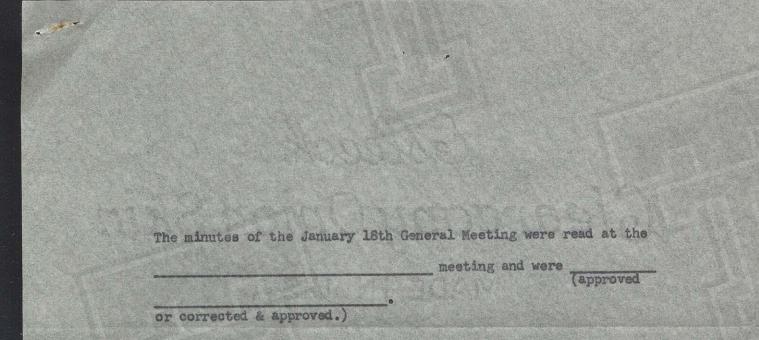

Penn, Local Items Chairman, announced that the City Council now has the League's City Charter revision report and is to appoint a commission to study it. Mrs. Penn reported on a City Council meeting she had sat in on and passed a paper to be signed by persons interested in attending City council, School Board and Commissioners Court as observers.

Mrs. Frank Wiggans presented a resume' of work done on the state level. Mrs. Wiggans asked for persons interested in studying the T. C. R. Tool Kit. Announcements of the television programs October 16 and 23 were made.

Mrs. Domald Richardson, Units Chairman, announced the following unit meetings to be held Monday, October 26: 9:30 a.m. at Mrs. Frank Wiggans, 8:00 p.m. at Mrs. G. H. Stoddard's. The study item will be Water on the national level. The booklets "On The Water Front" and "Little Drops Of Water" were passed out.

Mrs. G. H. Stoddard, Membership Chairman, thanked new members who had done the telephoning for her.

The program was in charge of Mrs. Wm. Y. Penn, who led the discussion on items to be considered as possible recommendation to the state office . The following proposed study items were presented and briefly discussed by Mrs. Penn: legal status of women, family courts, county home rule, jury service, Texas Constitutional revision, and poll tax. Mrs. Penn stated that in adopting two items on state level members should consider reasons for selection, and what could be done with the item. Selections were then asked for.

Mrs. Celeste Clemens moved that the League study jury system. Her reasons were that all prospective jurors shoul know what is expected of them and that a booklet on this would be helpful.(Mrs. Penn had stated earlier that she had been told by lawyers that if the League could write a booklet on jury service on state level the Bar Association would publish it.) The motion was seconded by Mrs. Wiggans who added that we have completed study on jury system and could now come to concensus. Expected to come out of this would be the booklet and action in legislation.

Mrs. Richardson moved that we study T.C.R. Reason for this was that it should not be dropped as so much work had already been done on it.

Mrs. Linehan moved that we discuss abolition of poll tax and ways this could be done. Motion seconded by Mrs. Richardson.

The membership then broke into three groups for buzz sessions. The following reports were given at the conclusion of the buzz sessions:

Group 1 - Jury System - Junia Stoddard reporting - This group agreed that the scope of jury system is limited. Additional resource material would not be needed. Oppertunity to the membership unlimited. Education for jurors and legislation to improve jury system needed. To be presented: "Education on the state level through publication of a pamphlet and other media, and possible legislation regarding jury system."

Group 2 - T. C. R. - Dorothy Penn reporting - Goal to be study of R.C.R. with emphasis on status of women and judiciary. Scope broad. Resource material needed on judiciary. Study needed. Community participation. Would want some legislation for legal status of women. To be presented: "A study of T. C. R. with emphasis on the legal status of women and the judiciary."

Group 3 - Poll Tax - Pat Hambleton reporting - Group agreed much education need. Should be strictly a study item. Much resource material need..Would like study of Texas situation on poll tax in comparision to other states. To be presented: "The abolition of poll tax as a requirement for voting".

A vote was then taken to choose two items to be sent into state. The results were that jury service and T.C.R. were chosen, but a mimority report on poll tax is to be sent in.

Mrs. Linehan reminded members that dues were due and encourraged all members to watch the October 23 television program on jury system.

Meeting adjourned.

