Sir:

Your favor of 26th of June 26th is recd. and for reply I regret to say that the Commissioners under the act of 24th Feb have not been appointed and therefore nothing can be collected on account of the enlistment of Slaves of loyal owners. I will advise you as soon as this is done. No regulations or instructions have been published either for the collection of the value of Slaves or the bounty. The authorities have been very slow on this subject.

The President will stand firm against negro suffrage. This subject will form the next party division. Slavery is played out the best thing now is to make the best of it.

but I am opposed to suffrage & equality.
