

It's the oldest thing I do." Newer, made in Austin, songs like Wake Up, George equally demonstrate his radical, innovative approach, to structure and imagery

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

DON'T TOUCH THAT DIAL Leave It On That Station

I watch TV and listen to my car radio the same way-more hop than listen. I guess I've mostly given up on commercial radio, which sounds like it's programmed by accountants. Seems like every time a new upstart licensee gets my ear with eclectic cuts and Texas musio, they change formats, are bought out or go bankrupt. KGSR came to Austin with Yuppie, New Age jazzy fluff, so never even got into my car rotation. But it was the station of choice at an office where I spent a lot of time and I began to notice occasional tracks from Paul Simon, Tracy Chapman, Michele Shocked, Eliza Gilkyson, and good, but rarely aired, cuts from other artists of merit. So, onto my car selector they went. Now, with radio pros like Jody Denburg, Skye and Kevin Connor on board, I stay on their part of the dial longer and longer, hearing new Austin artists on Jody's Daily Demo, while local heroes and up-and-comers get significant air time along with an intriguing array of talent from diverse sources. Mixed in are Cecelia Nasti's delightfully practical and informative ecology spots. Though initiative and support come from both parent company and local management, some fear Star 107.1 has too narrow an audience; I prefer to not underestimate Austin's radio public and advertisers. Any case, I hope they continue and persevere. Music City deserves a station that reflects who we really are—whoever that is.EM

· Having some experience of slo-mo live television tapings, which give new meaning to the word tedium, John and Sly elected to watch the debut of the Outlaw Music Channel over at Belle's South Austin duplex, in the luxury of her naugahyde Bubbaloungers (like Barcaloungers but with built-in cooler, ashtray and remote). Turned out to be a wise decision. • MCT has been eloquent, indeed effusive, in its devotion to Austin music and merciless in critiquing that other place, but, say what you will about Austin vs Nashville musical talent and diversity, what was uncomfortably obvious in the twin-headed premiere concert were embarrassingly poor production values and lack of professionalism (especially the intros) at the Texas end. This despite Valiant Efforts by KLRU pros and the film crew for the Dallas Cowboys (which may explain a lot).

• Not that the Nashvillains were notably creative or innovative or had more talent or liveliness, but they were slick. Austin's love of live performance and casual interactions were painful when translated to TV—and they don't have to be. As evidence check out Dixie's Bar & Bus Stop tapes. This felt like a bunch of buddies getting together to make an access

show.

· And we were so excited about the concept. What we'd heard about the vision of the Outlaw Channel sounded like a dream come true for Austin's music community, and, if anyone could pull it off, it was Willie, through sheer personal force. But if it's to get beyond our own backyard, it going to have to actualize the potential, as they say, a whole lot better.

• The array of talent was impressive enoughveterans like Ray Price and Little Joe y La Familia, local legends like Joe Ely and up-andcomers Kimmie Rhodes and Jimmy LaFave. Ely showed more video savvy than most and the old timers were pretty cool, though even Festival: A 20 Year Celebration, whose Little Joe came a cropper, a call and response flopped like a trout—the audience wasn't miked! It may have been great at the Opera House, but sounded terrible, and looked silly, in Belle's rec room. LaFave may have grabbed the live audience, but his charm and intensity were diffused by distancing camera work.

· When Susie Nelson tiptoed into a Dylan revision that would have bombed at an Open Mike, Sly cracked up, John had to change channels, Belle had to leave the room. Family is family, but this would have been a perfect time to cut to Nashville or an interview or something. Anything. Live, this would signal potty break, buy a beer and go visiting, on TV you just lost the audience.

· MCT, and lots of other folk want the Outlaw Channel to work. The talent, imagination and vision are here to do it; let's just hope we see ongoing big improvements.

has just been nominated for an award (thank you, thank you), but while the Dallas Times-Herald found space to mention it, not a word here. He sure is proud to call Austin home.

• John's scoop for the month concerns that weird thing at Mueller airport. According to his sources, hand-written instructions to install a display drawing attention to Austin's leading artform were misread as ant farm. Embarrassed officials refused comment, but this certainly makes more sense than the official cover-up.

