

REPORT OF THE BY-LAWS COMMITTEE TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS NOVEMBER 3, 1975

Art. III, Sec. 2 - Types of Membership:
(a) Regarding voting members, change "citizens of voting age" to "citizens at least 18 years of age" to conform to State and National By-Laws.

Art. IV Officers - Change number from "Article V".

Art. IV, Sec. 1 - Enumeration and Election of Officers:
Restore 2-year staggared terms except those of President and PresidentElect and remove two consecutive term limitation so as to read: "The officers of the League of Women Voters of Brownsville, Texas, shall be a President and President-Elect who shall be elected for a term of one year, a Treasurer who shall be elected for a term of two years in odd-numbered years, and Vice-President and Secretary who shall be elected for a term of two years in even-numbered years by the general membership at the Annual Meeting and shall take office immediately."

When the League becomes stronger, 2-year terms can easily be restored to the President and President-Elect in an odd-numbered year without changing the balance of the proposed amended section.

Art. IV, Sec. 3 - The President-Elect:
Delete "or she shall succeed to the Presidency the following year if
so elected by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the general membership" to
avoid conflict with Art. V, Sec. 1 pertaining to election of officers
and Art. VII, Sec. 3 pertaining to election of officers by majority vote.

Art. IV, Sec. 5 - The Secretary:
Substitute "General Membership" for "business" meetings.

Art. V - Board of Directors: Change from "Article IV"

Art. V, Sec. 1 - <u>Number</u>, <u>Manner of Selection and Term of Office</u>: Remove 8-Director requirement by amending to read: "not less than two nor more than six elected Directors, and not less than two nor more than six appointed Directors."

Art. IX, Sec. 1 - <u>Authorization</u>: Change heading to "Principles" to conform to State and National By-Laws.

Art. IX, Sec. 2 - Program:
To conform amend to read: "The Program of the League of Women Voters of Brownsville, Texas, shall consist of (a) action to protect the right to vote of every citizen, and (b) those governmental issues chosen for concerted study and action."

Art. IX, Sec. 3 - Program Selection:
Same structure as wording in current Sec. 2 with only two minor changes and change of heading. (a) Amend last sentence by changing "might be" to "is" and (b) Concerning notice os proposed Program changes, change "has Been" to "is."

Art. IX, Sec. 4 - Member Action: Change from "Sec. 4."

Art. IX, Sec. 5 - <u>Local League Action</u>: Change from "Sec. 4" Delete "as stated in the Platform" and substitute "and the League of Women Voters of Texas."

Art. XI - Parliamentary Authority:
Amend to read "Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised."


Next board meeting is set for May 6. Notebooks are to be cleaned and passed on to the new board.



LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE REPORT TO THE BOARD

October 2, 1974

On September 27, 1974, the Legislative Committee met with our President, Buth Manzke, at the home of Margaret Aziz, to clearly define the responsibilities of our committee and the areas which each member will cover.

Since the Brownsville League never had a Legislative Committee to provide us with guidelines and we already have committees covering CITY and STATE affairs - such as our CITY Environmental Quality Committee and the four STATE PROGRAM COMMITTEES listed on page 4 of our July/August 1974 Bulletin, namely:

FINANCING STATE GOVERNMENT, TEXAS WATER PLAN. ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY, and TEXAS CONSTITUTIONAL REVISION.

it was important to chart a course of activities for the Legislative Committee that would not duplicate or conflict with the function of any of these committees and that would, instead, carry on where they leave off, that is, in the area of legislation.

To guide us, we had in our files a May 1974 LEGISLATIVE ACTION BULLETIN from the State Board in which they refer to a LEGISLATIVE HANDBOOK which outlines "the role of the legislative chalkman, (gives) a job description and a legislative calendar."

Unfortunately, we do not have a copy of that <u>LEGISLATIVE HANDBOOK</u>, but in the bulletin they have excerpted key points which we present below in outline form to clarify them:

- I. League work and study culminates in legislative action.
- II. The foundation for the League's <u>legislative program</u> is provided by conclusions reached by local members after studying governmental issues adopted as LEAGUE PROGRAM at the State convention.
- III. The LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE translates this program into action. This Means:
 - A. Enthusiastically keeping the membership informed about State legislation. (We should add here NATIONAL and CITY LEGISLATION.)
 - a. Organizing membership response to TIEES FOR ACTIONS, the notice from local, state or national boards to go "all out" with letters, legislator contacts and with public information on pending legislation.
 - IV. The Legislative Chairman also arranges interviews with legislators and inspires members to know their legislators better so they will know, care and act on matters in which the League has an interest.

