3. Daycare coordinator of two daycare centers providing services to children ages 0 to 6 age level.



4. Supervising eight staff members working full time with Summer Youth Program and they in turn, supervising 125 young people ages 13 to 21, working as youth recreational leaders for program providing recreational and nutritional services to approximately 600 children ages 6 to 12.
  5. Procurement of contract between LEFT and the United States Department of Agriculture for providing nutritional services for low income children during summer. Total funding \$20,000 providing 17,000 meals plus 24,000 between meal supplements.
  6. Procurement of funds from Presbyterian Churches for Summer Youth Program. Total amount funded \$6,848.
  7. Financial management and overseeing fo all monies acquired for the summer youth program.
- C. Supportive Services Specialist employed by Llano Estacado Farmworkers de Tejas. Duties and/or responsibilities of this position were as follows:
1. Attain and provide supportive services for migrant and seasonal farmworkers in the South Plains area.

  8. Developed working relationships with training facilities, community organizations or ther human-services agencies.
  9. Establish and maintain working relationships between SPAG and private enterprises.
  10. Placement and counseling fo low income individuals in On-the-Job training positions.
