The Committee on Rights, Suffrage, Amendments, and Separation of Powers submits herewith its report containing provisions for a new separation of powers article in the Texas Constitution. The proposal is intended to replace in its entirety Article II (Separation of Powers) of the present constitution.

The committee agreed that no attempt should be made in Article II to cure specific problems that have arisen under past interpretations of separation of powers.

This report was adopted after consideration was given to recommendations of the Constitutional Revision Commission, staff memoranda, delegates who submitted proposals, and the many citizens who have contributed to the work of the committee.

During its work the committee utilized the services of the following staff members and advisors: David Garza, Mark Cohen, and John Langdon.

The committee believes this proposal provides an improved constitutional framework for separation of powers in Texas and urges its adoption by the Constitutional Convention.

BE IT PROPOSED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RIGHTS AND SUFFRAGE,

That there be a new article on separation of powers to read as follows:

April 2, 1974

ARTICLE II SEPARATION OF POWERS

Sec. 1. SEPARATION OF POWERS. The powers of the government of the State of Texas are divided into three distinct branches, each of which shall be confided to a separate body of magistracy, to wit: those which are legislative to one, those which are executive to another, and those which are judicial to another; and no person, or collection of persons, being of one of these branches, shall exercise any power properly attached to either of the others, except in instances herein expressly permitted.

ANALYSIS

A. Introduction

The committee's deliberations began with Constitutional Convention Proposal 1 which was identical to the Constitutional Revision Commission's recommendations, which read:

The government of the State of Texas shall be divided into three branches: legislative, executive, and judicial. Except as otherwise authorized by this Constitution, each branch shall exercise the powers appropriate thereto.

The first issue to come before the committee was whether to cure past problems that have arisen from the strict interpretation given to the separation of powers article of the Constitution of 1876. The committee decided that these problems should be cured by changes in the articles relating to the respective branches rather than in Article II. Since this Convention has the opportunity to cure problems that have arisen under the existing provision, the committee felt it was not necessary to change the existing language. This course of action adopts language whose interpretation is well established, while still leaving the option to eliminate problems caused by this language through amendments to the legislative, executive, or judicial articles.

B. ANALYSIS

Section 1. SEPARATION OF POWERS. The powers of the government of the State of Texas are divided into three distinct branches, each of which shall be confided to a separate body of magistracy, to wit: those which are legislative to one, those which are executive to another, and those which are judicial to another; and no person, or collection of persons, being of one of these branches, shall exercise any power properly attached to either of the others, except in instances herein expressly permitted.

COMMENTS

The first motion was to adopt Constitutional Convention Proposal 1. That motion failed to obtain approval on a vote of 6 Yeas, 6 Nays, and 1 Present-Not Voting. A committee substitute for Constitutional Convention Proposal 1 was approved by the committee by a unanimous vote. This substitute carried forward the identical language of Article II (Separation of Powers) from the present constitution with one exception. The other articles of the proposed constitution use the term "branch". Therefore, in order to provide consistent language in the new constitution, the committee proposal uses the word "branch"

wherever the word "department" is used in Article II of the 1876 Constitution. No substantive change in the 1876 constitutional language is intended by this substitution.

The committee approved this proposed new Article II by a vote of 15 Yeas, 3 Nays, and 1 Present-Not Voting.

ARTICLE III ON SECOND READING

The President laid before the Convention on its second reading Article III (full report having been printed on March 26, 1974).

On motion of Delegate Jones of Harris and by unanimous consent, Article III will be considered section by section as provided in Section 10 of Rule XIV.

Delegate Maloney explained the full report on Article III.

Delegate Henderson explained Section 1 of Article III.

Delegate Hollowell offered the following amendment to Article III, Section 1:

Amend Article III, Section 1 by deleting Section 1 and substituting the following:

Section 1. The Legislative Power. The legislative power of the State of Texas is vested in a Senate and a House of Representatives, together styled "The Legislature of Texas".

The amendment was read and was adopted by a non-record vote.

Delegate Poff explained Section 2 of Article III.

