meet the needs of the future.

18. Are there libraries of other institutions which are being used or can be used by faculty and students in the proposed program? Explain in detail.

Students, or more likely faculty, may occasionally need materials not in our library, and these will usually be available on inter-library loan, a very efficient service.

19. Estimate the total expenditure for the last two complete fiscal years for library acquisitions in the departments or subject matter fields in which the proposed program will be offered, or in fields which are closely related to the proposed program.

In 1965-1966 the Department of Foreign Languages spent \$12,000.00 for books. Thus far, in the 1966-1967 academic year, the department has spent \$10,669.00.

20. Project library expenditures to be budgeted annually for the next five years to meet the need of this program.

For each of the next three years an annual allottment of \$25,000.00 would be available to the department to support the M.A. program in Latin. (This estimate is based on the assumption that the department will be offering doctoral work in Spanish and will thus receive additional monies to support its expanded graduate program.)

#### FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT

21. Describe existing facilities that are available for the proposed program. Describe the present utilization of these facilities. What new facilities will be needed in the near future? Specify what special facilities and equipment will be needed and estimate their cost. From what sources do you anticipate obtaining needed facilities and equipment?

The Department of Classical and Romance Languages and the Department of Germanic and Slavonic Languages will move in the summer of 1967 into new quarters, a new Foreign Languages-Mathematics building now under construction. This new building with laboratories, conference rooms, and lecture halls, in addition to offices and classrooms, will provide adequate facilities.

It is not anticipated that any new facilities will be needed in the foreseeable future.

#### ADMINISTRATION OF PROPOSED PROGRAM

22. Will the proposed program affect the administrative structure of the institution? If yes, describe how. In what department, division, school or college will the proposed program be administered? If the program is to have inter-departmental or inter-unit administration, explain in detail.

The proposed program will not affect the administrative structure of the institution. It will be administered in the Department of Classical and Romance Languages which will be established in September of 1967. The program will not have any inter-departmental or inter-unit administration.

#### ACCREDITATION

23. Describe the requirements for accreditation, if program is eligible to be accredited. What is the name of the accrediting agency? What will be initial costs of accreditation and subsequent annual costs to maintain it? Identify basic criteria for accreditation and describe how these will be met.

There is no accreditation for said program. It follows, however, that a good program, well implemented, with good candidates for the M.A. program will be of benefit to the department and the institution as a whole.

#### SUPPORTING FIELDS

24. Evaluate the subject matter fields at your institution which may be considered as necessary, or valuable, in support of the proposed program. Will these fields need improvement? If so, how, to what extent, and at what cost? Be specific.

There are several related fields of study. English literature has strong ties with Latin literature; and the Department of English offers a doctoral program which is evidence of its quality. One of the more important areas of study in the field of history is ancient history, which students of Latin generally take. The Department of Philosophy is presently seeking to recruit a staff member in the area of ancient philosophy.

Within the area of foreign languages German, French and Italian are particularly valuable for purposes of research in classical

philology. All three languages are taught at Texas Technological College. Greek, the most important related language, is adequately handled by the Classics staff of the Department of Classical and Romance Languages.

#### COSTS OF PROPOSED PROGRAM

25. Estimate the initial (first year) costs of the proposed program. How much of this will be absorbed in current budgets and how much will be newly appropriated money? Will federal or private financial assistance be sought? If yes, explain in detail.

During the first year the program would be inaugurated on a modest basis, but it would be accelerated in succeeding years.