The Board meeting of the League of Women Voters was held at the home of Mrs. Katy Linehan on November 2, 1959, at 8:00 p.m.

Mrs. Linehan, President, called the meeting to order.

The following members were present: Mrs. Linehan, Richardson, Wiggans, Whiteley, Whealdon, Stoddard and Waterman.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Mrs. Linehan gave the treasurer's report in the absence of Mrs. Pat Welmaker, Treasurer. A balance of \$940.12 was reported. Bills totaling \$16.51 are due. Bills for a scrapbook and the Voter's Service film were presented by Mrs. Linehan. Mrs. Linehan announced that twenty-one more dues had been paid, bringing our paid membership to a total of seventy-three.

It was suggested to hold payment on the Voter's Service film until the film could be run for approval. Mrs. Florence Whealdon is to arrange for Mr. Craig of KMID-TV to do this.

UNITS REPORT: Mrs. Wilma Richardson, Units chairman, reported that the unit meetings had been fairly successful. She noted that interest in the unit meetings was high among the new members, but that older members had not been attending. It was agreed that the membership should be telephoned before each unit meeting. Tentative plans were discussed for a telephone committee within the units.

The next unit meetings are to be on program planning on the national level. Mrs. Boots Wiggans will organize these meetings along lines similar to the state programming unit meetings. The next unit meetings will be held November 9 - 9:30 a.m. at Mrs. Marjorie Hensley's and 8:00 p.m. at Mrs. Florence Whealdon's.

Mrs. Richardson asked for re-orders on **a**tional items publications to sell at the general meetings. Among those publications suggested for re-order were: "T.C.R.", 50 copies of "World Economic Development", "On The Waterfront", and the booklet just received, "NATO - Hope of The Free World". Mrs. Linehan distributed copies of the NATO booklet to each Board member present.

VOTER'S SERVICE: Mrs. Florence Whealdon, Voter's Service chairman, announced that the pamphlet, "Voter's Key, 1960" had been received. Mrs. Whealdon discussed the information contained in this pamphlet. Means of distribution of this publication was then discussed by Board members. Suggestions included mailing pamphlets to contributors, handing them out to purchasers of poll tax, passing them on to the various oil companies for distribution among their employees, and giving one to each League member. Mrs. Whealdon is to write state for names of companies that the state office has sent information on this pamphlet to. It was also suggested that the study clubs and the school system be contacted in regard to this pamphlet. It was decided that 4,000 copies should be ordered.

It was agreed that the poll tax should be sold in all the main downtown buildings, Walgreen's, Sears, and Food Mart in the Northgate Shopping Center. Members decided that the service clubs and P.T.A. meetings should be excluded this year. Letters are to be sent other clubs and organizations asking for their assistance in the sale of poll tax. It was tentatively decided that poll tax sales be conducted the last two weeks or ten days.

Mrs. Linehan reported that she had suggested to Freddy Nelms that a committee of his people be formed to meet with a League group to help organize a means of educating and informing the colored people on voting procedures. Helpful League material will be given to them.

STATE ITEMS: Mrs. Boots Wiggans, State Items chairman, reported the following items had been chosen to send in to state, and explained why rewording was necessary:

1. "Education on the state level through publication of a pamphlet and other media, and possible lesislation regarding jury system". Mrs. Wiggans pointed out that state had already published a booklet "Do's and Dont's of Jury Service". Working was changed to "The League of Women Voters will work for public education by distribution of pamphlets and through other media, and possible legislation regarding jury system".

2. "A study of T.C.R. with emphasis on the legal status of women and the judiciary". Mrs. Wiggans said that legal status of women is not in the state constitution, therefore "legal status of women" and "judiciary" should be omitted. Wording was changed to: "The League of Women Voters will continue to work for revision of state constitution".

3. "The abolition of poll tax as a requirement for voting". This was changed to: "The League of Women Voters will work for the abolition of poll tax as a requirement for voting", and will be sent in as a minority report.

Mrs. Wiggans is to send a letter with these explaining how these decisions were reached.

#### BOARD MEETING FEBRUARY 8, 1960

The board meeting of the League of Women Voters of Midland, Texas was held February 8, 1960, at 8: 0 p.m. at the home of Mrs. Katy Linehan.

