AFTER RECESS

The Convention met at 9:30 o'clock a.m., pursuant to recess, and was called to order by the Vice-President.

The roll was called and the following were recorded present: 152 Present, 6 Absent-excused, 23 Absent. (Record 1, Appendix)

The Reverend Montie Martin, Diamond Hill Baptist Church, Fort Worth, Texas, offered the invocation as follows:

Holy Father, as humble as I know how, I approach your throne of mercy this morning trusting that each delegate and guest present in this assembly do by faith come asking with me that you forgive every sin of thought and of deed we have committed, confessing that these sins have made us less than we should have been for thee and that they have limited our abilities to function so that confusion, disruption, disunity and selfish concerns have prevailed. Please, Oh God, forgive us and increase our faith in thee and our fellowman that this day and each future day know an even brighter hope.

We joyously give thee thanks, Father, for the promise to us of your holy word wherein is written: (Psalm 1)

Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful.

But his delight is in the law of the Lord; and in his law doth he meditate day and night.

And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper.

The ungodly are not so: but are like the chaff which the wind driveth away.

Therefore the ungodly shall not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous.

For the Lord knoweth the way of the righteous: but the way of the ungodly shall perish.

May your ways be our ways today and may divine wisdom prevail in the minds of these our chosen delegates as they form this badly needed constitution for the State of Texas for a greater liberty and a more perfect unification of its people.

I thank you, Father, for these officials and for the authority you have placed in

their hands over us, the people of this state. May they know expediency of action and a thorough transaction of the business at hand this day. And bless, oh God, their families as they too are making a great sacrifice for us and may those homes that are feeling the difficulty of added pressures at this time look to Thee for their strength.

We ask these things in the name of Jesus, your Son and our only Saviour. Amen.

ARTICLE X ON SECOND READING

The President laid before the Convention as unfinished business Article X, with an amendment pending.

Question: Shall the amendment be adopted?

Delegate Sage moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 90 Yeas, 42 Nays, 6 Present-Not Voting, 43 Not Voting. (Record 2, Appendix)

VOTE RECORDED

Delegate Calhoun, pursuant to Rule IX, Section 2, requested to be recorded as Present-Not Voting on Record Vote 2.

LEAVES OF ABSENCE

Delegate McKnight was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Cobb.

Delegate Lombardino was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Madla.

DELEGATES PRESENT

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Delegates Wolff, Bock, Rodriguez, Gammage, Doyle, Harris of Dallas, Hernandez, Waters, Cobb, Munson, Uher and Bryant who had previously been recorded as "Absent" were announced "Present".

Delegate Schieffer who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" was announced "Present".

Delegate Wilson offered the following amendment to Section 13, Article X:

Amend Subsection (b) of Section 13, Article X, by striking all of Subsection (b) and substituting the following:

(b) No holding company shall acquire control of any lending institution by merger, purchase, or otherwise when the effect of such acquisition will result in such holding company having more than 9% of the total domestic funds on deposit in the State of Texas.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Wilson offered the following substitute for the amendment to Section 13, Article X:

Amend Subsection (b) of Section 13, Article X, by striking all of Subsection (b) and substituting the following:

(b) It is declared to be the policy of this state to prevent the undesirable and undue concentration of control of lending institutions. Acquisition of any lending institution by merger, purchase, or otherwise when the effect of which, in any area of the state, may be to substantially lessen competition or to tend to create a monopoly, or which in any other manner would be in restraint of trade is prohibited.

The substitute for the amendment was read.

Delegate Sage moved to table the substitute for the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 96 Yeas, 55 Nays, 6 Present-Not Voting, 24 Not Voting. (Record 3, Appendix)

PAIRED VOTE

Delegate Hubenak (present), who would vote "Nay", with Delegate McKnight (absent), who would vote "Yea".

VOTE RECORDED

Delegate Calhoun, pursuant to Rule IX, Section 2, requested to be recorded as Present-Not Voting on Record Vote 3.