• Shoulders fans will be glad to hear of the forthcoming Michael Slattery Exercise Video, a program of vigorous workouts to the band's music. The DeLuxe edition will include a Parade drum, but the budget conscious can make do with a stout cardboard box.

• At the NARAS pre-Grammy reception, John was startled to see his old buddy Steve Hudson stepping up to receive an award for all kindsa behind the scenes moving and shaking. And here he thought Steve was just another of those sensitive singing-songwriting lawyers.

 John reads that it was a terrible tragedy that the Austin Music Commission's annual public forum should conflict with the Grammy Awards Show. Huh? John can think of things he's rather not do than watch the Grammys, but most of them involve broken glass.

• Best Specific Idea at the AMC talkathon was the Lillian Standfield-inspired suggestion to putup Austin-Music Capital Of Texas signs at the city limits. Course, John feels that Music City Texas has a nice ring to it, but whatever, there's no time to waste. Hard to believe, but apparently they're planning something similar in (wait for it) San Antonio.

• An insufficiently paranoid computer user himself, John feels the utmost compassion for Larry Willoughby, author of Kerrville Folk finished work went out the window along with thieves who stole the printer's computers and any handy disks. Scheduled for release during the Kerrville On The Road tour, with a Lubbock Or Leave It party in Austin, it's now hoped to have it out for the Festival itself.

HOW TO READ MUSIC

Raised in the more earthy European school of music journalism, where putting the boot in has been raised to a fine art, and if artists and record companies don't like it tough shit, John has always been bemused by the American or Blow Job approach. But through assiduous reading of such bromides as Rolling Stone, he has begun to crack the codes that his Stateside confreres use to conceal their true feelings. Of course, it goes without saying that in MCT we mean exactly what we say (more or less).

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SHOULDERS LOVE IS MY CRIME

(Dark Alley, cassette)

Shoulders took, and deserved to take, the #1 Avant-Garde and Unclassifiable slots in the MC Insiders' Poll, but I can't say I voted for them myself. I see they've got something, lots of it, in their semi-acoustic punk folk-rock (Unclassifiable, OK?) and admire them on many levels. I just find a little of it goes a long way, though a fanatical following clearly thinks very differently. Having said that, I'm not sure I don't prefer the all-out full frontal lunacy of their stage show to this relatively throttled back live-in-the-studio recording, JD Foster at the controls, John Hagen (cello) and Lisa Mednick (accordion, sax) in attendance. Michael Slattery, the band's essential force, has so much energy and stage presence that his deficiencies as a singer become actual strengths on stage, an inherent part of the band's presentation. The kind of holy lunatic that Ireland seems, apparently, to be able to produce even in exile, Slattery has moments of twisted genius as a songwriter, Executioner's Daughter, Old Country and The Weatherman making the point most clearly here, and can imbue quite nonsensical lyrics with meaning and menace. Definitely unique, Shoulders are acquired taste, but seemingly addictive to some.

KATHY & THE KILOWATTS EXCEPTION TO THE RULE

(Lectro-Fine, cassette)

Austin rock is in constant flux, folkies welcome newcomers with open arms, but blues and r&b often seem locked in stasis, a rigid pecking order based more on past glories than current achievement, feet planted firmly in the faces of those on lower rungs of the ladder. Kathy Murray's perpetual Lady-In-Waiting status has been due in part to a succession of piss-poor backing musicians, but, while the current Kilowatts are far and away her best unit yet, particularly with the addition of Dan Torosian on sax, apart from her husband Bill Arthur Jones on dirty guitar, they're not the players on this 10 track tape. Floyd Domino piano, Keith Ferguson bass, Fred Krc rubboard, Paul Orta harmonica, Tom Braxton sax and Bill Averbach trumpet join a now departed rhythm section, and, not unexpectedly, provide a tight, concentrated rolling thunder behind the power and subtly rasping edge of Murray's always remarkable voice. You'd need to be a walking r&b encyclopedia to pick out her five originals with any confidence. If she can consistently reproduce this kind of quality on stage, the Leopard Woman may yet break the quota on Austin blues queens. JC

