

When Mr. Wm Hampton died his second wife got all of the personal property, which included a silver tea service and a lot of silver spoons purchased by the 1st. Wm. Hampton with money received from her father's estate.

Rev. John W. Hampton, attorney, minister. Student at Curry & Henry, Va at beginning of Civil War, entered 8 Va. Cavalry C.S.A. served about 18 mos then transferred to Gen Wm E Jackson's Light Horse artillery, where he served till the close of the war.

He was wounded July 3, 1863 at North Mountain Depot on the VBO, about 8 miles west of Martinsburg Va. staid for a long time at house of an Dr Buckles till well.

Was in battle of Gettysburg & other big fights.

Dr Wade Hampton Barnett.
has an extensive practice & lives in the country about six miles from Frankfort, Tenn. (1901) He is married with children - will allow 1910.

he was born in Va.

Mr. William Hampton, son of Wm
 & Malinda Shortridge Hampton
 born in Call Co. Va in 1808, died in Boyd
 Co. Ky, July 25/1887 and is buried at Hampton
 Alb. Aug 31, 1828 he married Sarah
 Buchanan, dau. of William &
 Elizabeth Caldwell Buchanan.

Her father was a second cousin of
 Pres. James Buchanan, and was
 born at Lancaster Pa. In early man-
 hood he moved to Woodford Co., Ky, then
 to Montgomery Co. near Mt. Sterling,
 & finally to Lawrence Co. where he
 owned a farm of 800 to a thousand
 acres on the Big Sandy River about
 18 miles above the mouth.

Buchanan Chapel, & Buchanan
 P.O. in this neighborhood were named
 for him. He died at the age of 92.

Mr Hampton was a wealthy
 farmer, and owned a large farm
 when Hampton City & Catlettsburg
 were started. His handsome old
 brick home is still standing in
 the edge of Hampton City, and is now
 owned by Dr. Vincent. The children
 of this marriage were:

Eliza died Sept 21, 1852, & Jos. Aug 12, 1857.

Wm Hampton son of Wm
H. has a large number of deeds
for land recorded in Colwell Co. between
1825 & 1850. also several other
Hamptons of record in this period.

Dr Henry Hampton built his
house about 1800 on what was later
known as the Holderby place, in front
of where Marshall College now stands.
About the year . . . , he, in an alterca-
tion shot & killed Col. George Shertidge,
and in fighting the case in ^{the} courts
he spent all his fortune. The Holderbys
& Buffingtons getting the bulk of it.
They were his bondsmen. He
crossed the land on the Guyan river
above Guyana & the where the hand-
some old brick residence stands that
is now owned by a wealthy Charleston
man.

"There lived ^{a Great Uncle} in Prince William Co., Va.,
a brother of Dr. Henry Hampton known
as "Uncle Billy Hampton", kind
hospitable and a friend to all of
his name - He lived to quite
aged. of his descendants a son
named Richard, two daughters"

"Mrs. Sarah Brown was a half ^(sister)
sister of Dr. Henry Hampton, and
mother of Jack, Richard (father of Judge
Geo. M. Brown, Catlettburg), Dr. Benjamin
Harry, George, Rebecca who was Mrs.
Kummer & lived near Bull Run,
Va. her daughter Betsy married
Henry Clark." — Rev. Wm Hampton.

This is a mistake as Sarah
Hampton was married to Gen. Newman
Brown prior to 1778, This father did not
marry his 2nd wife Mrs. Eliza Garner
till after 1764. — just 14 yrs before his
death.

He is buried at this place and a
stone marks his resting place.
The funeral was conducted by his
grandson, ^(W. J. H.) grand father, Rev.
Wm. Hampton, of Catlettsburg, Ky.
William the eldest son of Dr. Henry
Hampton, married Malinda
Shortridge (daughter of Col. George Short-
ridge) during the winter of 1803-4,
and to them were born: Wade,
George Shortridge, William, Henry,
Levi J., Elijah M., Eli, & Louisa. (The
last two died in infancy.)
The father of these children died
Nov. 1819, and was buried just
below the mouth of Virginia
White's Creek, on the farm known
as the Josh Cyrus farm, the
first farm below the mouth of
the creek, where the same
empties into Big Sandy,
about eight miles from its
mouth (Catlettsburg).

Mrs. Hampton, the mother,
afterwards married Leonard
Sharp Dec. 1821, and by whom
she had four children; one son,
the eldest and three daughters,
Mortimer, Minerva Ann, Malinda F.,
& America. Mr Sharp after
the birth of the son the eldest child
moved to Monroe Co. Missouri,
where the other children were
born, the wife surviving
her husband and died in Mo.
