Adequate pay

We appreciated The Paper's editorial on Proposition 1. We would like to add some further thoughts. This proposition states that the annual salary of the legislators is \$7,200. What it does not state is that members are paid \$7,500 while the legislature is in session and \$6,500 when it is not, plus mileage to the sessions. Members also receive

retirement benefits. This is adequate compensation for a part-time job.

A wise gentleman stated in regard to voting on constitutional amendments, "Always remember, when you are asked to vote on these amendments, they are asked to vote on these amendments, they are asking you to give them something." In the case of Proposition 1, not only are they asking you to give them something, namely a salary hike they are asking you to give up something, and that is control over their salaries. If you vote yes, the legislators get an automatic raise each time the governor's salary is raised.

Some of these amendments are worth considering. If, however, when reading a particular amendment you do not understand what is being asked for, the wisest thing to do would be vote no. No is what we recommend you vote on Proposition 1.

 - A. Air Quality
 - B. Disposal of solid waste
- IV. Study and evaluate Kemp Public Library's ability to serve the citizens of Wichita Falls.

The Board of Directors recommends the adoption of the above program.

Program: Melba reports that Jack Murphy, Director of Parks and Recreation will speak on "Parks and Recreation--What's in it For You?" in April. Dr. Rodriguez of MSU will speak to the May Annual Meeting.

Community Service: Irene Lambert reports she will send cards to media re: meeting times and subjects.

<u>Voter Service</u>: It was decided that a Voter's Guide should be published for the April City Council Election as several candidates will be running for two seats on council. Peggy Gordon, Voter Service Chairman will be out of town during the next two months. Billye Jeter will be in charge of getting Guide published. Irene, Fee, and Ann will help.

Membership: Several members have asked guests to luncheons only to have them not show up. It was stressed that we should offer to go by for guests and bring them to meetings if possible. Irene suggested giving extra newsletters to potential members. We will also distribute the LWV flyer "Be a Part of It" to potential members.

Newsletter: Katy is re-doing two ads for newsletter. Members are urged to turn in items of interest to Katy.

Finance: Balance reported at beginning of meeting is \$561.00. Contributions for several hundred dollars were turned in to Finance Chairman during meeting and we will have a more up-to-date report next meeting. Jeanette reported that the Fund-raising program she attended was excellent in that it explained much about the pitfalls and problems of different fund-raising ideas. A garage sale seems to be the best means for us to raise money without capital investment. Concern about the committment in hours and labor was voiced. It was decided to ask Alisa Larson to be chairman of a committee to investigate the possibilities of such a sale and report to board. Unfinished Business: Jeanette reported receipt of a letter from Ray Connady thanking us for our participation in Events seminar. She also received a Thank You from Rep. John Gavin re: our visit to the Legislature. He states that there were more bills facint this session of the Legislature than ever before. He also is concerned about the state of the Capitol Building which is in need of repair. He sited many other items of interest.

Billye asked for help in editing City-County survey. Jeanette will help Billye during the summer months. It is hoped that we can find someone interested in publishing it for us in the Fall.

Alisa asked at what point would dues extend. It was decided that dues paid after January of the year would extend til July of next year.

Billye reported that VISA applications finally arrived. We will pass them out at luncheon meeting in April. Our number TX121 must be on each application. We will put number on each application before handing them out. We must have ten applications in before they will reimburse us \$3.00 on each.

Irene suggested that we insert in our Voter a plea for members to be Observers at meetings of School Board, Council and County Commissioners. Katy will do so.

Ann suggested using notes with logo we had used previously. Katy will make copy of note and try to get TU to contribute paper and copier to make 100 notes. These will be sent to contributors to our finance drive.