DUTIES OF LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE REABERS

As it was agreed at our last Board meeting, the three members of the Legislative Committee will serve as coequal chairmen, each covering a different level of legislation, namely:

MATIONAL CHAIRMAN - Margaret Aziz STATE CHAIRMAN = Mery Chase CITY CHAIRMAN - Eleanor Kugel

Sleanor Rugel's duties as Program Coordinator dovetail nicely into her role as CITY CHAIRMAN of the Legislative Committee - and she will decide when the work of the CITY PROCRAM COMMITTEES reach the point where the LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE takes over - and, of course, she will still be in charge but wearing a different hat.

Mary Chase's function as chairman of the TERAS CONSTITUTIONAL BEVISION COMMITTEE will be broadened to include all State legislation when she carries on her work as STATE CHAIRBAN of the Legislative Committee.

Since we do not have any comparable NATIONAL PROGRAM COMMITTEES, there will be no overlapping of committee work, and Margaret Aziz will cover NATIONAL LEGISLATION, concentrating on the areas of greatest concern and, of course, within the framework of LEAVUE directives and the approval of the Legislative Committee as a whole and of the Board.

REPORT TO GENERAL MEETING

RE: FEDERAL CAMPAIGN REFORM ACT

One of the major bills before the 93rd Congress for which the League worked hard and long was the Federal Campaign Reform Act which was signed by President Ford on October 15, 1974.

In the TIME FOR ACTION bulletin of July 17, 1974, the League had stressed that:

We will be working hard to add public funding for Congressional elections to the bill. But top priority must be given to the amendment providing for an independent Federal Elections Commission. The chances for adoption of the latter are better; we also consider that an independent enforcement agency is absolutely essential in any bill that revises campaign financing practices.

The League guessed correctly. An independent federal elections commission was provided for to administer the legislation as follows:

Two members would be appointed by the president, two by the House and two by the Senate and all would be subject to confirmation by the House and Senate.

But, unfortunately, the bill provides for public financing of only presidential campaigns, and not for House and Senate races which the League had supported with vigor.

In an article on page 38 in the October 21. 1974 issue of U.S. News & World Report under the heading of: PRESIDENTIAL RACES AT TAXPAYER EXPENSE, they point out that:

(President Ford) had threatened to veto (the bill) if it provided federal financing for congressional as well as presidential campaigns, as the original Senate version had proposed.

While we will have to wait to see what the League's official reaction will be to the compromise bill which President Ford was willing to sign, it is my guess that it will echo Senator Edward Kennedy's comments quoted an ap article on page 4D of the October 9, 1974 issue of the Coppus Christi Caller under the caption: **EXARXEMANXEMENTALES CAMPAIGN-FINANCING MEASURE PASSED BY SENATE, 60-16:

Senator Howard W. Cannon, D-Nev., floor manager of the bill, said the legislation, growing out of the Watergate scandals, was designed "to eliminate the problems so prevalent in the 1972 campaign."

But Senator Edward M. Kennedy, D-Hass., said he supported the

compromise with mixed feelings.

He said it set "a double standard of reform" by providing for use of tax funds to finance presidential campaigns but not Senate and House races, in which he said the need for public financing was probably greater.

Incidentally. I was pleased to note in the same article that Republican leader "Hugh Sebot said he also regretted the lack of public financing of congressional reces." (Senator Scott usually echos the position taken by the White House, right or wrong!)

This AP article also mentions that:

Common Cause, a self-styled citizens lobby, called the bill "the only major legislative response by the 93rd Congress to the Watergate scandals."

A TRIBUTE AND A PLEDGE TO OUR PRESIDENT RUTH MANZKE

Recording Secretary's

We, the undersigned members of the Board of League of Women Voters of Brownsville, want, first, to acknowledge our great debt to you for your dedicated leadership and for the many services you have been rendering the League which have been beyond the call of duty.

We know that the work the League has accomplished thus far has made our community that much better, but, to reap the full benefit, there must be continuity for another year under your indispensable leadership.

In fact, all the time and effort already invested in the League's program will come to naught unless the League maintains an active presence in our community to see that, what has now become our major objective - namely, the enforcement of city ordinances - is successfully realized.

As our Vice President, Eleanor Kugel, stated in writing to our city officials on November 25, 1974:

Our study (of the health and sanitation conditions in Brownsville) has revealed the existence of ordinances which would, if enforced, correct many conditions that are health hazards; so the overall problem seems to be in the area of enforcement.

We are fully aware of the heavy burden that has been placed on you by the massiveness of the mail you received from the League's national and state offices, much of it calling for action of some kind.

Since it is a matter of survival, we can streamline the League's work and reduce it to its basic essentials - as covered in the attached suggested program. You will note it eliminates the most burdensome part of the work you have been shouldering and focuses on the enforcement of the law - which is our city's greatest need.