#### GENERAL MEETING

#### APRIL 21, 1960

The League of Women Voters of Midland, Texas held a luncheon and General Meeting at noon, April Elst, at the Midland Country Club. Approximately 60 people attended.

The meeting was called to order by Mrs. Linehan, President.

Brief reports were made by Mrs. Wm. Y. Penn on the progress of the City Charter revision, and by Mrs. Wiggins on the publication of the jury booklet.

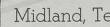

A General Meeting of the League of Women Voters of Midland, Texas, was held Thursday, October 19, 1961, at 11:45 a.m. at Midland Country Club.

Following luncheon, the meeting was called to order by Mrs. C. M. Linehan, President. The minutes of the March General Meeting were read and approved as corrected. The The minutes of the April General Meeting were read and approved. Mrs. Tom Fowler, National Continuing Responsibilities Chairman, spoke briefly on the United Nations, its history and its accomplishments to date. The Pocket Reference on the United Nations (1961-1962), and "The UN At Work" were given to each person present.

Following announcements, Mrs. Frank Wiggins took charge of the meeting on making State Program. The group was divided into five "buzz" groups, each considering one possible program item for twenty minutes. These items were chosen during the three unit meetings held during the first half of the month, previous to this General Meeting, and were as follows: Education, Texas Taxes, Voter Registration, Texas Jury System and Reorganization of State Government. Each group agreed on a wording of its item, and discussed it in the light of League principles and League criteria. Meeting together again, the membership heard a spokesman from each group present the conclusions on each item. In the short time remaining, members were given the opportunity to speak briefly on the item in which they had a particular interest. It was generally agreed that the State Agenda should contain one heavy item and one lighter item. Of the heavy items, Education received 28 votes and Texas Taxes received 26 votes. Of the lighter items, Voter Registration won by a large majority.

#### STATE PROGRAM ITEMS

Mrs. Wiggins, Program Chairman, presented her communication to State Board regarding the State Current Agenda chosen by the Midland League, for the Board's approval. Items are worded as follows: 1. Study of Texas school system in general, emphasizing financing, objectives, standards and quality of the system, program and educators. OR 1. Continued support of Texas Constitutional revision, with a detailed study of taxation. and 2. Support of legislation providing for a permanent Voter Registration system, and continued community education.

#### MEMBERSHIP

Mrs. Stoddard, Membership Chairman, announced that the "co-partner" plan seemed to be working --- that the Chairman is checking by phone with new members to see that they had been contacted. Also, that new committees would be ready. for publication in the December Voter --- for all Chairmen to get their lists of members to her.

#### VOTERS SERVICE

A legislative guide was shown to the Board by Mrs. Anderson, VS Chairman. The possibility of having some printed for local distribution as a public service was viewed favorable by the Board. Mrs. Anderson will get estimates on printing costs, and a place will be made in next year's budget for this. Mrs. Anderson also mentioned a number of possibilities for use of this year's Voter's Key; and stated that Mrs. F. H. McGuigan will be one of the Co-Chairmen for the Poll Tax Drive.

#### PUBLIC RELATIONS

#### BY-LAWS CHANGES

A communication was read from the Dallas League Board, asking our support of the State By-Laws change which they hope to get through the State Convention this spring. After discussion, it was decided that the Midland Board write to the State Board proposing the same By-Laws change, which would change the date of the State Convention from even years to odd numbered years.

After much discussion, Mrs. Wynn MOVED that the Midland Board write to the National Board recommending a National By-Laws change which would delete Continuing Responsibilities from our National Program. Mrs. Murphy SECONDED the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

The Board decided to change the Local By-Laws where necessary to bring them into conformity with the Revised Standard By-Laws for A Local League issued last year by the National office.

Following luncheon, the meeting was called to order by Mrs. C. M. Linchan, President, and announcements were made. Mrs. Wiggins, Program Chairman, took charge of the meeting as the membership proceeded to "make National Program". She stated that the three items to come out of the discussions by the three unit groups were as follows: (1) the economy of the U.S. (2) the U.N. (3) a study of National election laws. The group was divided into three small groups, each taking one of the items for discussion and final wording. In twenty minutes the small groups came together again, and a spokesman from each group gave the final wording of the proposed item and the reasons for its importance. A vote was taken and the membership was almost equally divided on the items (1) A study of the means of furthering a sound United States economy, while still maintaining economic and political freedom; and (2) An evaluation of the United Nations and its present role in our foreign policy, number 1 receiving 32 votes and number 2 receiving 31 votes. The Study of National election laws item received 14 votes. The only Continuing Responsibility the membership desired to be left on the Agenda was the Water item.

