RESOLUTIONS ON THE LIFE AND DEATH OF JOHN M. BRADLY.

To the Officers and Members of R. E. Lee Camp #158 U.C.V.

FIRST. Your committee appointed to present to your Honorable Body appropriate resolutions on the life and death of Comrade John M. Bradley, beg to submit the following, viz:

SECOND. That Comrade Bradley was ^{born} at Abington, Virginia, October 12, 1846, and enlisted in Company E, 13th Virginia Battalion, Army of Northern Virginia, Confederate Army.

Comrade Bradley was twice married, one son by the first wife and three by the second wife, and two daughters.

THIRD. Comrade Bradley had resided on a farm near Birdville, Tarrant County, Texas, for the past thirty years when he died on day of 1920.

FOURTH. His last wife and the children above named survive him. On account of his living some six miles from Fort Worth was not a frequent visitor to this Camp and was known to very few if any of the present members of the Camp and the Committee has been unable to secure any further information on his life.