If you will consent to serve as our President for another year, we pledge to you our fullest cooperation and support. Only very urgent personal matters will keep us from attending all meetings. And, in such a case, you will be notified in advance when we are unable to attend.

RE: CONSTITUTION AMENDEMENT ELECTION

On April 7 the Legislative Committee of the ASSOCIATION OF BROWNSVILLE EDUCATORS, VOTING SECTION, telephoned the League to invite us to attend their meeting on April 8 at the Sharpe Elementary School in the hope that we could work with them in support of the two amendments to be voted on on April 22:

AMENDMENT NO. 1 - SJR No. 3

Revising and sonsolidating provisions relating to state and local retirement systems and program and providing for a maximum state contribution to state systems of 10 percent of the aggregate compensation paid to inviduals.

AMENDMENT NO. 2 - HJR Mp/ 6

Setting the salaries of members of the legislature at \$600 per month and setting a per diem of \$30 during legislature sessions and a mileage allowance at the same rate provided by law for state employees.

The League's Texas office sent our president a copy of the sample ballot and gave the background of each amendment with the ARGUMENTS FOR AND AGAINST and added this statement:

(THE LEAGUE) DOES NOT SUPPORT OR OFFOSE ANY OF THE FOUR(?) PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE TEXAS CONSTITUTION PRESENTED IN THIS VOTER'S GUIDE.

Vebe Cavazos and I attended the meeting at which their chairman, Donna McCabe presided. We informed her about the position of the League and told her about the best we could do was to report on their meeting at our regular meeting.

All the teachers of Texas are supporting both amendments and have launched a publicity campaign to rally support for them.

 - (1) A meeting of candidates for Commissioner of the Brownsville Navigation District in which each candidate addressed the League and its guests.
 - (2) A presentation on ground water, by Pat Cook.
 - (3) A talk by Judge Filemon Vela, who spoke on Juvenile Justice and the particular situation common to our area. A consensus was taken.
 - (4) A tour of the new Hall of Justice.
 - (5) A Christmas party at Leonardo's Restaurant. Guest speaker was Senator Raul Longoria.
 - (6) A consensus on the Urban Crisis program, by Jerry Corcoran.
 - (7) An informal talk by our new city manager, Mr. Neil Harmon.

Speakers included Graciana DePena, administrative assistant to Cameron County Judge Ray Ramon; Al Cisneros, Port Director and Browns-ville Navigation District General Manager; Florencio Pena, City Planner; Robert Roundtree, PUB General Manager; and Hoy Richardson, consultant at the Port of Brownsville.

ARTICLE I

Sec. 1. Name. The Name of this organization shall be the League of Women Voters of Dromsville, Tomas. This local League is an integral part of the League of Women Voters of the United States and of the League of Women Voters of Texas.

ARTICIE II PURPOSE AND TOLECY

- Sec. 1. Purpose. The Purpose of the League of Women Voters of Brownsville, Texas, shall be to promote political responsibility through informed prid active participation of citizens in government.
- Sec. 2. Policy. The League of Women Voters of Brownsville, Texas, may take action on local governmental measures and policies in the public interest in conformity with the Principles of the League of Women Voters of the United States. It shall not support nor oppose any political party nor any candidate.

Article III

Sec. 1. Eligibility. The membersh p of the League of Women Voters of Eromsville, Texas shall be composed of voting members and associate members. Any person who subscribes to the purpose and policy of the League shall be eligible for membership.

Sec. 2. Types of Hembers'dp

(a) Voting members shall be citimons at least 18 years of age (b) Associate members shall be all other members.

ARTICLE IV

Sec. 1. Enumeration and Election of Officers. The officers of the League of Wesen Voters of Lromsville, Texas, shall be a President and First Vice-President who shall be elected for a term of one year, a Treasurer who shall be elected for a term of two years in odd-numbered years, and a Second Vice-President and Secretary who shall be elected for a term of two years in even-numbered years by the general membership at the Annual Mosting and shall take office immediately.

Sec. 2. The President. The President shall preside at all meetings

- of the organization and of the Foard of Directors. The President may in the absence or disability of the Treasurer sign or endorse blacks,

 - Sec. 3. The First Vice-President. The First Vice-President shall serve as administrative vice-president and shall in the event of the absence, disability, or death of the President possess all the powers and perform all the duties of the Presidency.

Board.

- Sec. h. The Second Vide-President. The Second Vice-President shall in the event ed the absence, disability, or death of the Tresident and First Vice-President possess all the powers and perform all the duties of the President. In the event that none of these three (3) persons shall be able to serve in this capacity the Board of Lirectors shall appoint scheme to fill the Presidency.
- Sec. 5. The Secretary. The Secretary shall keep minutes of all Senoral Membership meetings of the League and of all meetings of the Poard of Directors. The Secretary shall notify all Officers and Directors of election. The Secretary shall sign, with the Freedomt, all contracts and other instruments when so authorized by the Board and shall perform such other duties and functions as may be incident to help the office.

