

Col Andrew Hampton -

25- Andrew Hampton was the most prominent and probably the wealthiest of the Surryside Hamptons. He appears first in the records of Brunswick County in Sept 29. 1741 when he leased a farm of 150 acres of land from George King.

1743 Andrew Hampton of Brunswick Co Va. sold to Benj. Borden 200 acres of land in Frederick County adjoining land of brother John Hampton of Frederick County -

Between 1743 + 1749 he removed to N.C. as Sept 26 1749 Andrew Hampton purchased 650 a. on S.S. of Pedee River above Beech Creek for £500. "Proclamation Money." He next appears in Granville County later in Tyrone which was abolished in 1784 and Rutherford thereafter formed. ne. R. 1024 p. 308
See Militia Returns - 1754-55. Andrew Hampton was capt. of a company for Gran.

with County Militia of 8th Regt.
May 23, 1757 (V1.853) he petitioned
the N. C. House of Burgesses for pay
for provisions & accommodation
for 160 Indians for 1 day.
Amount allowed for £10..6..8.

Dec 1758 he was app'd Vestryman of
Granville Parish. Granville Co. (V23-491)

26 July 1775 (V10-120-247) at
"a Meeting of the Freeholders of Tyrone
County," Capt Andrew Hampton
was chosen as a Member of the
Committee of Safety; and was
present on 14 Aug. 1775 - when they
protested against "the unprecedent-
ed, barbarous and bloody actions
committed by the British troops
on our American Brethren
near Boston &c. &c." and signed
the same. (V10-163.)

14 Sept-1775 Capt. Andrew Hampton
app'd for "Lead and Gunpowder
and Shells. (V10-247.)

24 Oct 1775 signed petition pro-
testing against imposition of taxes
by Great Britain.

Same year he petitioned that
£25, fine refunded which
fine was for an escaped prisoner
whose surety he stood for.

In 1782. Andrew Hampden was
appt. on a Committee to purchase
50 acres of land for purpose of
building Court House, prison,
stocks &c in the new county of
Rutherford made by the decision

His grandson Jonathan Hampton Jr. told Dr. Lynne & Draper who gives an acct of Col. Andrew Hampton in Keys Mt & Boston. that Col. Andrew was a member of the N. C. Provincial Congress in 1771, also that he was born in England but this evidently is an error. It states that he succeeded to N. C. from Va prior to the birth of his son Jonathan in 1751.

Col. Andrew Hampton is said by his great great granddaughters Mrs. A. B. Scott of Mo. (6 yrs old) to have been Elizabeth Van Hyder of Holland and that they had nineteen children. Col. Hampton named fourteen in his will which was dated July 20 1805 - was probated Oct Court 1805. At this time his sons Adam & Michael, & daughter Catharine were dead, but left heirs. He left his home plantation & ^{residence} in Washington