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Lee who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment, Delegate Sage moved to table

the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 94 Yeas, 56 Nays, 5 Present-Not Voting, 26 Not Voting. (Record 4, Appendix)

VOTE RECORDED

Delegate Calhoun, pursuant to Rule IX, Section 2, requested to be recorded as Present-Not Voting on Record Vote 4.

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegate Nugent who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" was announced "Present".

Delegates Washington and Poiff who had previously been recorded as "Absent" were announced "Present".

Delegate Wilson offered the following amendment to Section 13, Article X:

Amend Section 13, of Article X, by adding a new Subsection to read as follows:

() No foreign corporation, other than national banks of the United States domiciled in Texas, shall be permitted to exercise banking or discounting privileges in this State.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Finney moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table was lost by the following vote: 72 Yeas, 81 Nays, 4 Present-Not Voting, 24 Not Voting. (Record 5, Appendix)

VOTE RECORDED

Delegate Calhoun, pursuant to Rule IX, Section 2 requested to be recorded as Present-Not Voting on Record Vote 5.

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment, shall the amendment be adopted?

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegates Head and Donaldson who had previously been recorded as "Absent" were announced "Present".

Delegate Reynolds offered the following amendment to the amendment:

Amend Wilson amendment, Article X, Section 13 creating a new subsection to read as follows:

() No foreign corporation of the United States shall be permitted to exercise banking or discounting privileges in this State.

The amendment to the amendment was read.

Delegate Wilson moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by a

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non-record vote.

Delegate Poerner offered the following amendment to the amendment:

Amend the Wilson amendment to Section 13 of Article X, by striking the words "domiciled in Texas,".

The amendment to the amendment was read.

Delegate Wilson moved to table the amendment to the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by a non-record vote.

Delegate Finney offered the following amendment to the amendment:

Amend the Wilson amendment to Section 13 of Article X, to read as follows:

() No foreign corporation, other than national banks of the United States, domiciled in Texas, shall be permitted to exercise banking or discounting privileges in this State except in counties having a population exceeding 700,000.

The amendment to the amendment was read.

Delegate Wilson moved to table the amendment to the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 94 Yeas, 57 Nays, 4 Present-Not Voting, 26 Not Voting. (Record 6, Appendix)

VOTE RECORDED

Delegate Calhoun, pursuant to Rule IX, Section 2, requested to be recorded as Present-Not Voting on Record Vote 6.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Delegate Semos was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of illness in family on motion of Delegate Cates.

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment, the amendment was adopted by the following vote: 89 Yeas, 71 Nays, 4 Present-Not Voting, 17 Not Voting. (Record 7, Appendix)

VOTE RECORDED

Delegate Calhoun, pursuant to Rule IX, Section 2, requested to be recorded as Present-Not Voting on Record Vote 7.

Question: Shall Section 13 be adopted?

ARTICLE X ON SECOND READING

The President laid before the Convention as unfinished business Article X.

Question: Shall Section 13 be adopted?

Delegate Poerner offered the following amendment to Section 13, Article X:

Amend Article X, Section 13, to read as follows:

Section 13. BRANCH BANKING; BANK HOLDING COMPANIES. (a) The legislature may pass general laws authorizing the incorporation of corporate bodies with banking and discounting privileges and providing for a system of state supervision, regulation, and control of those bodies which will adequately protect and secure the depositors and creditors of those bodies.

(b) No bank may engage in business in more than one place in Texas which shall be designated in its charter.

(c) Bank holding companies shall be regulated as provided by law.

(d) No foreign corporation, other than the national banks of the United States, domiciled in Texas, shall be permitted to

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exercise banking or discounting privileges in this state.

(e) No corporate body with banking and discount privileges may be chartered until all of the authorized capital stock has been subscribed and paid for in full in cash.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Sage moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 65 Yeas, 59 Nays, 5 Present-Not Voting, 52 Not Voting. (Record 8, Appendix)

VOTE RECORDED

Delegate Calhoun, pursuant to Rule IX, Section 2, requested to be recorded as Present-Not Voting on Record Vote 8.