- Sec. 1. Number, Harrier of Selection and Torm of Office. The Board of Mirectors shall consist of the officers of the Longue and not less than two nor more than six ejected Mirectors, the number of appointed than two nor more than six appointed Mirectors, the number of appointed Directors shall not exceed the number of elected Directors. One half of the elected Directors shall be elected by the general membership at each Annual Moeting and shall serve for a period of two (2) years, or until their successes have been elected and qualified. The Board shall appoint such additional Directors as they deem necessary to earry on the work of the League. The term of office of the appointed Directors shall be one (1) year and shall expire at the conclusion of the next Annual Meeting.
- Sec. 2. Curlifications. No person shall be elected or appointed or divil continue to serve as an officer or director of the organization unless (end) that person is a voting member of the League of Women

Votors of Brownsville, Texas.

- Sec. 3. Vacancies. Any vacancy occurring in the Board of Directors by reason of the resignation, death, or disqualification of an officer or elected member may be filled, until the next Annual Meeting by a majority vote of the remaining members of the Board of Directors.
- Sec. 4. Povers and Duties. The Board of Directors shall have full charge of the property and business of the organization, with full power and authority to manage and donduot came, subject to the instructions of the general membership. It shall plan and direct the work necessary to carry out the Program as adopted by the Unitional Convention, the State Convention, and the Amuel Moeting. The Board shall create and designate such special committees as it may dom necessary.
- Sec. 5. Meetings. There shall be at least nine (9) regular meetings of the Board of Directors annually. The President may call special meetings of the Board of Directors and shall call a special meeting upon the written request of five (5) members of the Board.
- Soc. 6. Quorum. A Majority of the members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum.

ANTICLE VI MINAMETAL ADDITIONATION

- Sec. 1. Fiscal Year. The Fiscal Year of the Loughe of Women Voters of From Wille, Terms, shall commence on the first day of June of each year.
- Any menter who fails to pay her dues within three (3) months after they became payable shall be dropped from the membership relis.

 Those joining during the last three (3) months and paying \$7.50 annual dues will be admitted to full membership and credited with payment of dues for the League year following.
- Sec. 3. Dudret. A Budget for the ensuing year shall be submitted by the Board of Directors to the Annual Heeting for adoption. The budget shall include support for the work of the League as a whele.
- Sec. 4. Indeet Correctee. A Endget Correctee, of at least three (3)

- Sec. 1. Hominating Countities. The Mominating Countities shall consist of five (5) memoers, two of when shall be members of the Board of Directors. The Chairman and two (2) members, who shall not be members of the Board, shall be elected at the Annual Heeting. Nominations for these offices shall be made by the current Heminating Countities. The other members shall be appointed by the Board of Directors immediately following the Annual Heeting. Any vacancy on the Nominating Countities shall be filled by the Board of Directors. Suggestions for nominations for officers and directors may be sent to this Countities by any voting member.
- Sec. 2. Report of the Normating Cornittee and Normations from the Floor. The report of the Normating Cornittee of its normal tions for Chicors, Directors and the members of the succeeding Normating Cornittee shall be presented at the Annual Meeting. Immediately following the presentation of the report, normations may be made from the floor by any voting member, provided the consent of the nominee shall have been secured.
- Sec. 3. Elections. The election shall be by ballot, provided that when there is but one (1) nomines for each office, the Secretary shall be instructed to cast the ballot for every nominee. A majority of these qualified to vote and voting shall constitute an election. Absentee or proxy-voting shall not be permitted.

ARTICLE IX PROGRAM

- Sec. 1. Principles. The governmental principles adopted by the National Convention, and supported by the League as a whole, constitute the authorization for the adoption of Program.
- Sec. 2. Program. The Program of the League of Women Voters of Drownsville, Texas, shall consist of
 - (a)-Aetien-to-protest-the-right-to-veto-of-overy-obtiseny
 - (a) Action to implement the principles of the League of Wemen Voters of

the United States, and

- (b) Those governmental issues chosen for concerted study and action.
- Sec. 3. Program Selection. The Annual Meeting shall select the governmental issues for concerted study and action using the following procedures:
- (a) The Board of Directors shall consider the recommendations sent in by voting members two (2) months prior to the Annual Meeting and shall formulate a proposed Programe

