Dear Sirs,

One of the purposes of LEARN is to encourage Chicanos to further their education. It is for this reason that I must submit my letter of resignation, effective Aug. 1, 1973. I feel that it is necessary for me to continue my education to the Masters level. From my short stay at LEARN, I have realized that it is an important facit of our community and is one of the few federal agencies which is being effective. By effectiveness, I mean that it is reaching a great number of students who normally would not have gone to a type of post-secondary institution.

I feel that it is my duty to express some of the major things which I feel need correcting or improving. The most important of these is the communication among the staff, especially that between the staff and Director. I know that the job of Director is one which requires the ability to keep a staff content yet doing the job. I feel that statements such as "I won't hesitate to fire you" or "I can do the job better than you and if you don't like it, you can quit", only serve to antagonize the staff and as a result strengthen the communication gap. The staff should be made comfortable to express their thoughts and have the satisfaction of knowing that they are making a worthwhile contribution to the overall running of the program. Very often wrongdoings are critized but jobs well-done go without praise. When the Director is out of town the staff should be allowed to be their own boss rather than "putting someone in charge." This only serves to build contempt for the person instead of respect. I am sure that the present staff is mature and competent enough to work as usual when the Director is away. I suggest that the book "Managing Through Insight" by Rahrer, Hibler and Replogle should be read by the entire staff.

Another item in which I wish to comment is that there seems to be a dual set of standards for employees. I feel that if a person is doing as much work or the same work as another person, those persons must be equally respected and appreciated. A degree does not make one person more human than the other.

Another communication gap which exists is between the staff and the Board of Directors. I feel that it is essential that the staff know and feel comfortable to talk to the Board.

I know that funds for LEARN are always limited and go only from year to year. I feel that an effort should be made by the Director and the Board to develop it into a self-sufficient program so that we will not always be in fear of losing the program. I know that this can be done through contributions. Additional monies should be sought through private foundations or from the city or county revenue sharing funds.

I hope that these suggestions and commentaries will not serve to antagonize the staff or to have contempt against me. I only wish for LEARN to continue its good work in helping our Chicano Brothers and Sisters.



This is in response to your Freedom of Information-Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request received by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). Information pertaining to your request has been set forth below in the appropriate paragraphs.

You must comply with the paragraph(s) requesting additional information or further action on your part before we can commence processing your request. Only those paragraphs which are marked X apply to your request.

X A preliminary review of the index to the central record system disclosed references to a name(s) similar to the subject(s) of your request. Since we have reviewed only the index to our records, and not the actual records themselves, we do not know at this point if the records pertain to your request. In an effort to deal fairly with any request requiring the retrieval, processing, and duplication of documents, each request is being handled in chronological order based on the date of receipt. Please be assured that your request is being handled as equitably as possible and that all documents which can be released will be made available at the earliest possible date.

Based on the limited information you provided, it is not possible to make an accurate search of our records. Please furnish the complete name(s) and date and place of birth of the subject(s) of your request, as well as any specific data that would assist us in locating the documents you seek. Upon receipt of your additional information, we will review the index to our central records system. If there is no indication of the existence of the records you seek, you will be so advised. If we have the records you seek, all documents which can be released will be made available at the earliest possible date.

Before we can commence processing for release any documents which may pertain to you, it is necessary for you to submit your notarized signature. This procedure is designed to insure that information concerning an individual is released only to him/her.

Before we can commence processing your request for records pertaining to another individual, we must know whether you have been authorized by that individual to receive these documents. It will be necessary for you to submit to the FBI the original of a written authorization which has been duly attested by a Notary Public. In accordance with the spirit and intent of the FOIPA, it is the policy of the FBI not to indicate whether we do or do not have the records you seek until such an authorization is received.

For your information, background investigations for military and non-military security clearances are conducted by many different Government agencies. The FBI actually conducts such background investigations in only a limited number of areas. You may wish to write directly to any agency which you believe might have caused a background investigation pertaining to you to have been conducted.

As a result of a preliminary review of documents pertaining to your request, it is believed that processing of these documents may result in charges in excess of \$25. Department of Justice Regulations, (Title 28, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 16.46), require notification to a requester when anticipated charges exceed \$25. This letter constitutes such notification. Please note that your indication of approval and consent to incur such fees will not necessarily result in the entire contents of our records being disclosed to you, inasmuch as we are guided

This is in response to your letter received by this office June 12, 1979, in which you request information contained in your investigative file. The Personnel Investigations Division of the Office of Personnel Management processes all requests in which an individual is seeking investigative file information from our system of records pertaining to himself or is seeking correction or amendment of such records under the Privacy Act of 1974, Public Law 93-579; and considers the provisions of the Privacy Act of 1974 to be exclusively applicable to all such requests.

Executive Order 10450 requires that a National Agency Check and Inquiry be conducted on all persons entering the Federal service. This is a record check and correspondence investigation which screens suitability, fitness and loyalty. If the National Agency Check and Inquiry is entirely favorable the Office of Personnel Management destroys all data relating to the favorable decision and informs the employing agency that the results were clear. The Office of Personnel Management maintains records of clearly favorable National Agency Check and Inquiry investigations for two years plus the current year.





We have received your request under the Freedom of Information Act for information pertaining to you. Requests such as yours, which involve the requester's personal file, are handled by this Agency under the provisions of the Privacy Act of 1974 which took effect on 27 September 1975. Please be advised that in contrast to the procedures established for the Freedom of Information Act, there are no fees charged under the Privacy Act. Furthermore, the results of this processing will include all of the material that would normally be available to you under the Freedom of Information Act, and will also include any additional material to which you may be entitled under the Privacy Act.

The Privacy Act of 1974 and pertinent CIA Regulations established requirements and procedures for access by individuals to information pertaining to them. CIA Regulations were published in the Federal Register on 28 August 1975 and may be found in Title $\overline{32}$ C.F.R. $\overline{1901}$.

Since the Privacy Act requires federal agencies to ensure that improper disclosure of personally identifiable information will not be made and further provides criminal penalties for improper disclosure, CIA Privacy Regulations, section 1901.13, sets forth the following requirements for identification of individuals making requests.


