To whom it may concern:

This is to certify, that in the Summer of 1864, I resided in Talladega (and adjoining counties) Alabama, in company of boys between 17 and 18 years of age, and was in July 1864, ordered to report with my said Company to Confederate General at Mobile, Alabama for further orders. That I conducted said Company to Mobile and was placed under orders of Brigader-General Edward Higgins, commanding District of Mobile, Alabama, and my said Company was assigned to 63rd Alabama Infantry. That among the members of my ~~of~~ my said Company, was a young man, E.D. Tanner, whom I am informed now resides in or near Fort Worth, Texas, and if he is the same person as the member of my said Company, in Summer of 1864, he was in the regular service of Confederate States and served till close of War in 1865, and is entitled to be enrolled among the members of "United Confederate Veterans," in whatever camp he may select by virtue of his army service as aforesaid.