Question on adoption of Section 13 as amended, Section 13 as amended was adopted by the following vote: 98 Yeas, 32 Nays, 4 Present-Not Voting, 47 Not Voting. (Record 9, Appendix)

VOTE RECORDED

Delegate Calhoun, pursuant to Rule IX, Section 2, requested to be recorded as Present-Not Voting on Record Vote 9.

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Hudson who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

Delegate Koriath explained Section 14 of Article X.

Section 14 was adopted by the following vote: 139 Yeas, 8 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 33 Not Voting. (Record 10, Appendix)

Delegate Longoria explained Section 15 of Article X.

Section 15 was adopted by the following vote: 146 Yeas, 5 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 29 Not Voting. (Record 11, Appendix)

Delegate Longoria explained Section 16 of Article X.

Delegate Kaster offered the following amendment to Section 16, Article X:

Amend General Provisions Committee Report on Article X by striking Section 16 in its entirety and renumbering the subsequent sections accordingly.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Longoria moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by a non-record vote.

Delegate Wallace offered the following amendment to Section 16, Article X:

Amend Article X, Section 16, by striking the section and substituting the following:

The operation of any lottery, gift or parimutuel enterprise or the sale of tickets or other evidences of participation in such an enterprise, whether established or existing in Texas or elsewhere, is hereby declared to be against the public policy of the state and is prohibited. Penalties must be prescribed by law.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Gammage moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 89 Yeas, 73 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 18 Not Voting. (Record 12, Appendix)

Delegate Green of Harris offered the following amendment to Section 16, Article X:

Amend Article X, Section 16, by striking the section and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

(a) The operation of any lottery, gift, or parimutuel enterprise or the sale of tickets or other evidences of participation in such an enterprise, whether established or existing in Texas or elsewhere, is hereby declared to be against the public policy of the state and is prohibited. Penalties must be prescribed by law.

(b) A lottery or gift enterprise may be operated in the form of bingo if conducted by and for the benefit of a nonprofit charitable organization that has been in existence for at least three years and if the entire proceeds are expended in this state for the purposes of the nonprofit charitable organization. Operation of the enterprise must be limited to property owned by the nonprofit organization.

Delegate Longoria moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table was lost by the following vote: 79 Yeas, 79 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 22 Not Voting. (Record 13, Appendix)

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment, shall the amendment be adopted?

Delegate Schwartz offered the following substitute for the amendment to Section 16, Article X:

Amend Article X, Section 16 by striking Section 16 in its entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

Section _____. The Legislature shall pass laws prohibiting the establishment of lotteries and gift enterprises in this State, as well as the sale of tickets in lotteries, gift enterprises or other evasions involving the lottery principle, established or existing in other States, except that such

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prohibition shall not apply to games authorized by legislative enactment and defined as lotteries which are conducted in this State for the benefit of a church, religious society, veteran's organization, or other nonprofit charitable organization when all proceeds are expended in this State for the purposes of the church, religious society, veteran's organization, or other nonprofit charitable organization.

(a) Any such authorized lottery must be operated for the benefit of the organization or charitable purpose and the entire proceeds of the lottery must go to the organization or charitable purpose.

(b) The lottery games permitted must be played on property owned by the operating agency.

The substitute for the amendment was read.

On motion of Delegate Schwartz and by unanimous consent, the substitute for the amendment was withdrawn.

Delegate Hernandez was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of medical appointment on motion of Delegate Denson.

Delegate Leland was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of personal business on motion of Delegate Johnson.

Delegate Schwartz offered the following substitute for the amendment:

Amend Article X, Section 16, by striking Section 16 in its entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

Section _____. The legislature shall pass laws prohibiting the establishment of lotteries and gift enterprises in this state, as well as the sale of tickets in lotteries, gift enterprises or other evasions involving the lottery principle, established or existing in other states, except that such prohibition shall not apply to games authorized by legislative enactment and defined as lotteries which are conducted in this state for the benefit of a religious society, veteran's organization, or other nonprofit charitable organization when all proceeds are expended in this state for the purposes of the religious society, veteran's organization, or other nonprofit charitable organization.