MICHAEL HARDIE & THE TEXAS ALL-STAR BLUES BAND HOUSTON BLUES

(Punch, cassette)

The obvious thing about this tape is that the title says it all. "All-Star" about covers bluesmasters Derek O'Brien, low profile lead guitar genius of The Antones, Lightnin Hopkins' cousin Milton Hopkins, former Little Richard and BB King sideman, on rhythm guitar, Silent Partners bassman Russell Jackson, and harmonica wizard Gary Primich, plus Hardie's Channel rat cousin, drum monster Freddie 'Steady' Krc and co-producer Ned Albright keyboarding. That is one hot, hot line-up, and not wasted on Hardie's vigorous Gulf Coast dancehall blues. Eight soulful songs written or co-written by Hardie, plus a knockout walking blues cover of the Bobby Blue number There Ain't Nothin' You Can Do and a blues shuffle version of Krc's Dat Crawfish, are delivered straight from the shoulder, with mature strength and zero histrionics, providing authentic East Texas blues frameworks for the band to exercise individual and collective talents. From the O'Brien led intro to Walkin' Seperate Paths, you know you're in good hands—then you get the bonus of Hardie's blues power.

INGRID KARKLINS WILLOWBUSH

(Willow, cassette)

If any Austin poll had a Most Demanding category, Karklins should storm it. Certainly based in the wrong town, probably the wrong state and possibly the wrong continent, for any substantial appreciation of cutting edge experimentalism that makes most of what Austin thinks of as avant-garde sound Top 20, her work occasionally recalls Philip Glass, only more intellectually rigorous; the menacing Crack The Slab could be the theme to a Parental Approval version of Koyaanisqati. As on 1989's Kas Dimd, much admired in Europe, the ex-Grimalkin uses folk songs from her Latvian heritage as linguistic instrumentation, along with an authentic piobaireachd (Celtic mouth music) piece, supported by members of Stick People, including percussionist Thor 'Different Drummer' Harris. From the sparse and thoughtful Es Apkalu Ozolinu/Oceans Apart, Karklins on vocals and kokle (Latvian lap harp) accompanied by two fretless basses, to the dense solo (vocals, kokles, violins, keyboard, rebec, whistle) showpiece Visas Manas Sikas Dziesmas and the vivid all hands on deck wealth, depth and urgency of Metenitis, she carves out an abstruse and challenging territory on the edge of the known world. BUTCH HANCOCK No 2 ALIKE #7

(Rainlight, cassette)

Seven cuts mark this marathon midpoint, continuing with Richard Bowden's fiddle and Spider Johnson's saw. A schizophrenic viewpoint, I Love You Cause You Never Compromise, leads out, followed by a tribute to those who live 'in the now', Motivated By The Moments Of The Day, with shimmering saw accents. Note the prophetic Middle Eastern imagery on Yella Rose. Leo & Leona, a tender, touching love ballad about a man with "a mouthful of bad teeth" and a woman with a pet rock and pigs named Slander & Libel, is an exceptional appreciation of romance in the common place and imperfect, one of Hancock's best qualities. Diamond Hill, title song of the late-70s LP, a cautionary tale to Yuppies, "scruples is scruples, but a steal is a steal," illustrates his technique of changing the chorus slightly each time to emphasise and further the verses. Butch sets off a spate of saw puns: band saw, the jig is up, cut it out. A new approach to the myriad of Texans' hard-highway drivin' tunes, Ain't No Mercy On The Highway, is followed by The Day My Ol' Donkey Diedan original that sounds like an old mountain standard. 1990 KERRVILLE FOLK FESTIVAL

