In a word, the Texas boys got what they wanted, and it was served with all the frills. The affair took the form of a nine course dinner, and it is agreed by all present that every course was a dream.

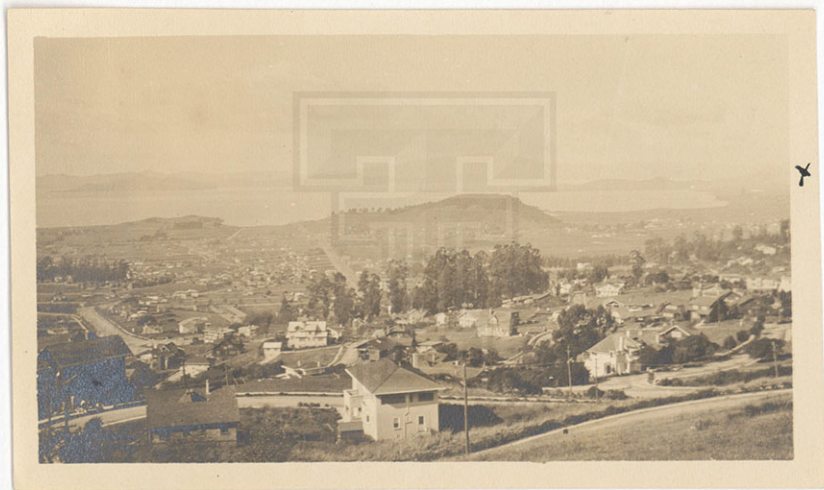

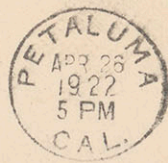
April 26 - 1922

Dear Sister:


Received your letter a few days ago and am certainly glad to know that you are figuring on making us a visit.