Delegate Sherman of Tarrant offered the following amendment to Article III, Section 2:

Amend committee report to Proposal 1, Article III, Section 2 by deleting Section 2 and substituting: "Section 2. COMPOSITION. The Senate consists of 31 members, and the House of Representatives consists of 150 members".

The amendment was read.

Delegate Poff moved to table the amendment.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Delegate Creighton was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Evans.

The motion to table was lost by the following vote: 56 Yeas, 109 Nays, Present-Not Voting, 14 Not Voting. (Record 2, Appendix)

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment, shall the amendment be adopted?

Delegate Wyatt offered the following substitute for the amendment to Article III,

April 2, 1974

Section 2:

Amend the Committee Report by deleting Section 2 thereof and substituting therefor the following:

Section 2. COMPOSITION. The Senate consists of 40 members and the House of Representatives consists of 120 members.

The substitute for the amendment was read.

Delegate Adams of Jasper moved to table the substitute for the amendment.

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Rodriguez who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" was announced "Present".

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 122 Yeas, 47 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 10 Not Voting. (Record 3, Appendix)

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment, shall the amendment be adopted?

Delegate Donaldson offered the following substitute for the amendment to Article III, Section 2:

Amend Article III, Section 2 by striking the section in its entirety and substituting therefor the following:

Section 2. COMPOSITION. The Senate consists of 31 members, and the House of Representatives consists of not less than 93 nor more than 150 members.

The amendment was read.

The amendment failed of adoption by the following vote: 73 Yeas, 95 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 11 Not Voting. (Record 4, Appendix)

Question again recurring on the adoption of the amendment, shall the amendment by Delegate Sherman of Tarrant be adopted?

RECESS

On motion of Delegate Calhoun the Convention at 12:03 o'clock p.m. took recess until 1:30 o'clock p.m. today.

ARTICLE III ON SECOND READING

The President laid before the Convention as unfinished business Article III with an amendment by Delegate Sherman of Tarrant pending.

Question: Shall the amendment by Delegate Sherman of Tarrant be adopted?

The amendment was adopted by the following vote: 88 Yeas, 65 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 26 Not Voting. (Record 5, Appendix)

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegates Parker of Jefferson and Craddick who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" were announced "Present".

Delegate Hudson who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

Delegate Scoggins explained Section 3 of Article III.

Delegate Gammage offered the following amendment to Article III, Section 3:

Amend the Committee Report, Article III, Section 3 by deleting "25" of Subsection (a) and substituting therefor "23", and by deleting "21" of Subsection (b) and substituting therefor "18".

The amendment was read.

Delegate Scoggins moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 85 Yeas, 73 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 21 Not Voting. (Record 6, Appendix)

Delegate Ragsdale offered the following amendment to Article III, Section 3:

April 2, 1974

Amend Article III, Section 3, Subsection (a) by striking the figure "25" and adding in lieu thereof the figure "23".

The amendment was read.

Delegate Geiger moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 101 Yeas, 60 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 18 Not Voting. (Record 7, Appendix)

Delegate Moore offered the following amendment to Article III, Section 3:

Amend Section 3(b) by adding the following at the end:

Each house member shall be appointed by the Senator representing the house district and shall serve at the pleasure of the respective Senator.

On motion of Delegate Moore and by unanimous consent, the amendment was withdrawn.

Delegate Nugent offered the following amendment to Article III, Section 3:

Amend Section 3(a) by adding the following at the end: "Each Senator shall be appointed by the House Members in the Senatorial district and shall serve at the pleasure of the respective House Members".

The amendment was read.

On motion of Delegate Nugent and by unanimous consent, the amendment was withdrawn.

Delegate Pentony offered the following amendment to Article III, Section 3:

Amend Article III, Section 3(b) of the committee report by striking the figure "21" and substituting in lieu thereof the figure "18".

The amendment was read.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Delegate Hubenak was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of illness in family on motion of Delegate Uher.

