**DECEMBER 14, 1966**

Lubbock, Texas  
December 14, 1966

M36. The Board of Directors of Texas Technological College met in a special session in the Anniversary Room of the Student Union on Wednesday, December 14, 1966, at 9:00 a.m. The following directors were present: Chairman Furr, Vice Chairman Cash, Mr. Allison, Mr. Allen, Mr. Hinn, Mr. Martin, and Mr. McLaughlin. In addition, President Murray, Vice President for Academic Affairs Peace, Vice President for Business Affairs Pennington, and Mrs. Jean K. Baker, Executive Administrative Assistant to the President, who recorded the Minutes of the meeting, were present.

This special meeting replaced the regular meeting originally scheduled for Saturday, December 3, 1966.

M37. Upon motion made by Mr. Allen, seconded by Mr. Martin, the Board by a unanimous vote approved the Minutes of the meetings of October 18, 1966, and November 1, 1966.

M38. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Allen, the Board by a unanimous vote, ratified administrative action not previously submitted to the Board. (Section A, No. 173 through No. 205; Section B, No. 56 through No. 62; Section C, No. 233 through No. 257; Section D, No. 81 through No. 99; Section E, No. 199 through No. 225; Section F, No. 85 through No. 195; Section G, No. 113 through No. 287; Section H, No. 92 through No. 119, and Attachments No. 1 through No. 24.)

M39. Upon motion made by Mr. Allen, seconded by Mr. Hinn, the Board by a unanimous vote adopted a Resolution establishing the new position Executive Vice President of Texas Technological College, effective December 15, 1966. A copy of the Resolution is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 18.

M40. Upon motion made by Mr. Allen, seconded by Mr. Martin, the Board by a unanimous vote adopted a Resolution appointing Dr. William Martin Pearce as Executive Vice President of Texas Technological College and Professor of History, effective December 15, 1966. A copy of the Resolution is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 19.

M41. Upon motion made by Mr. Allison, seconded by Mr. Hinn, the Board by a unanimous vote adopted a Resolution appointing Dr. Sabe McClain Kennedy as Vice President for Academic Affairs of Texas Technological College and Professor of Government, effective December 15, 1966. A copy of the Resolution is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 20.

M42. Upon motion made by Mr. Allison, seconded by Mr. Hinn, the Board by a unanimous vote adopted a Resolution establishing special professorships to be known as the "Horn Professorships," named in honor of Dr. Paul Whitfield Horn, the first president of Texas Technological College. A copy of the Resolution is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 21.

M43. Upon motion made by Mr. Allison, seconded by Mr. Hinn, the Board by a unanimous vote, approved the Criteria and Procedures for Selection of a "Horn Professor." A copy of the Criteria and Procedures for the Selection is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 22.

M44. Upon motion made by Mr. Allison, seconded by Mr. Martin, the Board by a unanimous vote, adopted a Resolution supporting the recommendations of the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System, requesting favorable action by the legislature of the recommended change in tuition rates. A copy of the Resolution is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 23.

M45. Dr. Pearce was asked to make a report for the Academic Affairs Committee. He started: "We have no new programs or degrees to announce as approved by the Coordinating Board. That body has declared a moratorium on new programs and degrees until a master plan for the State has been developed by that body, so everything we have is frozen until the plan is approved . . . The Coordinating Board will make an intensive study of medical education and dental education in Texas, and on the basis of the report which is due on July 1, 1968, will make its own cause of action following that."

M46. Mr. Allison made a brief report for the Public Relations and Legislative Committee.

M47. The Campus and Building Committee of the Board met on Tuesday, December 13, 1966, at 8:15 p.m., in the Student Union Building to consider recommendations to be made to the Board on December 14, 1966. The next thirteen (13) items (No. M48 through M60) records the official action of the Board on the various recommendations.

M48. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Allen, the Board by a unanimous vote approved August 31, 1966, as the final acceptance date of the Paving of the North Parking Lot at the Stadium from the Contractor.

M49. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Cash, the Board by a unanimous vote awarded a construction contract to the J. J. Fritch Construction Company of Dallas, Texas, the low bidder, in the amount of \$3,359,914.24 for the construction of the Business Administration Building and authorized the Chairman to sign the contract. A copy of the tabulation of bids for Heating, Ventilating, and Air Conditioning is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 15. A copy of the tabulation of bids for Electrical Work and Elevators is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 16. A copy of the tabulation of bids for General Construction is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 17. A copy of the contract with J. J. Fritch Construction Company is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 24.

M50. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Allen, the Board by a unanimous vote approved the plans and specifications as developed to date for the Central Heating and Cooling Plant and authorized the architects and engineers to continue with the development.

M51. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Allen, the Board by a unanimous vote authorized the Campus Planning Committee and the engineers to study and prepare specifications and to take bids on additional accessory equipment necessary for the operation of the Central Heating and Cooling Plant.

