## The MOLE of the Cape of Good Hope.

T Have here given a figure of a mole found at 1 the Cape of Good Hope, a fluffed fkin of which was fent me by M. Sonnerat. This mole pretty much refembles the common fpecies in the form of its body, in the eyes, in the ears, and in the tail ; but it differs in the head, which is larger, and in the muzzle, which refembles that of a Guiney-pig. The fore-feet are likewife different: The hair is not black, but dark brown, with a little yellow at the extremity of each hair. The tail is covered with large hairs of a yellowifh white colour; and, in general, the hair of this mole is longer than that of the European. From all thefe defcriptions we may conclude, that it is a particular fpecies, and that, though allied to the common mole, it cannot be regarded as a fimple variety,