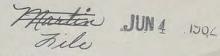

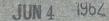

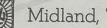

Under Voter's Service, the phrase "when financially possible" has been added to the statement, "The Midland League mails voter's Guides to every eligible voter in Midland County. " Mrs. Koonce MOVED that the LPS be included in the next membership roster. Mrs. Klipfel SECONDED the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

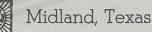

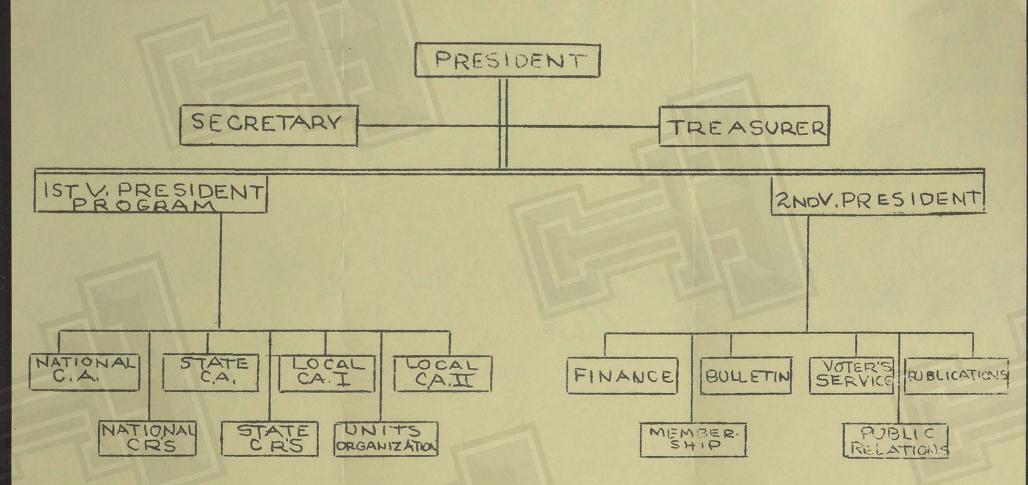

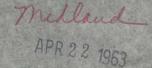

#### ORIENTATION

Mrs. C. M. Linehan, member of the State Board, gave the orientation to the total Board, orientation for the individual members having been held on May 20 and 21.

#### CORRECTIONS

Minutes of the May 7, 1963, meeting were corrected as follows: Under Summer Plans - It was decided to hold only one meeting with our husbands this summer. Mrs. Ramey read a letter from our representative, Ed Foremen, stating that he will be glad to attend a legislative report dinner after Congress adjourns, probably in October.

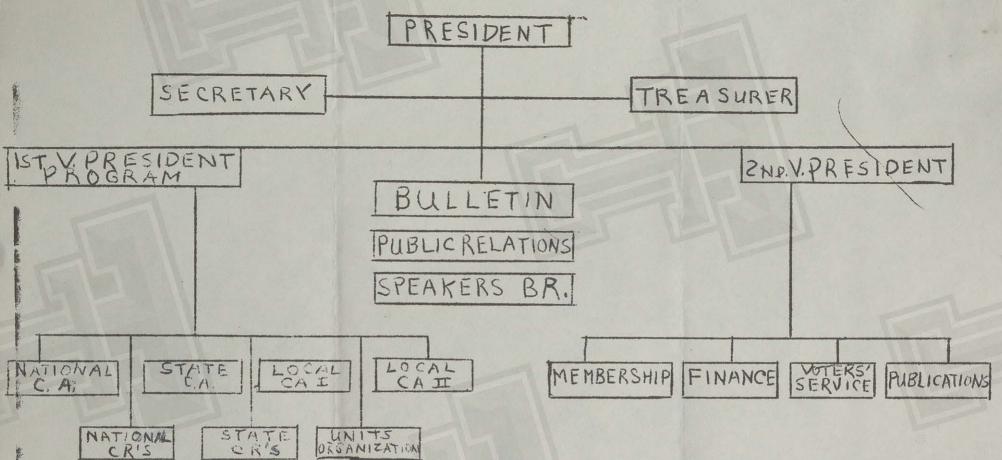

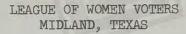

Plans for the state campaign for a Poll Tax Repeal in October before the election in November were discussed.

