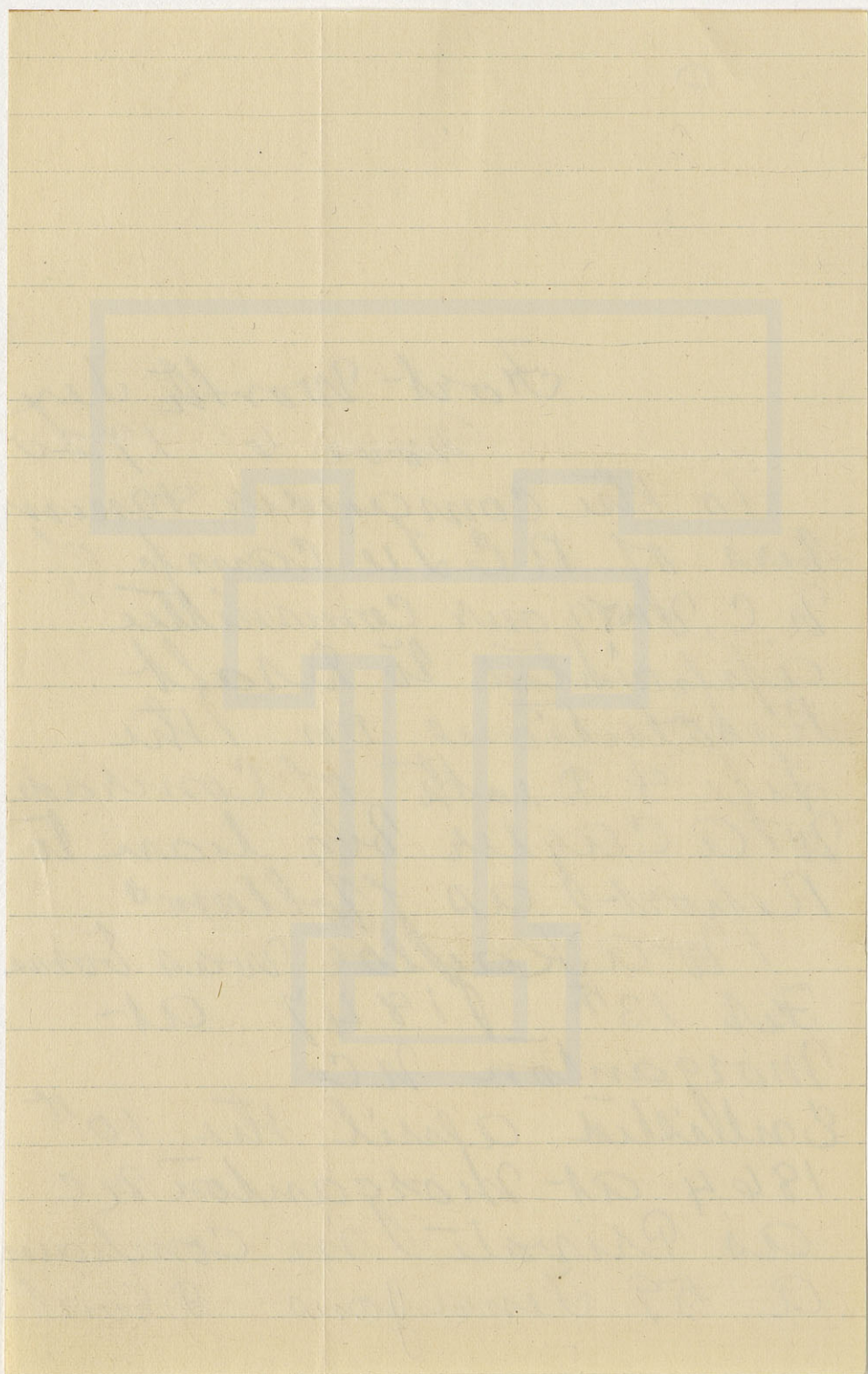

Report as follows

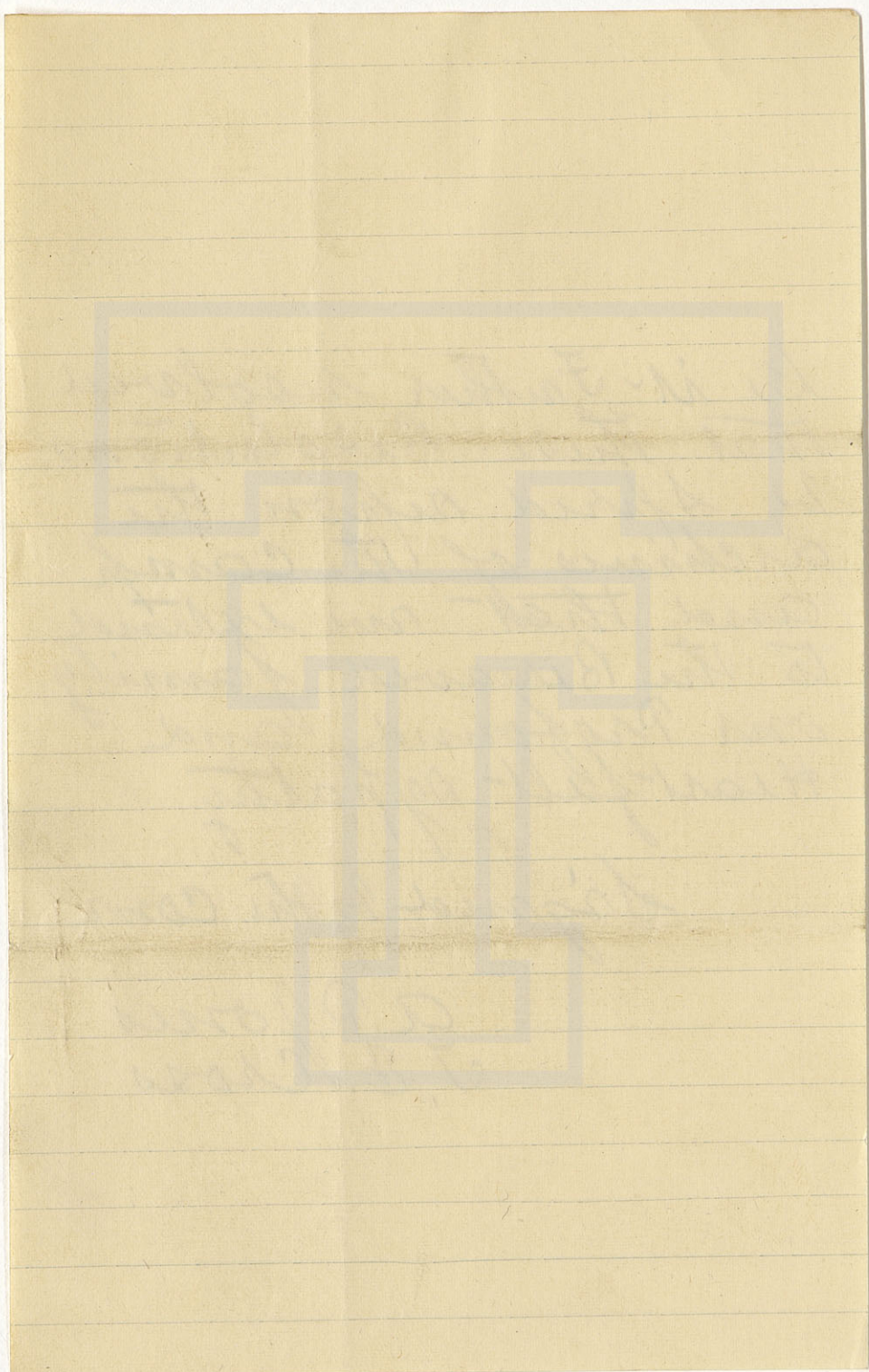
W A Kaylor was born