M52. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Cash, the Board by a unanimous vote approved the contract with Mr. Howard Schmidt to serve as Consulting Architect for the College. There are three phases to the contract:

1. Programming new facilities.
2. Coordinating construction and planning by other architects, and preparing a manual of construction procedures at Texas Tech.
3. Master planning.

M53. The Board declined to accept the offer of the Frenchman's Creek Corporation to form a nonprofit corporation to handle the proposed men's housing project across the street from Bledsoe Hall.

M54. The Vice President for Business Affairs presented an informational report on the estimated funds available for the present and proposed building program. A copy of the report is on file in the Office of the Secretary of the Board.

M55. The Board approved the commissioning of Mr. O'Neil Ford of San Antonio as the Project Architect for the proposed new Architecture Building.

M56. The Board approved the commissioning of Harrell and Hamilton of Dallas as the Project Architects for the new Law Building.

M57. Mr. Howard Schmidt, Coordinator of the Museum Project, and Mr. Lothar P. Witteborg of Witteborg and Williams, Inc., New York City, New York, gave an informational report on the Museum Project.

M58. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Cash, the Board approved the inclusion of an amount to be determined by the Campus Planning Committee, with the help of Mr. Howard Schmidt, in the application for Phase II of the Wiggins Complex, with the understanding that the plans will be prepared for future additions to accommodate twice the present enrollment and the financial arrangements will be open-ended in order to issue bonds for future additions.


M59. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Cash, the Board approved the recommendation that Zumwalt and Vinther, Inc., engineers, be authorized to begin the design phase of the work on Tunnels and Utilities Extension for the Biology Building under the terms of the existing contract.



M60. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Allen, the Board by a unanimous vote authorized the Campus Planning Committee and the Project Architects to find all possible practical savings in omitting details on the south wall of the Commons Area and the west end of Coleman Hall, and some of the walks, parking, and sprinklers in Phase I of the project.

M61. President Murray gave a report on the progress being made on several special projects.

M62. The Board adjourned at 10:25 a.m. until the special meeting on Tuesday, February 7, 1967, to be held at the Driskill Hotel, Austin, Texas, at 9:00 a.m.





It is expressly understood and agreed that this contract between Subcontractor and Contractor shall be null and void in the event that the Contractor is not awarded a contract to provide flight training. It is further agreed that in the event of such an award, Subcontractor will perform the terms of this contract. In the event the proposal made by the Contractor is modified by the Contracting Officer, Subcontractor agrees to perform this contract at the same rate of pay per hour of instruction as provided herein, but not to exceed the total hours which may be imposed by any such modifications.
- h. If Subcontractor breaches any provision of this contract, including failure to perform in accordance with terms of this contract, Contractor may terminate this agreement. Termination will be accomplished by delivery by Contractor to Subcontractor of notice in writing setting forth the breach. In the event the Subcontractor fails to complete performance of this contract, whether arising from termination by Contractor or by any other persons authorized to terminate same or whether failure arises from any other cause, Subcontractor agrees that the Contractor may procure the services required by this contract elsewhere and that in the event such services are procured at greater cost to Contractor than is provided here, Subcontractor agrees to pay such additional costs as may be actually paid by Contractor to procure such services.
- i. The Contracting Officer, by written notice, may terminate this contract, in whole or in part, when it is in the best interest of the Government. The Government shall be liable only for payment in accordance with the payment provisions of this contract for services rendered prior to the effective date of termination.

- j. The liability of Contractor extends only to the payment of sums stipulated as due and owing for services performed by Sub-contractor in accordance with all of the terms, conditions and provisions of this contract. The parties contemplate that Contractor shall exercise no supervision over the Subcontractor in its performance of these services. The only discretion reserved to Contractor in this connection is that which is necessary to determine whether Subcontractor has performed and supplied services which meet the requirements set out herein as the standards by which to judge such performance and such discretion as is necessary to determine whether sums are due and owing from the standpoint of whether Subcontractor has complied with the terms, conditions and provisions of this contract.

This contract shall be in effect for the period October 1, 1966, through June 30, 1967.

HORN PROFESSORSHIPS

Resolution

WHEREAS, in order to confer more adequate recognition and facilitate retention of faculty members who have gained national or regional distinction, the Council of Deans, through the Vice President for Academic Affairs and the President, has recommended that there be established the "Horn Professorships," and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has approved the recommendations of the Council of Deans,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of Texas Technological College that there be established special professorships to be known as the "Horn Professorships," named in honor of Paul Whitfield Horn, the first president of the institution.

TEXAS TECHNOLOGICAL COLLEGE

HORN PROFESSORSHIPS

Criteria and Procedures for Selection

Eligibility for a "Horn Professorship" shall be acquired solely by attainment of national or regional distinction for outstanding teaching, research, or other creative achievement.

No professor who holds the rank of Dean or above shall be eligible for designation as a "Horn Professor."