Estimated first year costs of the program:

Teaching salaries for exclusively graduate courses:

Teaching salaries for advanced undergraduate/graduate courses in which M.A. students will be enrolled:

\$ 8,000.00 (two courses each semester)

The first two items would be absorbed in current budgets in that the teaching assistantships would compensate for the teaching salaries for added courses by release of graduate faculty members from lower level courses. Three graduate assistantships are considered necessary for the first year of the proposed program. It would be desirable to increase the number of assistanships to four and five in the three succeeding years. Support of these assistantships would require additional appropriations for the instructional budget of the department. Based on current teaching salaries, funds required over the next four years would be as follows:

First year: \$ 7,200.00

Second year: \$ 7,200.00

Third year: \$ 9,600.00

In view of the growing national awareness of the need for humanistic studies in this country as evidenced by the recently passed "National Foundation on the Arts and Humanities Act of 1965" (Public Law 98-209), and by the rapid growth of enrollment in humanistic courses in colleges and universities across the country, it seems imperative that the State of Texas make every effort to increase the cultural level of its citizens by the implementation of programs such as that proposed here, and it is with this eventuality in mind that the petitioner earnestly requests favorable consideration by the Coordinating Board.

B. Abbott and Company, Lubbock, Lubbock County, Texas, hereinafter called the Contractor.

WITNESSETH, that the Owner and Contractor for the considerations hereinafter named agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1. SCOPE OF THE WORK - The Contractor shall furnish all labor, superintendence, materials, machinery, equipment and tools and shall perform all the work to construct Temporary Facilities for The Physics Acceleration Laboratory as described in the specifications and as shown on the drawings and as noted in the Instructions to Bidder form prepared by the Office of Howard Schmidt and Associates, Architects, Lubbock, Texas, all in accordance with the contract document.

ARTICLE 2. It is further agreed that the Contractor shall forfeit to the Owner the amount of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) per day for each calendar day the said Contractor be in default after the time stipulated herein for completing the work as a measure of liquidated damages.

ARTICLE 4. BOND - The Contractor shall provide to the Owner a Performance Bond in the amount of One Hundred (100%) percent of the contract sum, without recourse, to the State of Texas, covering the faithful performance of the contract and the payment of all obligations arising thereunder.

ARTICLE 5. METHOD OF PAYMENT - There being no default on the part of the Contractor existing, the Owner shall make payments to the Contractor on certificate of the Architect approximately every thirty (30) days, it being understood that payments shall be made upon ninety (90) percent of the value of labor and material in the work and materials suitably stored at the site, with the provision that no payment ever shall be made which in the judgment of the Architect will leave less than an amount sufficient to complete the work.

ARTICLE 6. ACCEPTANCE AND FINAL PAYMENT - The Owner shall, upon completion of the work, make such payment within Thirty (30) days after acceptance by the Owner as will be necessary to complete the total payment of the contract, provided that the contract be then fully performed.

#### RESOLUTION

#### ENDORSEMENT OF AMENDMENT NO. 6

TEXAS TECHNOLOGICAL COLLEGE
OFFICE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That on the 14th day of October, 1967, the Board of Directors of Texas Technological College regularly met, and passed and duly recorded the following Resolution:

WHEREAS, Amendment No. 6 seeks to alter the Texas Constitution to allow non-elective state officers and employees to serve on state and federal advisory boards and committees.

WHEREAS, Section 33 if Article XVI currently prohibits such appointments by stating that officers and employees of the state cannot hold more than one office of "trust, honor or profit." The provision, dating back to 1876, was obviously designed to guard against a state official holding two bona fide offices. This aspect of the provision would not be affected by passage of Amendment No. 6.

WHEREAS, approval of Amendment No. 6 also would benefit Texas' state-supported colleges and universities by allowing employees of government agencies -- National Aeronautics and Space Administration scientists, for example -- to accept appointments as part-time faculty members.

WHEREAS, Amendment No. 6 specifically states that secondary appointments will be authorized only if they are of benefit to the State of Texas and there is no conflict of interest with the original office or position.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of Texas Technological College wholeheartedly expresses its full support for the passage of Amendment No. 6 in the election to be held on November 11, 1967.

## REPORT OF THE DEAN OF THE SCHOOL OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION By George Gail Heather

Mac suggested that I take roughly thirty minutes or he suggested that I take specifically thirty minutes. I will try to give what I can give here and I hope to stop within thirty minutes or less. In a few instances, I have some material here that I will attempt really to read, or to quote, and other material will be sort of as it occurs to me as I go along, trying to keep this reasonably informal.