(Kerrville Music Foundation, cassette) Slicing 86 minutes of music out of the three week long Folkathon must be a daunting task and few people are likely to go along with every one of the 22 tracks. Personally, I could live without . . . well, never mind. At the same time, there are things you'll groove on big time, for me Celtic Elvis' good time acoustic Good Lovin', definitive and totally delightful Kerrville silliness, Rosie Flores' stylish Out Of Tune and Marcia Ball's magisterial Under Love's Spell. Taken just as a sampler, this wide-ranging selection lets you check, or double-check, on a whole mess of different acts, from the fairly well-known such as Ball (whose picture graces the wrap), Flores, Brave Combo, Tish Hinojosa, Peter Rowan, David Wilcox, Danger In The Air, Sundogs, Janie Frickie (this is not a joke) and Horse Flies, to the relatively, if not utterly, obscure such as Poi Dog Pondering (this is a joke). Seen as a Battle Of The Sexes, Caryl P Weiss, Cheryl Wheeler, Patty Larkin, Melissa Javors and Tish leave the men reeling on one side, on the other, the poor bastards are up against Flores and Ball. Some warm memories revitalized, several names on the check 'em out list, a couple on the avoid at all costs list. Works

STEVE YOUNG SOLO/LIVE

(Watermelon, cassette/CD)

roots is to follow some tough acts; Waylon Jennings, who made Young's Lonesome Orn'ry & Mean his anthem ("the Bob Dylan of country"), Townes Van Zandt ("a spiritual hero of mine") and Nick Tosches ("one of the only performers I'd pay money to see"—music journalism's highest accolade). Recorded live at Houston's Anderson Fair, 13 tracks, leaning hard on Young's mid/late 70s songwriting heyday, recap a nine album career that's taken in majors (A&M, Reprise, RCA), top indies (Rounder, Demon), fly by nights and home brew. But while there's little here that Young hasn't cut before, from powerful originals like White Trash Song, Seven Bridges Road, Long Way To Hollywood and, a personal favorite, Montgomery In The Rain, to interpretations of Don't Think Twice and Drift Away, acoustic presentation gives them a different impact and immediacy. The big, mournful, slurring voice may be familiar from earlier work, but, unless you've already heard him solo/live, his powerful, attacking guitar work will come as a surprise. Young's hard-edged melancholy makes him sound more like Hank Williams' son than Hank Williams' son does. JC

MICHAEL ELWOOD SCARECROW'S PRAYER

(Agua Azul, CD/cassette)

as, for want of a better word, a 'folk' singersongwriter, whose live sets with Beth Galiger are intense in content, relaxed in execution. Here, eleven of his thoughtful, literate, introspective songs have been packaged as Adult Contemporary, with full-scale production by Crow Johnson & David Newburger, and the contrast takes some getting used to. The basic tracks were cut live with Elwood and his guitar and then over-dubbed, so the core of his work retains its pristine integrity, but while some subsequent embellishments are quite brilliantly successful, John Inmon's guitar of One Too Many Questions, Dave Moore's accordion on Wizard Of Loneliness, East Side Flash's piano on Big City Break Up, others are less so. Drug On Wars, Elwood's best known song, is soured by an incredibly fussy and intrusive John Mills flute solo, and some of the three part harmonies are a little unfortunate. Who Am I To Say, just with Galiger on flute and harmony vocals and John Hagen on cello, signposts a different approach, closer to the quietly commanding power that Elwood, with Galiger's spare, empathetic support, exerts on stage. Great stuff, but less might have been more JC

BEAVER NELSON TALKING ALL NIGHT

(independent cassette)

To talk about the great exponent of Southern Problem here is that I've long admired Elwood The third offering from this year's young un' (not yet 20) reworks 3 cuts from 1990's One Fret Too Low and adds 6 more originals. The opener, I Hope No One Sees Me Smiling, balances youthful poses of alienation with infatuation's joy. The Dylanesque Does Anybody Miss Me? and You Weren't Listening continue the pop-ish vein. A folky Hair Of Brown reprised from Fret, again uses Cari Harris' harmonies to best advantage. Restless (another repeat) brings to mind the best of Mellancamp and I'll Still Be Around leans even more to the country side. Love in the Suburbs (Talking All Night) brings a more urban frame of mind, a sort of Joni Mitchell headset. You Can Cry On Me would be one of the best of this, and the previous release, if not so obviously inspired by Will T. Massey, Nelson's former camp counselor. Talking continues Beaver's progress as a songwriter, moving more toward pop and folk than country or western-he's after all from East Texas-and shows the influence of Austin's songsters on his craft. He sounds a lot more like Jimmy LaFave than Will T these days. At any age, Nelson would be exceptional, so we can expect even better in the future. 'Til then, this more than suffices.

