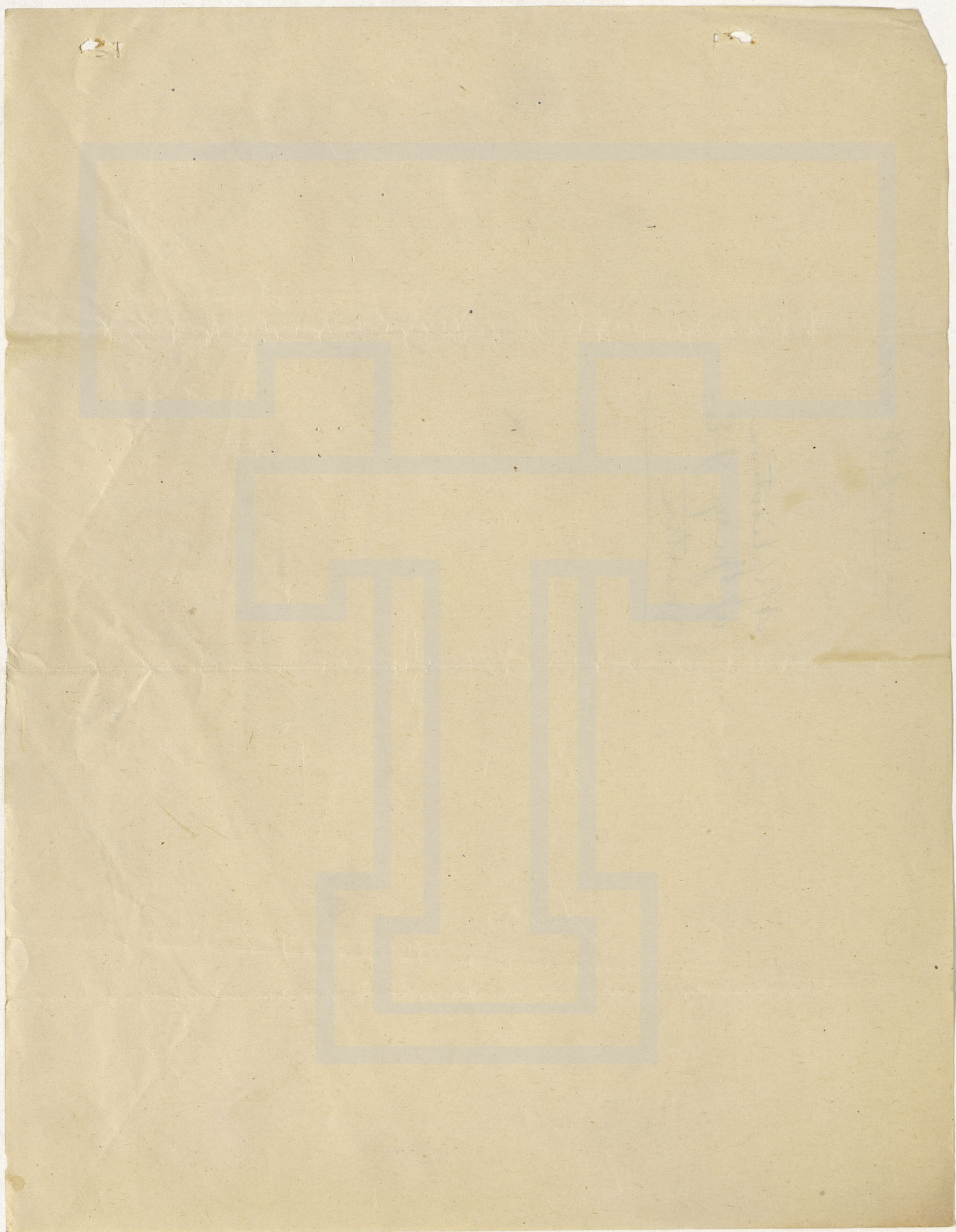

Name John E. Martin, was born in the state of Missouri on the 13
day of July 1846 Came to Texas when I was about 6 yrs of age
Enlisted at Garrisonville Texas on the day of ~~XXXX~~ 1864 in co Sam Pat
ten captain of Bourland's cavalry frontier regiment (see Wooten's Notes
to Yeakum's history of Texas Vol 2 page 641), James Bourland Col. John R
Diamond Lieut Col, Charles L Reff Major) Henry McColloagh's brigade,
and served in that command till

The end of the war after war was in a Texas Ranger Co.
This command was by act of Texas legislature May 24 1864 enrolled as

Confederate forces. See C.C. Cummings
"Texas 'Part in the war between the States" in World's Fair Bohemian p 94.