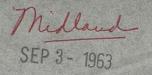

Mrs. Byerley welcomed new Board members to their first regular Board meeting - Mrs. Jess Moore and Mrs. Richard Cummings. The minutes of the July and August Board meetings should state that the Treasurer's report was approved. Minutes were approved as corrected. Mrs. Gross cannot handle the Local Agenda Item (School Survey) as a board job. It was decided to let it be handled as an off-board position. She will continue to receive the minutes and other board information. Mrs. Orwig presented the cash statement, a copy of which is attached. It shows a bank balance of \$2,399.65. Treasurer's report was approved.

#### PUBLICATIONS

Mrs. Walters reported that there are now 71 members on the Subscription Service. There were 49 last year. The first mailing was made last week. It was decided to order 25 copies of the Votor Registration Digest for use during the Poll Tax Repeal drive. "It Makes a Difference" and "Membership Matters" will also be ordered from National.

#### MEMBERSHIP

#### NOMINATIONS

#### CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE

#### FOREIGN ECONOMIC POLICY

# October 29, 1963

A regular Board meeting of the League of Women Voters of Midland was held Tuesday, October 29, 1963, at 900 Bedford. The meeting was called to order by the President, Mrs. L. G. Byerley. Members present were Byerley, Stanley, Linehan, Orwig, Vernor, Pool, Stoddard, Walters, Foster, MacDonald, Coester, Moore, and Cummings.

Minutes of the previous Board meeting were approved as written. The Treasurer's Report was presented. A copy is attached. It shows a cash balance in the bank on October 28 of \$2,448.06. The Treasurer's Report was approved as presented.

#### PUBLICATIONS

Mrs. Coester, publication chairman, REPORTED there are now 80 members of the Publication Service. It was decided to order 175 calendars and sell them for \$1. New Publications catalogs were given to board members. Several copies of "It Makes a Difference" will be used by the Public Relations Committee. A panel of Poll Tax Repeal Committee members will appear on KWEL radio "Party Line" from 11:30 a.m. till noon on November 6. Mrs. Byerley, Mrs. Stanley, and Mrs. Anderson appeared on an interview program on TV October 28 discussing the Poll Tax. Mrs. Walters asked that "Voters" be sent to KCRS and KWEL radio, KMID-TV and the newspaper. She showed some jingles and rhymes that had been written by her committee members. Our public relations advisor for the campaign did not advise using them for radio, but they will be used in the "Voter". She asked that resource committee chairmen call the public relations committee whenever they have a newsworthy item.

#### MEMBERSHIP

## U. N. COMMITTEE

Mrs. Cummings reported that the United Nations Committee had been meeting weekly. They will hold a briefing session for new members on November 14 at 1606 North J to inform them on what was learned by the other members during last year's study. Firs, units on the study will be held November 18, 21 and 25.

#### BY-LAWS

It was decided to recommend that the By-Laws be changed to read "Annual dues of \$6.00 (six dollars) shall be payable April first. This changes the first line of Section 2 under Article VI of the By-Laws. This change will be sent to the state board and presented to the membership at the annual meeting in March. Mrs. Linehan pointed out that there were some recommendations for changes in the National By-Laws on Program which will affect our By-Laws if they are adopted.

Another 1,000 will be given to those who did not receive them in the mail. Women's Democratic Club has been asked to help. 268 Legislative Guides will be sent to contributors.