NEW ROSE-

CALVIN RUSSELL A CRACK IN TIME

(New Rose import, all formats)

Huckleberry Finn could have been reviewing Calvin Russell when he remarked, "the statements was interesting but tough." When you use expressions like "hard-edged" round singer-songwriters, Russell, compared by one French writer to Crocodile Dundee, is your benchmark. Songs like Living At The End Of A Gun and ("I was born") Behind The 8 Ball ("headed for a sure fall, can't seem to care at all, for nothin") tell you that here's a man who goes out to the edge, looks down into the abyss and gives it the finger. Even the two cutthroat covers on his smash-hit-in-Europe album are from hard-driving buddies Blaze Foley (I Should Have Been Home) and Townes Van (Nothin'). Russell's harsh, uncompromising vocals, backed by Gary Craft on sweet and sour guitar and the monster fraternal rhythm section of Leland Waddell drums and David Waddell bass, with contributions by Tomas Ramirez sax and Jimmy Day steel, Joe Gracey producing, punch out ripped and sweaty black muscle shirt music that makes Heavy Metal sound like New Age. I'drave on, but, as Russell says, "I ain't lookin' for approval. I can do so well without it." JC

LEROI BROTHERS RHYTHM AND BOOZE

(New Rose import, LP/CD)

Breathes there a man with soul so dead that never to himself has said, I gotta go hear the LeRois? Or woman, come to that. For close on a decade (the band celebrates its 10th anniversary on March 30th), the Brothers have been the definitive voice of Texas rock & roll, a raunchy, dance floor filling steamroller. Driven, in their most durable line-up, by the punchy, implacable, no frills drums of Mike Buck and Speedy Sparks on bass (Texas Tornado demands had Bad Liver Mark Rubin deping on three tracks, producer Charlie Sexton on a fourth), the cutting edge behind Steve Doerr's casual, conversational vocals is the Scotty Moore sound and power of Rick 'Casper' Rawls' guitar. Early rock & roll, rockabilly that had mutated away from, without losing, its minimalist force and primal energy, was pruned and polled for mass consumption but, like Old Man Underground, it never dies. Reincarnated in the LeRois, immortalized by New Rose for the second time, following 1990's Viva LeRoi!, rockabilly is alive and flourishing. One complaint, though; seven tracks (all authentically earthy powerhouse originals), just whet the appetite! Encore! Encore!

Two Hoots & A Holler No Man's Land

(New Rose import, all formats)

Forget New Sincerity-stand back for a blast of seductively twisted thrash punk roots rockabilly! In two days, Ricky Broussard, Vic Gerard, (bass/bkg vocals) and Chris Staples (sticks), with legendary Texan sidemen 'Casper' Rawls and Johnny X, captured 11 originals with outstanding results for a selfproduced debut, crowned by fab Roberta St Paul sleeve art. Broussard melds multiple writing influences and his own uniquely recognizable vocal and guitar tones into powerful statements. The opening cut, Step Fast, metaphorically rich, "You can make a lot of plans but you don't know what's in store and there is no fakin' it on the big dance floor", sure ain't Nashville. With his Orbison-like vocals over a Clash-like intro on Love Me or the double whammy of the Hollyesque Carry On, the boy packs a punch. In The Middle Of The Night is a straight up love lament embellished with growls, yodels and harp-go figure! The inner landscapes of No Love Have I, Swan Song, and I Could Forgive You raise goosebumps to an irresistable beat. Not only witty, 50 Miles Away has a Bloomfield/Cooper feel. As close to the gut as you can get, he's a Texas Twister. SLY

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


