Whew! I'm glad there aren't very many three-day weekends in a summer. Maurice and I spent Friday and Saturday either working in the yard or in the pool, then went to see our grandson in Dallas yesterday....I'm tired, sunburned and ready to get back to a more normal routine.

We received an invitation last week to come to Austin for a videotaped interview for Channel 9 (educational TV station) - subject "Constitutional Revision for an American Government course for high school students. I fired back an immediate acceptance and told them to name the time and the place. This morning's mail brought a reply and set the date for Wednesday afternoon at 2:00. I shall be there - well armed with reference materials, as the man suggested!

While I am on the subject of TCR, something that Gwen said at the Board meeting started my thinking process and I have a suggestion for the budget committee. You will remember that she said she wouldn't leave her money to the LWV Memorial Fubecause all we do is sit on it and let it grow? And you will also remember that we talked then (as we have at numerous recent Board meetings) about how and when we can ever update Texas Constitutional Review? So put the two things together and I come up with the suggestion that the budget committee consider using the Memorial Fund as a "revolving" fund for just such projects as this - the Fund can be used to pay the initial printing bill and to assure wide distribution of the Review and then be replenished for another such project as the cost of the Review is returned to us. There are probably some "bugs" in this suggestion that will need to be worked out and this is why I turn the question over to the budget committee for resolution.

We have our annual invitation to the National Conference on Citizenship which is held each September (over Sept. 17 - Citizenship Day). We have never been able to send anyone to this Conference for the usual reasons. However, this year, IF the plans for sending me to the Fair for Women Voter's Week should work out, then I think there is a chance that for only a little more money, we could be present at that Conference. Actually, there is a conflict - Women Voter's Day is also Sept. 17 but the Conference begins on the 16th and runs through the 19th. Can we think about this?

Beverly has asked that I send you her address for the month of July -- c/o Whitener, 10 North 25th Street, Lawton, Okla. Her phone number there (if there is something urgent that can't wait on the US Mail) is 405 EL 3-5684.

We are operating shorthanded in the office this morning - JoAnn quit as of last Friday - they are moving back to Illinois - and we haven't completely found the solution yet. Ivy has moved up into the full-time position and we haven't been satisfied with the prospective part-time replacements. I have known this was coming for several months but it is always a shock when the time actually comes and you are faced with reality. We'll let you know when we fill the position - at least everything is pretty well under control right now with the Post-Board Report either in the mail or ready to go to the post office. The standing orders are the only part of the mailing yet to go out and they are packaged and ready.

This is all that concerns the office right now but I do want to share some funwith-figures that I was indulging in the other day..... This is in the "for waht its's worth" category but I have been playing with the membership totals that are on the Finance History that came in from Florence last week...and I think they are fascinating.

Of our 35 Leagues:

8 have less than 50 members 18 have over 50 but under 100

5 have over 100 but under 200

4 have 200 or more

The average membership based on 3553 members in 35 Leagues is 101 BUT


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3 Leagues have 30-39 members
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2072 members of the 3553 are in 9 of our Leagues. The other 26 Leagues must plan for carrying out League work with less than 100 members.

More Leagues have from 50-59 members than any other number -- the 60-69 group runs a very close second BUT & Leagues have less than 50 members and three have less than the 40 members considered the minimum for acrrying out League work.

Does this say anything to us? I think it should in the areas of preparation of publications, leader's guides, etc. And it probably should say something to us as we prepare for the area conferences this fall. We probably must and should take these facts into consideration in preparing the material for the area conferences.

This is really all I have to say today - more another time, I'm sure!

Dear Mrs. Christopherson:

Your letter brings the national league closer to those of us on the state level. Thank you for the letter and Mrs. Morgan's report.

Before I answer your questions, I want to comment on that repeated quote, "Security is a determined Finance Chairman? From what I have seen in Leagues, one-woman campaigns are not effective. Don't you think that the expression "and a cooperative Board" should be added?

The question was raised at our recent State Board meeting as to whether other state Leagues raise money on the state level and how they do it. I am not sure of the answer, even though I understand the history of finance on the national level in encouraging the responsibility of the local Leagues. Will you please let us know if you have any information about this? I understand the money raising ventures of Poll Reporting and will check this in Texas.

We are planning informal face-to-face meetings on budget and finance with local Leagues early in October to help them before their finance drives and budget making time. Mrs. Brown, our state President, has already written to Miss Christine Urban, asking her for the visual presentation of the national effice operation used at National Convention and is preparing slides of the state picture. We expect to cover the preparation of the budget and the finance campaign from the planning phase through the evaluation, with emphasis on the local Leagues problems. Maising of dues is another thing we have to sell to the Leagues.

My predecessor attended a conference last year and incidentally wrote a handbook, "Prospecting for GOID in Texas!, using sample materials from the local Leagues in Texas. Both this and national's new handbook are excellent. I am convinced that if the local Finance Birectors would use these, there would be enough money at all levels. I hastily add....with a cooperative Board.

In Mrs. Charles Lamehan's Annual Report, she stated that the problems of find raising are: lack of early planning, determination, follow-through; falling down on mop-up; no finance chairman; not enough member participation; ultra-right super-conservative climate of many Texas cities; and enough members remaining in the League long enough to gain experience, knowledge and confidence to go into the community.

### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

(1.) As used in this contract, "ticket" means "Passenger Ticket and Baggage Check", "carriage" is equivalent or undertake to carry the passenger or his baggage beteunder or perform any other service incidental to such air carriage: "damare" includes death, injury, delay, loss or other damage of whatsoever nature arising out of or in connection with carriage or other services performed by carrier incidental thereto. Carriage to be performed

hereunder by several successive carriers is regarded as a single operation, (2.) (a) Carriage bereunder is subject to the rules and limitations relating to liability established by the Convention for the Unification of Certain Rules relating to International Carriage by Air, signed at Warsaw, October 12, 1929 (hereinafter called "the Convention") unless such carriage is not "international carriage" as defined by the Convention. (See carrier's tariffs, conditions of carriage for such definition). Carrier's name may be abbreviated in the ticket, the full name and its abbreviation being set forth in carrier's tariffs, conditions of carriage, regulations or timetables; and carrier's address shall be the airport of departure shown opposite the first abbreviation of carrier's name in the ticket; and for the purpose of the Convention the agreed stopping places (which may be altered by carrier in case of necessity) are those places, except the place of departure and the place of destination, set forth in this ticket and any conjunction ticket issued herewith, or as shown in carrier's timetables as scheduled stopping places on the pas-

(b) To the extent not in conflict with the foregoing, all carriage hereunder and other services performed by each carrier are subject to (i) applicable laws (including national laws implementing the Convention or extending the rules of the Convention to carriage which is not "international carriage" as defined in the Convention), government regulations, orders and requirements, (ii) provisions herein set forth, (iii) applicable tariffs, and (iv) except in transportation between a place in the United States and any place outside thereof, and also between a place in Canada and any place outside thereof, conditions of carriage, regulations and timetables (but not the time of departure and arrival therein) of such carrier, which are made part hereof and which may be inspected at any of its offices and at airports from which it operates

(c) Unless expressly so provided, nothing herein contained shall waive any limitation of liability of car-

rier existing under the Convention or applicable laws. (3.) Insofar as any provision contained or referred to herein may be contrary to a law, government regulation, order or requirement, which severally cannot be waived by agreement of the parties, such provision shall remain applicable and be considered as part of the contract of carriage to the extent only that

such provision is not contrary thereto. The invalidity of any provision shall not affect any other part. (4.) Subject to the foregoing: (a) Liability of carrier for damages shall be limited to occurrences on its own line, except in the case of checked bargage as to which the passenger also has a right of action against the first or last carrier. A carrier issuing a ticket or checking baggage for carriage over the lines of others does so only as agent. (b) Carrier is not liable for damage to passenger or unchecked haggage unless such damage is caused by the negligence of carrier (c) Carrier is not liable for any damage di rectly and solely arising out of its compliance with any laws, government regulations, orders or require ments, or from failure of passenger to comply with same, (d) Any liability of carrier is limited to 250 French gold francs (consisting of 65% milligrams of gold with a fineness of nine hundred thousandths) or its equivalent per kilogram in the case of checked happeage and 5,000 such French cold frames or its equivalent per passenger in the case of unchecked baggage or other property, unless a higher value is de-

event the liability of carrier shall be limited to such higher declared value. In no case shall the carrier's liability exceed the actual loss suffered by the passenger, All claims are subject to proof of amount of loss tel Any exclusion or limitation of liability of carrier under these conditions shall apply to agents, servants or representatives of the carrier acting within the scope of their employment and also to any person whose aircraft is used by carrier for carriage and his agents, servants or representatives acting within the acone of their employment.

(5.) Checked baggage carried hereunder will be delivered to the bearer of the baggage check upon pay-

ment of all unpaid sums due carrier under carrier's contract of carriage or tariff. (6.) When validated this ticket is good for carriage from the nirport at the place of departure to the airport at the place of destination via the route shown herein and for the applicable class of service and is valid for one year from the date of commencement of flight except as otherwise provided in varrier's tariffs or regulations. Each flight coupon will be accepted for carriage on the date and flight for which accommodations have been reserved; when flight coupons are issued on an "open date" basis, accommoda-

tions will be reserved upon application subject to availability of snace. (7.) Carrier undertakes to use its best efforts to carry the passenger and hagrage with reasonable dispatch, but no particular time is fixed for the commencement or completion of carriage. Subject thereto, carrier may without notice substitute alternate carriers or aircraft and may alter or omit the stopping places shown on the face of the ticket in case of necessity. Times shown in timetables or elsewhere are approximate and not guaranteed, and form no part of this contract. Schedules are subject to change with-

out notice. Carrier assumes no responsibility for making connections. (8.) The passenger shall comply with all government travel requirements, present all exit, entry, and other documents required by the law, and arrive at the airport by the time fixed by carrier or, if no time is fixed, sufficiently in advance of flight departure to permit completion of government formalities and departure procedures. Carrier is not liable for loss or expense due to passenger's failure to comply with this

(9.) No agent, servant or representative of carrier has authority to after, modify or waive any provision of

(10.) No action shall lie in the case of damage to baggage, unless the person entitled to delivery complains to the carrier forthwith after the discovery of the damage, and at the latest, within seven days from the date of receipt; and in the case of delay unless the complaint is made at the intest within 21 days from the date on which the baggage has been placed at his disposal. Every complaint must be made in writing and dispatched within the times aforesaid. Where carriage is not "international carriage" as defined in the Convention, failure to give notice shall not be a bur to suit where claimant proves that (i) it was not

reasonably possible for him to give such notice, or (ii) that notice was not given due to fraud on the part of carrier, or (iii) the management of carrier had knowledge of damage to passenger's baggage. (11.) Any right to damages against carrier shall be extinguished unless an action is brought within two years reckoned from the date of arrival at the destination, or from the date on which the aircraft ought to have arrived, or from the date on which the carriage stopped. The method of calculating the period of