#### POLL TAX REPEAL

In addition to what was reported under Voter Service and Public Relations, Mrs. Stanley, who is in charge of the Speakers Bureau for the campaign reported that several talks will be made in the next 10 days before Service Clubs. Mrs. C. E. of the Democratic Women's Club is in charge of the bumper stickers distribution. Mrs. Vernor, Chairman, reported that the Midland Committee for Repeal of the Poll Tax consists of 21 business men and civic leaders. The list was given to each Board member and is attached. It is an advisory committee; the league committee is doing the organizing and most of the fund raising. They approved the contents of the flyer to be mailed, out to all eligible voters of Midland County. Over \$600 has been raised; billboard space and paper has been donated for 2 billboards. Advertising for the last week will be arranged this week. Budget cuts will be discussed at the next board meeting. Mrs. Byerley announced that Mrs. C. K. McLaughlin is the chairman of the nominating committee and Mrs. Kem Merren is the third non-Board member.

Of the present CR's, we wish to retain only the item on Nater Resources. For new CR's we suggest: Continued Support of the United Mations system. ### EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING

## January 7, 1964

A regular Board meeting of the League of Women Voters of Midland was held Tuesday, January 7, 1964, at 3206 Sentinel, at 8:00 PM. Present were Stanley, Vernor, Orwig, Stoddard, Walters, Foster, MacDonald, Gross, Coester, and Cummings. Also present was Mrs. H. S. Baird of the Nominating Committee. The meeting was called to order by Mrs. Herbert Stanley, Vice-President. The roll was called and the minutes of the last meeting approved.

#### Board Changes

Mrs. Keith Anderson is again a Board member after an absence of several months. She will handle Voter Service, since Mrs. Fred Pool moved out of town in December. Mrs. Richard Cummings of the National Current Agenda Item I and Mrs. Fred Reid of the National Current Agenda Item II Committees have resigned to take part in political activity.

#### Feb. General Meeting and School Survey

Mrs. Robert Gross reported on the plans for the February General Meeting. It was decided to invite the five coordinators for Curriculum to the luncheon. Questions from the members concerning the school system will be answered by them. Each area of curriculum is being covered by a member of the committee. They feel a workshop such as held last year will be desirable because of the large amount of material. The Local Current Agenda Item will use the two units in February and the two units in March. The wording adopted last March for this item proved to be too broad to cover adequately. The booklets which were published after the school surveys in Lubbock and Dallas were shown. 1000 of the printed booklet would cost \$297.60 and 1000 of those using a photo process would cost \$232.00. Some Leagues in the state have gotten the cost of printing donated. Perhaps the Chamber of Commerce or the PTA City Council should be contacted about the proposed booklet.

### Local Current Agenda

Suggestions for a Local Current Agenda for next year are needed. Some will be given by Mayor Avery and Judge Culver at the General Meeting on Jan. 16. Mrs. Gross suggested that we might have a standing education committee to keep up with new developments. There are several areas of education we could go into in more depth. Perhaps the city government should be studied again.

## Publications

Mrs. Coester reported that all 175 calenders had been sold. She had checked the Jr. Highs and High Schools about the number of social studies teachers and discovered there are 75 of them. Since we could not afford to give that many of the Social Studies Kits, it was decided to use some of the booklets from the League supply and order some kits. Mrs. Coester may use \$35 from the budget and do the best she can with it.

#### Treasurer's Report

Mrs. Orwig reported the bank balance is now \$2132.70. \$26.25 was spent for Voters Keys.

#### Units

Mrs. Foster reported that the turnout for the Monday morning unit was running about 10 at the moment. This seems sufficient to continue it.

#### United Nations Item

Mrs. Cummings read the Consensus which was sent to the National Office in December. Everyone agreed that it seemed to accurately reflect the feeling of the members who participated in the United Nations study.

### Golden Deed Award

Mrs. Stanley read a letter from the Exchange Club of Midland asking for a recommendation for the Golden Deed Award which they give annually to one who has selflessly given of himself or herself for the benefit of the community. It was decided to send a letter nominating Mrs. C. M. Linehan since she has served Midland in many ways besides the League.

## Voters Service

Mrs. Anderson reported that final plans had not been made on how or if we can help in the Poll Tax drive because the Tax Assessor, Mr. Speed, has been ill. El Paso is having a Poll Tax Sunday. Perhaps we will be able to help people fill out their applications but not take money. Mr. Speed has appointed 7 agents to help during January, and as far as we know he will not appoint any more agents. It was suggested that we put up signs in the places where we usually have booths that say "We wish we were here." It is possible that West Texas Office Supply will be able to get the list this year.

