The PINCHE*, or Red-tailed Monkey.

THE pinelse, though very finall, is larger than either the onilliti or the tamaria. Including head and body, it is about nine inches long, and the length of the tall is, at leaft, eighteen inches. It is rendered remarkable by a kind of finooth white hair upon the top and fides of the head, effectally as this colour is wonderfully contraded by that of the face, which is black, and intersperied with a grey down. The eyes are black, and the tall, from its origin to near the middle, is of a lively red, where it changes to a brownish black, which continues
