My Company in which I was enlisted were ordered to Mobile and were put in with the 63d Ala. infantry, shortly after we went into camp on the Shell road near Dog river. Soon after that we were ordered to Fort Gaines. I was at that time on detail duty, had charge of a Squad of eight boys guarding Government supplies when the Company left and was relieved in a few days and was ordered to report to our regiment. We were on board the Confederate Steamer "Dick Key" on our way to Fort Gaines when the Fort surrendered and were chased back inside the bar at Mobile by one of the blockading Squadron. We then reported to head quarters and were assigned to different posts around Mobile. I was ordered to report to the

Commander of Battery "E" on the Bay
Guarding the entrance to the bar
and served there for about 3 weeks
when I was ordered to report at redoubt
No 10 on the Spring Hill road, where
I was assigned to Co "H" 1st Regiment
Alabama Reserves, and served with them
around Mobile, Blakely and Spanish
Fort until the Spring of 1865.

When we were captured near Blakely
by Federal Gen. A. J. Smith's Command
I was paroled immediately by Bevel
Brigadier General Christler on account
of my age.

the Confederate army I am permitted
to refer to J. H. Boggs, J. L.
Bentley and Raleigh Watkins
of this Lee Camp