I can't account for the entire history of the School of Business Administration--primarily since I arrived some eight years after the School was begun. From the inception in 1942, of course, the School of Business Administration had as its objective that of serving as an instructional program for undergraduate students.

In more recent years as we have matured and we have grown, there has been certainly a reaffirmation of the effort to become unexcelled in providing, at the undergraduate level, programs of recognized excellence in the preparation of those to be graduated for employment in positions of responsibility in business, in government, and in education. I think we have good testimony to the reasonable success in attaining that objective, principally because of the success We have had in placing our graduates. As far as I know, we have never had any number who go unplaced. It has resulted in our becoming during the 1966-1967 academic year the largest undergraduate, day enrollment, collegiate school of business in the United States. We had had previously three schools that had given us a little competition on the enrollment situation. About three years ago, we went ahead of Michigan State University on that statistic. A year ago when (Dean) George Kozmetsky was in Lubbock, he mentioned that the University of Texas was a little under 4,000. I wrote (Dean) Jim McCoy at Ohio State which was the other school which was still ahead of us as far as we had known the previous year. Jim replied that they were under 4,000 by roughly 100 students. So by going to a total of 4,010 I believe this was the figure, as far as we know we became the largest of the undergraduate schools of business in the country.

To continue emphasis, of course, only on the undergraduate instruction, we decided, was to avoid what should be a part of our responsibility. Therefore,

we began to work for a graduate enrollment and to promote that type of student into Tech in addition to the undergraduate enrollment. For example, in 1963, in the fall semester we had 68 graduate students and that is a mighty small enrollment. In 1964, we had 101; in 1965, we had 167, and in 1966, we had 249. This fall we are possibly over 300 graduate students.

During the past year, we have initiated the courses for the professional MBA which is that type of program that the Harvard Graduate School of Business and the Stanford Graduate School of Business have long lived on, providing for engineers, for those who took physics as undergraduate majors, mathematicians, etc., a graduate business program of roughly two years to permit the person to capitalize on his undergraduate specialization but also to make him a managerial potential in business.

We, this past year, started the new Master of Science in Accounting. In preparation, there is probably nobody who is likely to think of a more vocational type of preparation than some accountants. The Master of Science in Accounting recognizes this real highly vocational type of graduate preparation for accountants. Also, the first full offerings for our Doctor of Business Administration people really began this fall. We are into it now. We have been offering some of that course work for about three years, a course at a time, getting this worked through to see how we would come out. We can count seventy-eight people who have entered the program and have taken some amount of that work and we can identify roughly fifty doctoral people in Business Administration who are in residence this fall--and that is a real sizable enrollment for a doctor's program. We need, as a part of this -- Mac suggested that I indicate not only what we think we have accomplished but what we need to accomplish -- a better-organized effort at the recruitment, if that isn't a bad word among this group, of superior graduate students. So far we have not personally gone off the Campus -- we have not actually gone to the source of those people, faculty in other colleges, etc. I think we need to get there.

We need to add, I think, a Doctor's Degree in Economics, a Ph.D., which is traditional in economics as contrasted to our Doctor of Business Administration which is a fairly new and very acceptable degree in most other fields that we have now. It is probable that we shall be coming through with a request for a Master of Science in Management Science—a fairly new, again fairly technical, and with specific objective, type of master's level degree.

We have completed some preliminary arrangements with the Army to send batteries of officers here to take Master of Business Administration degrees in what we would call "data systems management." That is working--primarily I guess our problem right now is the Army has to decide that it has the funds to do that.