### Public Relations

Mrs. Walters reported that Mrs. Anderson will be on Mr. Kruger's program on TV the 15th. A reporter will be at the luncheon and a picture will appear beforehand. A full page of League pictures appeared in the paper last Sunday. Annual report forms were given out.

#### Finance

Mrs. Linehan is at a State Board Meeting, but a letter from her concerning the Finance Drive in February was read. Mrs. Stoddard is co-chairman of the drive. She suggested how each of us might help. Two different contact letters will be used, a new flyer will be enclosed and a return envelope. May use a follow-up letter to eliminate some calls. Also we must appeal to all members for contributions.

A regular Board meeting of the League of Women Voters of Midland was held Tuesday, January 28, 1964, at 900 Bedford, at 8:00 PM. Present were Board members Byerley, Stanley, Linehan, Vernor, Orwig, Stoddard, Anderson, Walters, Coester, and Moore. Also present was Mrs. C. K. McLaughlin, chairman of the Nominating Committee. Meeting was called to order by the President, Mrs. L. G. Byerley. The roll was called and the minutes of the last meeting amended to include "The treasurer's report was accepted as presented." This phrase should also appear in the November minutes. Minutes approved as amended.

## TREASURER'S REPORT AND BUDGET

Mrs. Orwig, Treasurer, reported that the bank balance was now \$2,183.94. A copy of the cash statement is attached. The treasurer's report was accepted as presented. In the absence of Mrs. Merren, Chairman of the Budget Committee, Mrs. Orwig presented the Proposed Budget for April 1, 1964, to April 1, 1965. Other members of the Budget Committee are Mrs. Herbert Orwig, Mrs. R. E. Gross, Mrs. L. G. Byerley, and Mrs. C. M. Linehan. Total budget suggested is \$6,155.00 of which \$4,455.00 is to be raised from non-members. A copy is attached including an explanation of each item. Report accepted after discussion.

#### PUBLICATIONS

Mrs. Coester showed the Social Studies Kits which were ordered for use by teachers. Mrs. Coester and Mrs. Walters will take them to the Coordinator of Social Studies, Mr. Carter. Mrs. Byerley showed the President's Report on national voting elections which she had received.

#### MEMBERSHIP

Mrs. Stoddard stated we had 161 members at present. We have added 49 new members but lost 43, primarily from moving, from last year's membership. She and her committee are working on the card files and the committee lists are complete.

# PUBLIC RELATIONS AND VOTERS' SERVICE

Mrs. Walters reported that they had worked out the publicity plans for February during the Finance drive and she will talk to the newspaper. The YMCA has requested someone to help the Tri-Hi-Y groups with legislative and government talks. Mrs. Anderson may be able to do it. Mrs. Anderson reported that the poll tax payments had fallen off considerably since the Federal Amendment has passed. Statements by the League urging people to pay the Poll Tax so that they can participate in local and state elections will be issued. Questions to be answered for the Voters' Guides for the April elections will be sent to candidates in March. West Texas Office Supply will do the addressographing for \$10 a thousand if the League will obtain the names as we did last year. TV time for candidates to be interviewed will be requested. The "Who Me?" pamphlet on precinct meetings will be used in April meetings. 1000 will be ordered.

#### BOARD MEETINGS

A discussion was held about the possibility or desirability of day-time Board meetings. Most present felt it might be better, but the decision is up to the next Board.

### VOTER & NATIONAL BY-LAWS

The Consensus on Foreign Economic Policy and United Nations will not be included in the Voter because of the postage cost, but will be made available at the units. The best of recent Voters will be selected to be sent for display at the State Convention in March. Mrs. Byerley read the letter which she is sending to the National Office regarding a National By-Laws change. The meeting of Midland Board members and Odessa Board members on this subject was cut short by the events of November 22. We oppose the proposed changes.

### EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING

February 25, 1964

A regular meeting of the Board of the League of Women Voters of Midland was held Tuesday, February 25, 1964, at 900 Bedford, at 8:00 PM. Present were Board members Byerley, Stanley, Linehan, Vernor, Stoddard, Foster, Anderson, and Moore. The meeting was called to order by the President, Mrs. L. G. Byerley. The roll was called and the minutes of the last meeting were approved as written.