Delegate Geiger moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 86 Yeas, 70 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 23 Not Voting. (Record 8, Appendix)

Delegate Denton offered the following amendment to Article III, Section 3:

Amend the Legislative Committee Report, Article III, Section 3, Subsection A-B by striking and substituting the following:

(a) A person to be eligible to serve in the legislature must be a qualified voter.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Scoggins moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 99 Yeas, 61 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 19 Not Voting. (Record 9, Appendix)

Delegate Green of Harris offered the following amendment to Article III, Section 3:

Amend Article III, Section 3(b) by adding the words "the primary" between the words "preceding" and "election" on line 15, and after the word "election" the following: "or other procedure for selecting candidates".

The amendment was read.

Delegate Donaldson moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by a non-record vote.

Delegate Davis offered the following amendment to Article III, Section 3:

Amend Committee Report, Article III, Section 3:

In paragraph (a) and paragraph (b) after the word "voter" add the following: "who has not been convicted of a felony, unless pardoned,".

The amendment was read.

Delegate Santiesteban was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Adams of Jasper.

Delegate Scoggins moved to table the amendment.

Amend Committee Report on Legislature, Article III, by striking Subsections (a), (b), (c), and (d) of Section 3 and substituting the following:

(a) A person to be eligible to serve in the senate must be a qualified voter, 25 years of age or older, and immediately preceding election, have been a resident of this state for 5 years ~~and of the senatorial district~~ and of a county which comprises all or a part of the senatorial district for one year.

(b) A person to be eligible to serve in the house must be a qualified voter, 21 years of age or older, and immediately preceding election, have been a resident of this state for two years ~~and of the representative district~~ and of a county which comprises all or a part of the representative district for one year.

Amend Section 3 by striking all of Subsection (c) thereof;

And further amend Section 3 by striking Subsection (d) and substituting the following as Subsection (c):

(c) The office of a member of the legislature becomes vacant if the member changes residence from ~~the district~~ a county comprising all or part of the district from which the member was elected. [unless the change is to comply with subsection (e) of this section].

The amendment was read.

Delegate Donaldson moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 139 Yeas, 18 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 22 Not Voting. (Record 11, Appendix)

(Delegate Bynum in Chair)

Delegate Poff offered the following amendment to Article III, Section 3:

Amend Subsection (e), Section 3, Article III, to read as follows: (e) A member of the legislature may not hold any other office or position of profit or trust under this state, the United States, or any foreign government except as a member of the National Guard, National Guard Reserve, or any of the armed forces reserves of the United States, as a retired member of the armed forces or of the armed forces reserve of the United States, as a public school teacher or a teacher at a public institution of higher education, or as a notary public.

The amendment was read.

(Delegate Harrington in Chair)

Delegate Geiger moved to table the amendment.

(President in Chair)

The motion to table was lost by the following vote: 48 Yeas, 106 Nays, 4 Present-Not Voting, 22 Not Voting. (Record 12, Appendix)

Amend the Poff amendment to Article III, Section 3, Subsection E-F, by striking and substituting the following:

(e) A member of the legislature may not hold any other office or position of profit or trust under this state, the United States, or any foreign government.

The substitute for the amendment was read.

On motion of Delegate Weddington and by unanimous consent, the amendment was withdrawn.

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment by Delegate Poff, shall the amendment be adopted?

Delegate Vale offered the following substitute for the amendment to Article III, Section 3:

Amend Subsection (e), Section 3, Article III, to read as follows:

(e) A member of the legislature may hold any other office or position of profit or trust under this state, the United States or any other subdivision of government.

The substitute for the amendment was read.

On motion of Delegate Vale and by unanimous consent, the amendment was withdrawn.

Delegate Doyle offered the following substitute for the amendment to Article III, Section 3:

Amend the Poff Amendment to Subsection (e), Section 3, Article III, to read as follows:

(e) A member of the legislature may not hold any other office or position of profit or trust under this state, the United States, or any foreign government except as a member of the National Guard, National Guard Reserve, or any of the armed forces reserves of the United States, as a retired member of the armed forces or of the armed forces reserve of United States, as a public school teacher or a teacher at a public institution of higher education, or as a notary public, or any other employee of the state, counties or municipalities of Texas.

The substitute for the amendment was read.

Delegate Poff moved to table the substitute for the amendment.