A casual inspection of our enrollment through recent years has shown that there is a percentage concentration of home-state (Texas) students considerably in excess of that which would be found in most major state universities across the country and certainly in excess of that which we have considered desirable. Accordingly, to attract desirable out-of-state students, we have done a rather strong promotion job with counselors in the public schools in New Mexico, Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Louisiana. We have not yet had time to see if that is beginning to pay off with a little better geographic mix. Especially noticeable has been the lack of foreign students in our School of Business Administration, I think--but not only criticizing Business Administration, I would criticize Tech as a whole in that we have not been attractive to foreign students. We set forth to see what we might do about this deficiency and last year and this year -- I can't really separate the two years in the souce of students -- in Business Administration we have had foreign students from Japan, Jordan, Mexico, Switzerland, Persia, Yemen, the Phillipine Islands, Iran, Germany, the Netherlands, Libya, Peru, Hong Kong, Trinidad, Lebanon, Columbia, and Spain, and we are real proud of this accomplishment. Of course, most of these may represent only one student; but typical of our situation, this fall about a week ahead of registration there walked into my office a handsome fellow who did not appear to be native, and we found right fast that he was here from Libya to get a Master's degree. We had never really heard of him over in my office at all and he was here under an employee scholarship arrangement with the Esso Standard Libya Oil Company. The next day another one from Libya walked in. We are beginning, I think, to get a little reputation like that around the world which, as I said, is something that we have been attempting to do. Last year, for example, we were proud to have had a Fullbright Scholar in Business Administration -- a lad by the name of Hoffnagles. I don't know whether there have been others on Campus or not -- I am not aware of there having been another Fullbright -- maybe there has been.

We have begun something new. Dr. Murray has been fairly active in what we are now calling the Don Belding Fund for International Education in Advertising. We think that will bring us quite a number of foreign students. We have learned that in a German publication which recommends, for German students, foreign places of particular recommendation for study that we are the only school in the United States that is being listed for advertising study, so that we are beginning to get "cranked up" on inquiries from Germany. Many advertising practitioners are making arrangements to come to Tech to study advertising.

Also in obvious significance, I suppose by its lack, has been our research efforts. There is an old adage something to the effect that if you have something that should be done, give it to a busy person to be sure that it will then get done. However, we have had a faculty-student ratio which has hovered up toward one to thirty along the way quite a bit of the time -- and that has not, certainly, been conducive to faculty research. No matter how much interest a person may have, he does have only about so much time and the greater the student load we put on him, the less time that he has. To correct that problem in part, we have managed some reduced teaching loads. We have reduced at times the number of sections even though we have just put about the same number of students in fewer classes so that the faculty-student ratio has not necessarily dropped in every instance, but to take that many fewer hours out of a faculty member's week does permit him a little time to do something else. We have had some people who have been rather prolific in writing and in research. Names may not mean much to you but Dr. Clover has done quite a number of studies and published them; Dr. John Hildebrand, who has been with us for several years -- and we just lost him to Michigan State University; Dr. William Pasewark, probably, of the group, in terms of textbooks, manuals, etc. has been the most prolific writer. We have added, particularly this year, some people who are proven in research. More or less "bootstraping" the effort out of my office, we have, this year, actually published and distributed two faculty research publications. I think to further this one effort we need to have an organized research bureau or an institute of some sort. We had one once and we got "shot out of the saddle" by the Commission on Higher Education.

We will begin, we think, next fall with what we will call an Office Education Center and the following year there will be initiated, and the plan is in the new building to provide the actual laboratory space, an Office Research Laboratory. I can't really take the time to reassure each of you of what you are already aware—that a tremendous amount of time these days is being spent by every business unit, every industrial unit, etc. just in paper work, office routine, etc. So surprisingly enough any sort of increased efficiency that can result there is a tremendous saving.

In this new facility--this new building of which we are increasingly proud as it goes up--there will be a Behaviorial Simulation Laboratory that is under the wing of our Department of Management. I was telling Al (Allison) a little earlier here of the new building--he has been real interested all the way along in sort of living through this with us--that we have a few, what we would say are, rather minor changes as we go along and one area of them is this Behaviorial Simulation Laboratory.

