SIXTIETH DAY (Monday, May 6, 1974)

#### AFTER RECESS

The Convention met at 2:30 o'clock p.m., pursuant to recess, and was called to order by the President.

Delegate Hale offered the following amendment to Section 11 of Article III:

Amend Article III, Section 11, by adding thereto a new Subsection (d) immediately following Subsection (c) and by re-designating all subsequent subsections accordingly, such new Subsection (d) to read as follows:

- No bill shall be considered and no (d) law shall be enacted which limits or defines the area to which it applies by the use of population figures or other statistical data, except that official population figures of counties may be so used under the following circumstances and none other, to wit:
- (1) If the bill or law has statewide application, to make a classification of counties in recognition of differing application of the law to counties of differing population; or
- (2) If the bill or law has less than statewide application:
- (a) to limit the area of coverage only to a select group of counties, not less than five, because of similar problems resulting from the population of such counties, or
- (b) to limit the area of coverage only to counties above or only to counties below a certain population figure.

If a bill introduced during the 140 day session is not reached for consideration due to the expiration of the session, said bill shall be carried over for consideration by the legislature at the subsequent shorter session without the necessity of having to

refile said bill, and shall be taken up for consideration at the same stage of the The amendment was read and was adopted legislative process it had reached when the prior session expired.

If not reached for consideration at the subsequent shorter session before said session expires, said bill would no longer be pending before the legislature.
