It becomes the sad duty of the undersigned committee to record the death of our late comrade Noah Harding which occurred at Houston Texas while on a visit on April 14 1914 in the 70th year of his age.

comrade Harding enlisted early in the war of the states in the 3rd Kentucky cavalry and followed the fortunes of Morgan till the end of the war. Though but a youth he made a gallant and efficient soldier and came out with honors as having done his duty faithfully in defense of his native state Kentucky.

He first engaged in mercantile business at Paris Tennessee but in the early 80's came to Fort Worth and began first as cashier of the bank of Tinsall Vanzant & co and when this institution joined the national banking system, he rose by degrees to the high position as its vice president which position he held with distinguished success till his death.

Comrade Harding did great service as a church officer and contributed freely of the great wealth which he was so fortunate as to accumulate to the advancement of the kingdom of the Master of which he was ever an humble and unpretentious follower. Resolved that in the death of our comrade, society has lost one of its most valuable and useful citizens. His family is bereft of a devoted husband and father and this camp has lost one of its most liberal and respected members.

Resolved further that we extend to the survivors of his afflicted family our sincere condolence and sympathy.