- (b) The proposed Program shall be sent to all members one (1) month before the Annual Meeting. (The printing of the proposed Program in the Bulletin is considered sufficient notice.)
- (c) A majority of voting members present and voting at the Annual Meeting shall be required for adoption of subjects in the proposed Program as presented to the Annual Meeting by the Board of Directors.
- (d) Recommendations for Program submitted by voting members two (2) months prior to the Annual Meeting, but not recommended by the Beard of Directors, may be considered by the Annual Meeting provided that (1) the Annual Meeting shall order consideration by a majority vote and (2) the Annual Meeting shall adopt the item by a two-thirds (2/3) vote.
- (c) Changes in the Program, in case of altered conditions, may be made provided that (1) information concorning the proposed changes is cent to all members at least two (2) weeks prior to a general membership meeting at which the change is to be discussed, and (2) final action by the membership is taken at the succeeding meeting.
- Sec. 4. Member Action. Members may act in the name of the League of Women Voters only when authorized to do so by the proper Board of Directors.
- Sec. 5. Local League Action. The League of Women Votors of Brownsville, Texas, may act only in conformity with, or not contrary to, the position taken by the League of Women Votors of the United States and the League of Women Votors of Texas.

NATIONAL CONVENTION, STATE CONVENTION, AND COUNCIL

- Sec. 1. National Convention. The Board of Directors, at a meeting preceding the date on which the names of delegates must be sent to the National office, shall elect delegates to that Convention in the number alleted the League of Women Voters of Brownsville, Texas, under the provision of the Bylaus of the League of Women Voters of the United States.
- Sec. 2. State Convention. The Board of Directors, at a meeting proceeding the dates on which the names of delegates must be sent to the state office, shall elect delegates to that Convention in accordance with the Bylans of the League of Women Voters of Texas.

BYLANS 7

Sec. 3. State Council. The Board, preceding the date on which the names of the delegates must be sent to the state office, shall elect delegates to that Council in the number alloted the League of Momon Voters of Brownsville, Texas, under the provisions of the Bylaws of the League of Momon Voters of Texas.

ARTICLE XI PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Sec. 1. Parliamentary Authority. The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order Howly Revised shall govern the organization in all cases in which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these Bylaus.

ARTICIE XII BYLAUS

- Sec. 1. Amendments. These Bylaus may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) voto of the voting members of the Annual Heeting, provided the amendments were submitted to the membership in writing at least one (1) month in advance of the meeting.
- Sec. 2. Bylaws Cornittee. A Bylaws Cormittee of at least three (3)

 persons from the general membership and two (2) Loard members shall be appointed by the Board of Directors (at least five-(5))

 Charthe-prior-to-the-Annual-Heeting immediately following the Annual Heeting to discuss possible Bylaws changes for the ensuing year. The Chairman shall be chosen from the general membership. The proposed Bylaw changes shall be sent to all members one (1) month before the Annual Meeting.

The need for international planning was stressed. Each speaker addressed the group and then answered questions and comments from the audience. A lively question and answer discussion ensued.

ADJOURNMENT: The meeting adjourned at 10:00 p.m., although discussions continued for quite some time.

International Planning Needed On Development

Persons involved in long-range planning for orderly development of the Lower Rio Grande Valley should begin thinking of the Browns-viheshiatamoros area as "an international city of Super people," according to Port Director and Brownsville Navigation District general manager Al Cisneros.

"Many of our problems are caused or affected by what goes on on the other side of the river," Cisneros said. "That's the reality we're faced

Willia.

The remarks came during a seminar Tuesday night in the Pan American Bank conference room, sponsored by the Brownsville League of Women Voters and devoted to an exchange of ideas and information relating to the role of planning in a rapidly growing metropolitan and

Cisneros, whose remarks followed brief presentations by Florencio Pena, city director of Flanning and Community Development, and Graciana de Pena, administrative assistant to County Judge Ray Ramon, pointed to a "large gap in the quality of life between Brownsville and Matamoros" as a situation to be dealt with in long-range area planning.

"We have to help them (in Matamoros) raise their standard of living at a faster rate than we

do our own," he said.

In his address, Cisneros touched on the lack of adequate housing, the low levels of personal income locally and the rapid growth of student population in local schools. He pointed out that Matamoros now is experiencing a population growth rate of 6½ percent — double that of Mocico as a whole.

Projected population estimated for Brownsville-Matamoros by the year 2000, Cisneros said, is about 800,000 people — 200,000 on the U.S. side and 600,000 on the Mexican side,

"We're going to need four bridges in town and one at the port," he said. "That's five bridges — we only have 1½."

He noted that seven highway and two railroad bridges now span the Colorado River in Austin, a city whose population approximates that projected for Brownsville in 20 years.

A major consideration in area planning, Cisneros said, is preparation for the arrival here of "big industry." He noted that Brownsville so far has failed to derive any direct benefit from industrial growth at the port in the form of tax revenues. Industries there are not subject to city taxes and pay school taxes only to the Port Isabel School District, since they are located within its boundaries.