## TREASURER'S REPORT AND PUBLICATIONS

Mrs. Orwig, the Treasurer, was ill but her report was read. The bank balance is \$2,170.13. Treasurer's report approved. Mrs. Coester, Publications Chairman, is out of town, but she reported that 15 of the social studies kits have been distributed to teachers. She has had several additional requests for them. There is 80¢ remaining of the \$2 each person paid for the special subscription service. They should receive another mailing before they are asked to pay for next year's. Something may be sent from the supply of material we already have. It will be decided after Mrs. Coester returns. Mrs. Vernor reported that Mr. Wesselman, the principal of DeZavala Elementary School had asked if the League knew of anyone who might be able to teach a citizenship class at Guadalupe Community Center. We will put a notice in the next bulletin. Mrs. Stanley has been talking to a Girl Scout Troop at Austin Junior High on Government. They plan to tour the court house tomorrow.

#### PUBLIC RELATIONS & MEMBERSHIP

Press releases in relation to the State Convention were discussed. A TV interview of candidates will be arranged for April 20th. The possibility of radio interviews was discussed. Mrs. Byerley will write the editor of the Reporter-Telegram thanking him for the editorial on the League. Mrs. Stoddard, Membership Chairman, gave each Board member a list of the committee members. The card file on each member is now finished. It may be taken to the State Convention. There were 104 reservations for the luncheon on February 20th, but only 83 people showed up. There will be a notice in the Voter that members must cancel a reservation if they cannot come. There are 3 new members.

## STATE CONVENTION

A check will be made to see if the facilities for a convention here in 1966 are better than they were last summer when Mrs. Merren surveyed the hotels and motels. If it seems feasible, we will make a bid at Corpus Christi for holding the State Convention here in 1966. Mrs. Stanley showed the letter which was sent to all the Texas Leagues informing them that we will be working for Education as State Item. The letter from Dallas was shown. It will be emphasized that this would be much more interesting to new members than a continuation of State-Local Relations. Lubbock will be contacted for the final arrangements on the bus for transportation. Approximately 10 plan to go at this time. A Briefing will be held for those going to Convention at 3206 Sentinel at 9:30 AM on Monday, March 9.

#### APRIL GENERAL MEETING

There was a discussion of having a night meeting with husbands for the April General Meeting and having some sort of political subject for the program. Candidates for each office appearing may not be feasible because of the large number. A possible public meeting for School Board and City Council candidates was discussed. It was decided that because of the short time until the election and the State Convention, we would just concentrate our efforts on the Guides. Mrs. Linehan, Finance Drive Chairman, reported that she has 30 solicitors. 158 checks have been received so far and \$2241.00. This is about half of the goal. Other approaches, such as an ad in the newspaper and a luncheon with several men to discuss our problem of raising more money to adequately carry out our program, were discussed.

#### NATIONAL PROGRAM MAKING

Mrs. Stanley reported that she had discussed the Recommendation of the National Board of Equality of Opportunity with the Monday unit. She will take it to the other units at their next meetings. These will be evaluated at the March Board meeting.

### LOCAL CURRENT AGENDA WORDING

Mrs. Stanley reported the wording of the Board recommendation on the Local Current Agenda Item for 1964, 1965. A study of Midland's Educational Needs regarding: (1) potential drop-outs with relation to unemployment, delinquency, and welfare, (2) adequate preparation for employment of graduates not attending college. The other suggestions were (1) study of the need of a Domestic Relations Court in Midland County and (2) a Know Your City Survey.

#### WATER STUDY & VOTERS' SERVICE

The water study will be done at the May units. April units will be used for discussion of precinct meetings and a report on the convention. Mrs. Anderson, Voters' Service Chairman, reported that West Texas Office Supply may be able to compile the poll tax list without our help. This would cost \$11 a thousand instead of \$10 a thousand for just the addressographing. Printing on the City Council and School Board Guide would be about \$300. It would cost at least \$900 to mail it to all voters. It was suggested that we not mail this one to everyone. It is more essential to be sure there is enough money to mail out the other two. If this one is not mailed, about 10,000 would be printed. They would be mailed to contributors only and the others perhaps handed out by members.

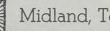