A 59 Tennessee Divis



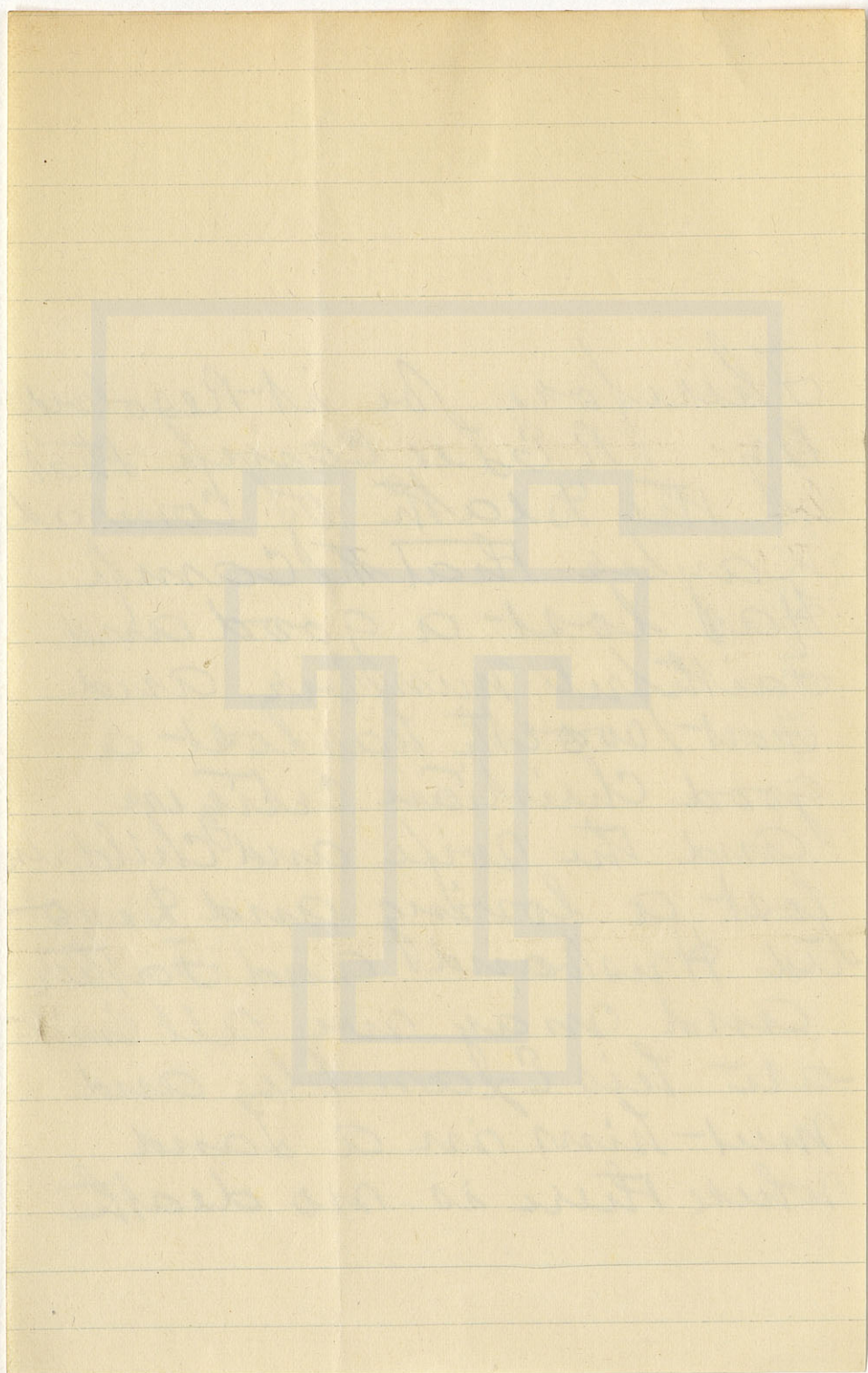
Be it Further resolved

where there is no death