(a) Any such authorized lottery must be operated for the benefit of the organization or charitable purpose and the entire proceeds of the lottery must go to the organization or charitable purpose.

(b) The lottery games permitted must be played on property owned by or under the control of the operating agency.

The substitute for the amendment was read.

Delegate Williamson moved to table the substitute for the amendment.

The motion to table was lost by the following vote: 76 Yeas, 77 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 27 Not Voting.

Delegate Williamson requested a verification of Record 14. The verification was ordered and reflected the following: 78 Nays.

By unanimous consent, verification of the "Yeas" was dispensed with.

The President announced the vote as follows: 75 Yeas, 78 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 27 Not Voting. (Record 14, Appendix)

Question recurring on the adoption of the substitute for the amendment, shall the substitute be adopted?

The substitute for the amendment failed of adoption by the following vote: 74 Yeas, 89 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 17 Not Voting. (Record 15, Appendix)

On motion of Delegate Green of Harris and by unanimous consent, his amendment was withdrawn.

Delegate Caldwell offered the following amendment to Section 16, Article X:

Amend Article X, Section 16 by striking the section and substituting the following:

The operation of any lottery or gift enterprise or the sale of tickets in such an enterprise, whether established or existing in Texas or elsewhere, is against the public policy of the state and is prohibited. Penalties must be prescribed by law

and submitting the following as a separate proposal to the voters of Texas, which, if adopted by a majority of the electors voting on the question, shall amend Article X, Section 16 of the proposed constitution by denoting the section as Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (b) and (c) thereto, or if adopted by a majority of the electors voting on the question and the proposed constitution is not adopted, shall amend Article III, Section 47 of the Constitution of 1876, as amended, by denoting the section as Subsection (a) and by adding Subsections (b) and (c) thereto to read:

(b) A lottery or gift enterprise may be operated in the form of bingo if conducted by and for the benefit of a nonprofit charitable organization that has been in existence for at least three years and if the entire proceeds are expended in this state for the purposes of the nonprofit charitable organization. Operation of the enterprise must be limited to one location as provided by law.

(c) The operation of any parimutuel enterprise or the sale of tickets or other evidences of participation in such an enterprise, whether established or existing in Texas or elsewhere, is hereby declared to be against the public policy of the state and is prohibited. Penalties must be prescribed by law.

The amendment was read.

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Simmons who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

Delegate Poerner moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 96 Yeas, 68 Nays, 0 Present-Not Voting, 16 Not Voting. (Record 16, Appendix)

Question: Shall Section 16 be adopted?

RECORD OF VOTES

Due to the fact that I was off the floor on Record Votes 8 and 9, and could not reach my machine, I would like to vote "Yea" on both of these votes.

BLAKE

I was present and voted "Nay" on Record Vote 14. Due to a malfunction of my machine, my vote was not recorded.

SCOGGINS

I was on the floor and temporarily away from my desk and unable to operate my machine to be shown on the board. Had I been present I would have voted "Yea" on Record Vote 2, "Yea" on Record Vote 3.

VICK

My machine has not been operating correctly. On one vote I advised the Chair, prior to the announcement of the results, that my voting machine was not operating. I later discovered that my machine did not operate the following votes:

Votes 4 and 5 - I would have voted "Nay"
Votes 8 and 9 - I would have voted "Yea"

WEDDINGTON

Due to an early morning appointment, on State business, I missed Record Votes 2, 3 and 4. If I had been present I would have voted "Yea" on votes 2, 3 and 4.

POFF

I was attending to State business on the first record votes of the afternoon, and did not vote. Due to an objection, I want the record to reflect I would have voted "Nay" on Records 12, 13 and 15, and "Yea" on Record 14.

POFF

Because of business in my office, I missed some Record Votes. Had I been able to vote, I would have voted "Yea" on Records 8, 9, 10 and 13 and "Nay" on Record 14.

On motion of Delegates Laney, Aikin and Brooks the Convention at 5:07 o'clock p.m. took recess in memory of Mrs. Milo Cole, mother of The Honorable Criss Cole and The Honorable Meade F. Griffin, Former Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, until 9:30 o'clock a.m. tomorrow.