Cisneros suggested that petrochemical and other "energy-related" industrial development eventually will extend along the gulf coast from Louisiana to near Yucatan, with Brownsville at the center. "We can't escape that—it's coming."

The need for bi-national planning also was mentioned by city planner Pena, who cited Mexico's emerging petrochemical industry, area population growth and industrial growth at the port as factors to be dealt with in long-range planning.

"We have a large number of competing needs to be met with limited resources," Pena said, explaining that planning basically is the sy tem

whereby the city determines how to apply those resources to best address the needs,

Pena used the Community Development block grant program as an illustration of the planning process. Under that program, federal funds are allocated for approved projects which are conceived and designed with constant input from a 15-member citizens' panel.

In order to adequately plan for meeting future needs, he said, "we are going to need a well-informed citizenry. I can't emphasize that

erough."

Ms. de Pena told the group that the county's new planning department now is engaged in the "development of a comprehensive plan which would integrate all planning functions into one framework." She said the department, which now consists of a planner and an assistant planner, is seeking to determine present conditions in the smaller communities and in rural areas throughout the county. Alterward, the department will be able to "look into programs to alleviate the problems and meet the needs," she said, adding that the county already is at work on a CD grant application of its own.

Although the county has no ordinance-making power as does the city, Ms. de Pena said, it does have some authority in the area of flood control.

Of prime concern to the county planning department, she explained, is the protection of agricultural lands and natural resources.

Other comments came from Public Utilities Board general manager Robert Roundtree, who told the group, "To fail to plan is to plan to fail — and we at PUB are a perfect example of that."

Roundtree spoke of the possibility of grant allocations to establish a de-salinization plant at the port as a means of meeting future water needs.

Regarding electric power, he said it is "extremely unlikely that Brownsville will ever again construct a generating plant unlaterally." He said the "key" to Brownsville's future energy supply, whether it be from coal, gas or nuclear generation, is transmission.

Following a question-and-answer session, League of Women Voters president Betty Bay asked Pena, Cisneros and Ms. de Pena to list what they see as the three "biggest planning problems" confronting Brownsville during the next 10 to 15 years.

Pena listed poverty and its effects, the need for a new international bridge and the

inadequacy of present city ordinances, many of which are outdated.

Ms. de Pena said she viewed inadequate housing, need for public services and the need for more school facilities as the more pressing problems.

Cisneros' list consisted of: transportation, including needs for a bridge and relocation of the railroads; insensitivity of the federal govern-

ment "to our problems;" and the lack of "social conscience" of many people who are making a great deal of money here without making corresponding contributions to the local economy.

Roundtree, when invited to list his top three problems, replied, "Talking to PUB about problems is like talking to Noah about the flood."

A few of the interesting statements made concerning mental retardation in both Mexico and the United States are as follows:

- 1. Of 2,000,000 births in Mexico City, 350,000 die as infants; and 200,000 have permanent and serious birth defects.
- 2. Ninety per cent of Mexicans are dental cripples.
- 3. Ninety per cent of all children in Mexico City between 6 and 14 years of age suffer from serious amoebic dysentery and/or other amoebic disorders.

- 4. From 10% to 30% of the children in underpriviledged areas of the United States are mentally retarded.
- 5. From 1% to 2% of the children in priviledged areas of the United States are mentally retarded.

Mr. Jesse stressed that malnutrition is a major factor in mental retardation.

An interesting question and answer session followed, with both Mr. Jesse and Mr. Kirby taking part. Refreshments were served as questions and answers continued.

Meeting With School Board for file

Mr. Besteiro, Mr. Rodriguez, School Board members; at the end of June a letter containing a list of recommemdations concerning the Special Education programs in the BISD was sent to you from the League of Women Voters of Brownsville. I am here tonight to reiterate the League's position in the hope that our feelings on this subject are clarified for you and the public.

The League of Women Voters is a nonpartisan political organization whose purpose is to encourage citizens to participate actively in government and politics, locally, in their State and at the national level. The League takes stands on issues only after careful study and a consensus of its members.

In October of 1976, the LWV of Brownsville began a study of the physical and psychological care, examinations, and counseling services available to children in the BISD. With the cooperation of Mr. Milton Kirby, Director of Special Education, and supervisors, teachers, therapists, counselors in each department, we were presented with a wealth of information. Some of the presentations surprised and delighted us, while others showed us some of the difficulties met in realizing good quality services for special children. We do not profess to have all the answers. We are not here to chide you. The problems this school board faces, such as procuring State funding, a large school-age population, the legal alien problem and , at times, lack of public support; these have been made most apparent to us.