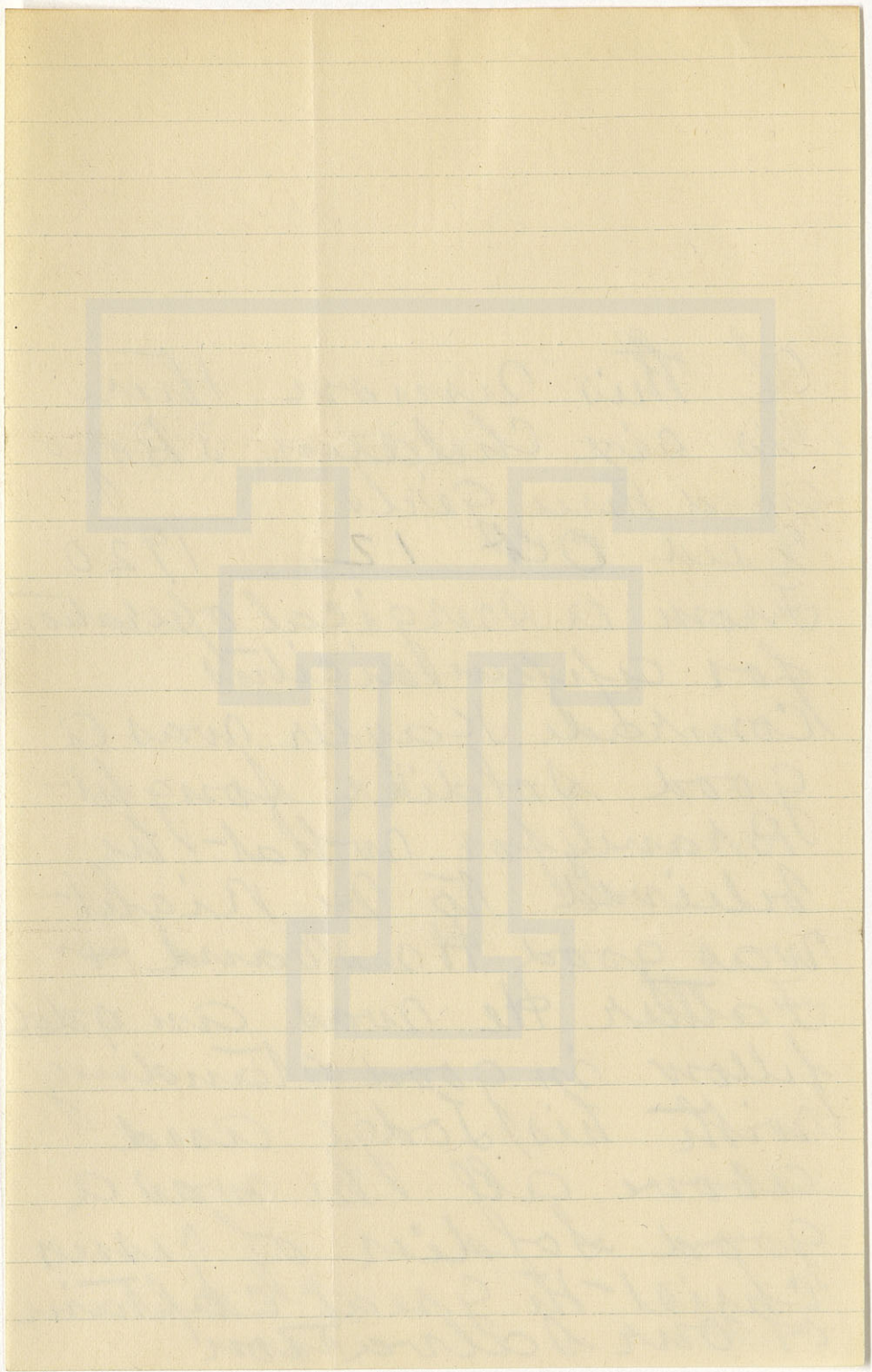


Of this Union there

was discharged at the
end of war in North
Carolina He came to
Texas shortly after the
war between the States
and was married to
Miss Ella M Williams of
Milton Florida at Navasota
to Texas Sep 12 1871