Let me go back for a moment to the undergraduate enrollment. We, of course, have always believed that a strong specialized major program at the undergraduate level is good. That certainly has not been in accord with many of the collegiate schools of business in the United States and in some of the prestige schools. Primarily those with real heavy graduate concentrations have tried to put out the idea that at the undergraduate level, the student should be essentially a liberal arts major and then go to graduate school and get more specific preparation. Our thought is that, at least down in the Southwest, the first four years of college is frequently quite an accomplishment for a family and for a youngster to go to school is a big financial drain and that therefore we ought to try to make him employable within that four years if possible. As a result, we have maintained an enrollment and have grown during a period of time when many of the collegiate schools of business in the United States have actually lost enrollment or have fought more or less just to hang on. Again, some enrollment statistics here: in 1962, we could identify in the fall semester 2,208 business administration majors at the undergraduate level. That has come up until this fall, for example, we are right at 4,200 undergraduate business administration majors. Just what does this growth mean--and I think this points up some of our problems. In effect it says that in five years we have added an enrollment to the School of Business Administration which is roughly equal, just a little short, of the whole School of Engineering; we have added an enrollment which is

almost as great as the combined enrollments right now of Home Economics and Agriculture. So it has been a real significant growth. We are running rather badly behind. We are still scrambling--we are still trying to get last spring's work caught up right now.

In terms of curriculum, there have been some changes but there are just two that I want to mention. One, we have recognized the place that the computer has come to play in business units of medium and larger size today. We have put in a requirement that every single business administration student must complete at least one semester of the study of the use of the computer. If he goes out and opens a grocery store that is going to take in \$100 a day, or a restaurant, he is not going to be using a computer, but we would anticipate that most of our graduates will be going into stores, into wholesale houses, into manufacturing plants and on and on, of size enough that much of what they are doing will be the result of some computer activity. Our new requirement, as a result, of course, has thrown a real load on our Computer Center and it is something that we are going to have to think about -- I guess as we go along -- but the Computer Center is geared perhaps more to a science research type of orientation than to the type of activity which typically a large manufacturer or a large retailer would be involved in. For that reason, to handle our type of problem that our students in these classes are involved in is an awkward thing for the Computer Center and the handling proves to be rather inefficient on their part, and at times a little slow, so we are going to have to do some work there. I hope we can work that problem out.

Another curriculum matter that I want to mention briefly--we have considered for several years the fact that to isolate Business Administration from the other disciplines on Campus is not good and our thought is this: why would it not be real important for a student to take generally our background work in Business Administration and instead of majoring in accounting or majoring in advertising, why not major perhaps in mathematics? Business needs that type of fellow immediately--they need a fellow who knows something about business but they need him to be a good mathematician too, perhaps. I talked with chemistry about this--and we have explored this pretty much across the Campus. The last count we had, I think, showed we had replies from over thirty departments around the Campus who were real enthusiastic about being included in this. We would continue

basically the background of the business student but his specialization, that twenty-five or thirty hours, would be taken in some other discipline of the College. They all believe that there is a place for that type of person so we are going to be coming through one of these days with some sort of a proposal to do that very thing.

I want to mention also, and perhaps this is something that not too many of you really know, that we have here, have operated for a period of five or six years, one of the very few honors programs specifically for business administration students in the United States. We have stumbled at times—it is a real problem to try to keep it going, but we believe each year it is strengthening. Last year we entered twenty—seven very select students into that program. This fall we started just over thirty into that program. It is a tough program and the drop—out is real bad because most any student who enters it soon learns the probability that his buddy who is making an A in some other section is doing a heck of a lot less work than he is doing in the honors section that is essentially the same course. I imagine Mac has had something of that experience with the Arts and Sciences honors program. It is something we have to keep selling.

Now, as a matter of mentioning some shortcomings but to give some examples of how we are operating partially along this line, we think we need to get involved with more service activities. We have just concluded, we think, a real successful two-day tax conference here--or a tax institute. We have every year two or three rather well-attended meetings of business teachers, primarily secondary school teachers but in many instances the junior colleges and such institutions as West Texas State send some good groups. We have gotten going on some good annual advertising programs that are being well attended. Our international trade program each year in cooperation with the Chamber of Commerce has been growing. We established several years ago, completely without budget as another "bootstrap" operation, a Center for Economic Education. We have gotten one publication out of it this year which we circulated.

