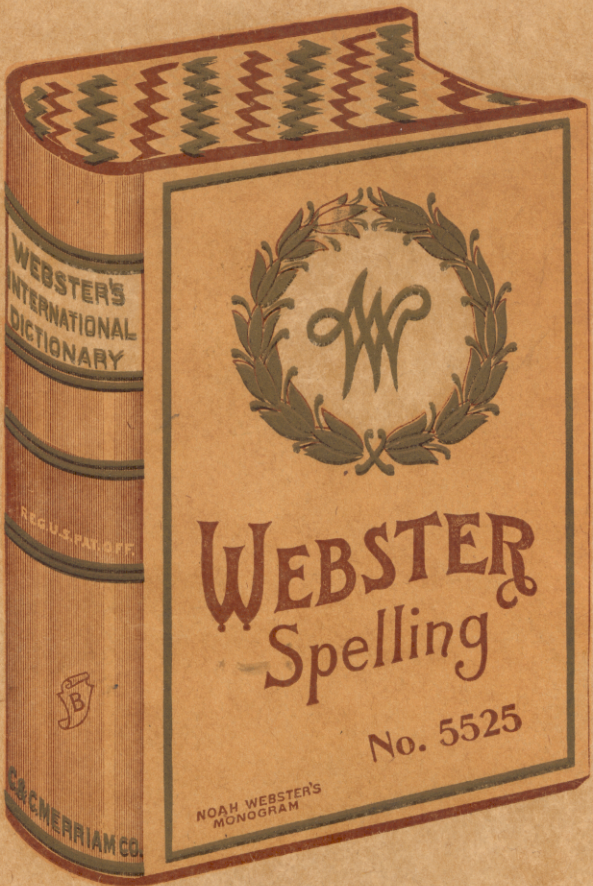

The Southside Hamptons -
Isle of Wight Co. Va

The name of the emigrant ancestor of the Hamptons settled South of James River, Virginia will probably never be known definitely. The three possible founders of the Isle of Wight Co Hampton family are:
1st - John Hampton who was living at "Bucke Row", Lower Norfolk County - now Princess Anne County, on Feb 16 - 1623, with wife and no children - mentioned, July 14th 1655 John Hampton (probably the same) had a grant of 150 acres in Lower Norfolk County. The records of this county are intact but give no further data of John Hampton or anyone else of this name.

2nd Richard Hampton, whose transportation to Virginia, was paid by Capt Giles Brent, who had

a grant of land in Westmore
Land County for this "head right"
in 1654 (Grecy) see may have
been the Richard Hampton whose
"Deposition in ye differences
between Hugh Campbell ^{ex} and William
Carbone" was recorded in Isle of
Wight Co Feb. 1692 - (2) W. Deed Book 1, p 57

3^d William Hampton, planter,
of "Hampfield", Gloucester County, Va.
through his sons William or
Thomas Hampton - most probably
the latter, as William ^{male} is thought
to have died without issue.

Dec 11, 1640, William Hampton had
a grant of 400 acres of land in
Isle of Wight County (Grecy)

It is the opinion of the compiler
that the Isle of Wight Hamptons
are the descendants of William
Hampton "planter", of "Hampfield"
Gloucester County, the reasons for
which are as follows =

First, while the records of Isle of
Wight, in ^{original counties} original ^{or land} are intact, they do
not contain any deed to any

person by name of Hampton
in the 17th century, yet Thomas
Hampton who died in this
county in 1703 divided land
on King Sale Swamp, Isle of
Wight Co. Not having a deed from
a private individual for this
land he could have obtained it
only by grant or inheritance.

The Land Office Records at
Richmond fail to show any
patent to this Thomas Hampton
or to any other Hampton, ^{for land in Isle of Wight} except
that to William Hampton in
1640. The Isle of Wight records
do not contain a deed from
Wm Hampton or any of his
true descendants for the land
he owned in this county. The
conclusion is that Thomas
Hampton inherited this land
either by descent or by purchase in
the latter half of the 17th
century. He must therefore
have been a son either of
William or Rev. Thomas Hampton
the only sons of William Hampton

Sr. of Gloucester Co. There
is nothing in the records now
in existence to indicate that
William Hampton Junior left ^{male}
issue, but there is to show that
Rev. Thomas had at least 2
sons, as the old deed of 1743 speaks
of Capt. John Hampton as the
eldest son of Rev. Thomas.
~~Capt. John~~ Thomas who inherited &
received by deed & gift all
his father's land lying north
of James River, ^{in Gloucester & King William Cos.} except one
tract to his sister Mrs Mary
Hampton. Duke - Wade -
in James City County. and
all of the Hamptons in that
section of Virginia lying between
the James & Potomac Rivers,
and the Chesapeake Bay
or the Blue Ridge Mts, where
we have any data whatever
are shown to be descendants
of Capt. John Hampton.
who died in 1718 on the King
William County plantation
granted to his father Rev. Thomas

Hampton,

1658.

So if William Hampton Jr. who died in Gloucester Co after 1698 left male issue, they must have removed from this part of Virginia, so Thomas Hampton of Isle of Wight may possibly have been son of William, but the more use of the name William, and the name Thomas ^{+ John} appearing among sons & grandsons of ~~the~~ ^{John} ~~Hampton~~ of Thimble Shoal, who died in 1703 on Isle of Wight would indicate that he was one of the sons of Rev. Thomas Hampton of James City County.

As to the other two possible ancestors of Thomas Hampton of Isle of Wight, ^{John & Richard Hampton} he could not have been a son of John of Norfolk Co who was married prior to 1623, as part of Thimble Hampton's children were under age in 1703; and surely there would be found some data in the Norfolk or Isle of Wight

records of an intermediate
generation. The fact that
it was a written deposition
and not ^{the} direct testimony of
Richard Hampton that was
recorded in the Isle of Wight
Court records of 1692 show that
he was a non-resident
of this county. If he had de-
scendants there is not the
slightest bit of data of them to
be found in any of the parish,
county, or state records now
existing in Virginia. So

~~The inference is that neither
John nor Richard Hampton
left male issue.~~

And the name Richard does not
appear among the descendants
of ^{H.} Thomas Hampton of Isle of Wight.

So until further data to the
contrary is discovered, the South
Ends Hamptons will be regarded
as descendants of Rev. Thomas
Hampton of James City Co.
