 $^{^{1}}$ In tales about the stereotyped Laz as dummer or fool, the male characters usually have one or another of five or six very common Laz names. $^{ ext{Temel}}$ is the name used most often, with in second place. Thus if either of these names occurs in tale, the audience knows at once that it is a Laz tale.

Less frequently used is the name <u>Kemal</u>. It becomes part of the humor of the tale because Laz people do not pronounce the name with standard Turkish pronunciation. They pronounce it <u>Jemal</u>, which in Turkish is spelled <u>Cemal</u>, for in Turkish <u>c</u> is used to represent the English j sound. Thus, before they have heard the name of the beverage spoken, Turks pronounce Coca-Cola as <u>Joja-Jola</u>.