Growing out of this was the cooperative program with Jordan where we have sent Dr. John Gilliam. He has been there this year. We don't think we had too much to do with the outcome of their little problem over there but it sort of "shot us out of the saddle" on what we were attempting to do because we had just

worked with a group of graduate students, who had been at Tech, and the Jordanian government to get up its first junior college of commerce on what I believe is called the West Bank. Now that Israel holds the West Bank, that part of the program is no longer in existence. There has been an attempt to move across the river and continue but right now, as nearly as we can tell, it is very likely that we will not be continuing the program.

The Amarillo Public Schools two or three years ago considered putting in a required one-semester high school economics course. They called on our Center for Economic Education to counsel with them on that and we sent two people up there for two or three days to work with them as to what materials would be available, etc. and they did eventually put in that one-semester course required, as I understand it, of every student who will graduate from Amarillo High School.

I understand that we have in the making this year a new Bankers Conference. Several years ago we had that group on Campus two or three times but something happened to it, but it looks like we are about to get back in business again.

From the standpoint of personnel, we are I think--throughout the institution would be my opinion -- a little bit under-administered and I think particularly so in the School of Business Administration. We still fight the salary battle, although we have gotten in better shape, as Dr. Kennedy will tell you. I believe Dr. Murray made the comment to me a while back that they discovered at LSU that either the highest priced faculty members that they employed or the most scarce that they were seeking, I don't remember which, probably were in the area of economics. Of course that is one of our areas and it represents something of the hiring problem that we have got to work on. We still have an extremely high faculty-student ratio. I am not sure that there is any future relief in that -- there just never is quite enough money to do all that we want to do. We would like to continue at this point a selective addition of some faculty with real high caliber potential. Essentially these will be young fellows and these usually will be known quantities -- our own bachelor's and master's students who have gone elsewhere. We have a young fellow parked up at Indiana University right now whom we would like to bring back in another year. He will have his DBA from Indiana. We have another young fellow down at Alabama getting his Ph.D. in marketing. We have another real brilliant fellow up at

Illinois getting his Ph.D. in accounting. We are beginning finally to get something of a cycle--we are sending a few out and we can begin to bring them back we think.

I should mention also that Bill Parsley has been working with us a little bit on the beginnings at least of a chair--the first one may be banking, we are not sure. We are working on it; we could use many such chairs.

One thing I should mention, and my time is about over: one of our greatest complaints -- I think everybody has the privilege to complain -- whether it does any good or not. We would hope that as we mature and have matured and now are growing up that perhaps we could begin to get a little better consideration out of the new College regime in terms of the ME&T situation. My figures aren't too good, I know, but they are the best I can come up with. The last time I checked this, which was three or four years ago, the School of Business Administration drew about 91¢ for every student semester hour. At the time, as nearly as I could calculate, Arts and Sciences was drawing about \$1.23 and Agriculture was getting better than \$5. (See attached tables.) There was a day when business administration instruction perhaps could be a sort of bargain-basement approach. We did not need farm lands, we didn't need high-priced equipment except for a few typewriters and calculators. They have finally put the machines in business through and I think you can ask most any of your business people just what kind of costs are now involved in equipping to run a business; and in order for our graduates to be familiar with those, we need a little better, I think, to begin to afford equivalent equipment.

We have some changes that we need to make. I guess I could call them innovations. We are doing some TV instruction. We will continue the large classes. As far as I see, we will have a maximum facility of 500 seats in the new building and I think every one of our departments is getting ready for that type of class. Visual aids, of course, are going to come into the picture. The question necessarily of the relationship between three semester hours and three contract hours each week--that is something that we aren't so sure is so holy that it doesn't need to be changed and save some faculty time. There are things like that, of course, that are fairly general that we are going to be involved in, but we are not going to be involved in them I suppose any more than any other part of the institution that is trying for an efficient operation without losing the efficiency of the education process.