Nomination of a professor for the designation as a "Horn Professor" shall originate with the Dean of the School in which the nominee holds professorial status. The nomination of the Dean shall be reviewed by a committee comprised of the Vice President for Academic Affairs, the Dean of the Graduate School, the Chairman of the Faculty Advisory Committee, and two members of the faculty appointed by the President. The aforesaid Committee, after careful deliberation and recourse to the opinion of scholars not in the employ of Texas Technological College, may accept or reject the nomination. If the committee approves the nomination, it shall transmit it to the President of the College with a recommendation for its approval by him. If the President of the College concurs in the recommendation of the aforesaid committee, he shall transmit the nomination to the Board of Directors for final action. If the Board of Directors approves the nomination, an individual resolution by the said Board will be required to designate the nominee as a "Horn Professor."



The number of "Horn Professorships" shall not be limited to a fixed quota nor shall an effort be made to maintain fixed ratios of this special position among the schools and departments.

The salary of an appointee to a "Horn Professorship" shall be raised not less than \$2,000 above his salary at the time of appointment.

Attainment of national or regional distinction for outstanding teaching, research, or other creative achievement shall be determined on the basis of the following criteria:

1. Listing in Who's Who in America, American Men of Science, and other selective compilations of this type.
2. Offices held in learned societies.
3. Membership in academic and honorary organizations granted in recognition of achievement.
4. Production record--books, articles, patents, bulletins, works of art and other evidences of productive scholarship in the respective fields.
5. Services to governmental agencies aside from those regularly associated with individual university duties.
6. Services as expert, consultant, etc. to business, industry, agricultural organizations, etc.
7. Service as visiting professor in other institutions.
8. Lectures delivered at other institutions.
9. Papers read before learned societies.
10. Reviews written in leading scholarly journals.

11. Grants, awards, prizes or other honors from professional organizations and foundations.
12. Other criteria of particular pertinence to the individual's field.
13. Demonstrated excellence in classroom teaching, academic counselling and guidance of students and direction of or inspiration of graduate studies, theses, etc.

TEXAS TECHNOLOGICAL COLLEGE

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System, has recommended a change in tuition rates in publicly supported colleges and universities,

AND WHEREAS the requested legislative appropriations from the various publicly supported colleges and universities for the 1968-69 biennium are significantly higher than those of the current biennium,

AND WHEREAS the people and the administration of the state of Texas have publicly indicated their desire to achieve excellence in higher education,

hereinafter called the project, for the sum of Three Million Three Hundred Fifty-Nine Thousand Nine Hundred Fourteen Dollars and No Cents (\$3,359,914.00) which sum includes Two Million Eighty-One Thousand Seven Hundred Thirty-One Dollars and No Cents (\$2,081,731.00) value for materials and One Million Two Hundred Seventy-Eight Thousand One Hundred Eighty-Three Dollars and No Cents (\$1,278,183.00) value for labor and all extra work in connection therewith, under the terms as stated in the General and Special Conditions of the Contract; and at their own proper cost and expense to furnish all the materials, supplies, machinery, equipment, tools, superintendence, labor, insurance and other accessories and services necessary to complete the said project in accordance with the conditions and prices stated in the Proposal, the General Conditions, Supplemental General Conditions and Special Conditions of the Contract, Information for Bidders, the plans, which include all maps, plats, prints, and other drawings and printed or written explanatory matter thereof, the specifications and contract documents, including Addendum No. 1, dated November 15, 1966; Addendum No. 2, dated November 23, 1966; Addendum No. 3, dated November 29, 1966; Addendum No. 4, dated December 7, 1966; Addendum No.

5, dated December 9, 1966; Addendum No. 6, dated December 12, 1966; Addendum No. 7, dated December 13, 1966, therefor as prepared by Page, Southerland, Page of Austin, Travis County, Texas, herein entitled the Architect/Engineer, and as enumerated in Paragraph 1 of the Supplementary General Conditions including General Construction; Plumbing, Heating, Ventilating and Air Conditioning; Electrical; and Elevators, all of which are made a part hereof and collectively evidence and constitute the contract.

The Contractor hereby agrees to adjust the depth of foundation walls, grade beams, piers and/or footings for an increase or decrease in amount of Three Dollars (\$3.00) per cubic foot of reinforced concrete including steel and forms and Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per cubic yard of excavation.

The Contractor hereby agrees to commence work under this contract on or before a date to be specified in a written "Notice to Proceed" of the Owner and to fully complete the project within Five Hundred and Ninety (590) consecutive calendar days, thereafter. The Contractor further agrees to pay, as liquidated damages, the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each consecutive calendar day thereafter as hereinafter provided in Paragraph 19, Time for Completion and Liquidated Damages of the General Conditions.

The OWNER agrees to pay the CONTRACTOR in current funds for the performance of the contract, subject to additions and deductions, as provided in the General Conditions of the Contract, and to make payments on account thereof as provided in Paragraph 25, Payments to Contractor, of the General Conditions.