I would now like to take each area of Special Education that we covered and give our recommendations and a brief explanation where it applies--

I. SPECIAL EDUCATION LAWS

- 1. Recommend that legislation be introduced to fund the building of special education facilities. Public Law 94-142 states
 that every child, no matter his handicap, be given an education
 geared to his needs. The children are numerous, as you know,
 but buildings are too few or inadequate in their design. We
 suggest that you, through your associations with other school
 boards, educators and legislators recommend and lobby for favorable legislation.
- 2. Recommend that all certified teachers in Texas be required to have six hours in special education courses.

 Under flan A, which calls for education of all children in the "least restrictive environment" all teachers need to know how how to deal with these students. The League plans a letterwriting campaign on this matter with letters going out to Mr. Ruben Hinojosa, our area representative to the State School Brd.

II. MENTALLY RETARDED PROGRAM (E.M.R. - T.M.R.)

- 1. Assurance from the local distric that there will be an E.M.R. classroom on every campus that needs it.
- 2. Help in establishing a community sheltered workshop. After spending so much money on these young people from age 3 to 21, it is a waste to send them home to vegetate.

III. LANGUAGE AND/OR LEARNING DISABILITIES (L/LD)

1. Recommend the establishment of one or more self-contained L/LD classrooms for severe L/LD students.

The overall L/LD Program is excellent, but for severe cases More intensive work is needed--one hour a day is not enough.

IV. DEAF EDUCATION

- 1. Remove the program from the third foor of the present building. Because of the ages of the children involved and sometimes their additional physical handicaps, this is self-explanatory.
- 2. Recommend mainstreaming these handicapped students whenever possible.
- 3. Recommend the use of itenerant teachers to help those hardof-hearing students who are on regular campuses.

V. VISUALLY HANDICAPPED

1. Recommend the funding another teacher for this program. This is to insure that future needs will be met.

This program is excellent very adequate.

VI. SPEECH THERAPY

- 1. Recommend purchasing and using speechmobiles to give therapists a better environment to work in.
- 2. Recommend the hiring of more speech therapists. If this is not possible, then we recommend the training and use of speech therapy aides.

VII. COUNSELING

- 1. We support the newly adopted guidance program which will be uniform for the whole district.
- 2. Recommend the use of elementary school counselors. The
 League feels very strongly on this matter as a result from
 a study we did in 1975 on our local law enforcement and
 justice systems. Again and again we heard from thos dealing
 with juvenile offenders that by the ages of 11, 12, or 13 yrs.
 a youngster is too far gone for anything but the most intensive methods of counseling and rehabilitation. Children with
 learning problems often exhibit anti-social behavior. We feel that
 a counseling program in the elem. Schools could help toward prevent.
 VII. PROGRAM FOR THE EMOTIONALLY DISTURBED
 ing much grief laterinlife.
 - 1. Recommend more units be put into operation in the future; and that a program on the secondary level be initiated. The present unit you have is excellent.

IX. GIFTED CHILDREN

1. Recommend the establishment of a program to supplement the education of our very bright children.

Concerning the facilities for the orthopedically handicapped and other health-impaired youngsters, we applaud you for the foresight of implementing such a thorough program in the new Moody Annex facilities: We toured them and were very impressed:

Thank you for allowing us to appear before you this evening. You have the support of the LWV of Brownsville in all special education programs. ARTICLE I

Sec. 1. Name. The Name of this organization shall be the League of Women Voters of Brownsville, Texas. This local League is an integral part of the League of Women Voters of the United States and of the League of Women Voters of Texas.

ARTICLE II PURPOSE AND POLICY

- Sec. 1. Purpose. The Purpose of the League of Women Voters of Brownsville, Texas, shall be to promote political responsibility through informed and active participation of citizens in government.
- Sec. 2. Policy. The League of Women Voters of Brownsville, Texas, may take action on local governmental measures and policies in the public interest in conformity with the Principles of the League of Women Voters of the United States. It shall not support nor oppose any political party nor any candidate.

Article III

Sec. 1. Eligibility. The membership of the League of Women Voters of Brownsville, Texas shall be composed of voting members and associate members. Any person who subscribes to the purpose and policy of the League shall be eligible for membership.

Sec. 2. Types of Membership

(a) Voting members shall be citizens at least 18 years of age (b) Associate members shall be all other members.

AFTICLE IV

Sec. 1. Enumeration and Election of Officers. The officers of the League of Women Voters of Brownsville, Texas, shall be a President and First Vice-President who shall be elected for a term of one year, a Treasurer who shall be elected for a term of two years in odd-numbered years, and a Second Vice-Fresident and Secretary who shall be elected for a term of two years in even-numbered years by the general membership at the Annual Meeting and shall take office immediately.

Sec. 2. The President. The President shall preside at all meetings

- of the organization and of the Board of Directors. She The President may in the absence or disability of the Treasurer sigh or endorse checks, drafts and notes. She The President shall be, ex-officio, a member of all committees except the Nominating Committee. She The President shall have such usual powers of supervision and management as may pertain to the office of President and perform such other duties as may be designated by the Board.
 - Sec. 3. The First Vice-President. The First Vice-President shall serve as administrative vice-president and shall in the event of the absence, disability, or death of the President possess all the powers and perform all the duties of the Presidency.
 - Sec. h. The Second Vide-President. The Second Vice-President shall in the event of the absence, disability, or death of the President and First Vice-President possess all the powers and perform all the duties of the Presidency. In the event that none of these three (3) persons shall be able to serve in this capacity the Board of Directors shall appoint someone to fill the Presidency.
 - Sec. 5. The Secretary. The Secretary shall keep minutes of all

 General Membership meetings of the League and of all meetings

 of the Board of Directors. She The Secretary shall notify all Officers and Directors

 of election. She The Secretary shall sign, with the President, all contracts and

 other instruments when so authorized by the Board and shall perform

 such other duties and functions as may be incident to her the office.

BYLAWS 2A

- Sec. 6. The Treasurer shall collect and receive all moneys due. She The Treasurer shall be the custodian of these moneys,
- shall deposit them in a bank designated by the Board of Directors
 and shall disburse same only upon order of the Board. She The Treasurer shall present statements to the Board at their regular meetings and an annual report to the Annual Meeting. The books of the Treasurer shall be audited annually. The Treasurer shall serve as an ex-officio member of the
- 3 Budget Committee.

ARTICIE V BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- Sec. 1. Number, Manner of Selection and Term of Office. The Board of Directors shall consist of the officers of the League and not less than two nor more than six elected Directors and not less than two nor more than six appointed Directors, the number of appointed Directors shall not exceed the number of elected Directors. One half of the elected Directors shall be elected by the general membership at each Annual Meeting and shall serve for a period of two (2) years, or until their successors have been elected and qualified. The Board shall appoint such additional Directors as they deem necessary to carry on the work of the League. The term of office of the appointed Directors shall be one (1) year and shall expire at the conclusion of the next Annual Meeting.
- Sec. 2. Qualifications. No person shall be elected or appointed or shall continue to serve as an officer or director of the organization unless that person is a voting member of the League of Women

Voters of Brownsville, Texas.

- Sec. 3. Vacanties. Any vacancy occurring in the Board of Directors by reason of the resignation, death, or disqualification of an officer or elected member may be filled, until the next Annual Meeting by a majority vote of the remaining members of the Board of Directors.
- Sec. 4. Powers and Duties. The Board of Directors shall have full charge of the property and business of the organization, with full power and authority to manage and dondutt same, subject to the instructions of the general membership. It shall plan and direct the work necessary to carry out the Program as adopted by the National Convention, the State Convention, and the Annual Meeting. The Board shall create and designate such special committees as it may deem necessary.
- Sec. 5. Meetings. There shall be at least nine (9) regular meetings of the Board of Directors annually. The President may call special meetings of the Board of Directors and shall call a special meeting upon the written request of five (5) members of the Board.
- Sec. 6. Quorum. A Majority of the members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE VI FINANCIAL ADMINISTRATION

- Sec. 1. Fiscal Year. The Fiscal Year of the League of Women Voters of Brownsville, Texas, shall commence on the first day of June of each year.
- Any member who fails to pay ber dues within three (3) months after they become payable shall be dropped from the membership rolls.

 Those joining during the last three (3) months and paying 47.50 annual dues will be admitted to full membership and credited with payment of dues for the League year following.
- Sec. 3. Budget. A Budget for the ensuing year shall be submitted by the Board of Directors to the Annual Meeting for adoption. The budget shall include support for the work of the League as a whole.
- Sec. 4. Budget Committee. A Budget Committee, of at least three (3)

 persons from the general membership and two (2) Board members,

 shall be appointed by the Board of Directors at least five (5) months

 prior to the Annual Meeting to prepare a budget for the ensuing year.

 The Chairman shall be chosen from the general membership. The Treasurer

 shall be an ex-officio member of the Committee. The proposed budget shall

 be sent to all members one (1) month before the Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE VII

- Sec. 1. General Membership Meetings. There shall be at least four (4) meetings of the membership each year. Time and place shall be determined by the Board of Directors.
- Sec. 2. Annual Meeting. An Annual Meeting shall be held between May 1st and May 31st, the exact date to be determined by the Board of Directors. The Annual Meeting shall

(a) Adopt a Local Program for the ensuing year.

(b) Elect officers and directors and members of the nominating committee.

(c) Adopt an adequate budget.
(d) Transact such other business as may properly come before it.

Sec. 3. Quorum. Fifteen (15) percent, or not less than eight (8) members shall constitute a quorum of all meetings of the League of Women Voters of Brownsville, Texas.

ARTICLE VIII NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS
