There are hereby appropriated to the State Board of Control for each of the fiscal years ending August 31, 1936, and August 31, 1937, all fees and receipts collected by said Board in connection with inviting bids and furnishing proposals on contracts and purchases to be awarded by the Board, together with any balances on hand at the end of any fiscal year from such receipts, to be deposited in the State Treasury and used or



paid out as other State funds to defray all necessary salaries, postage, maintenance and contingent expenses in connection with the making and furnishing of said proposals and said services.

Provided, further that the authorization that permits State Departments to excuse a part of their employees at noon on Saturday is modified for the Board of Control to provide that said Department may set its closing time on Saturdays and permit all employees to leave, provided the number of hours work during the week shall be the same as provided in the General Appropriation Bill. This provision is granted inasmuch as the Board of Control cannot function efficiently with only about one-half of the employees present.

It is hereby provided, and there is hereby appropriated, to be effective at the time and in the event the members of the State Board of Control cease to receive the \$100.00 each per month salary now provided in the Relief Act as additional compensation for administering relief, the additional sum of \$100.00 each per month out of the General Revenue Fund throughout the remainder of the biennium ending August 31, 1937; provided, if legal, that the State Comptroller shall transfer said additional monthly compensation out of the Jack and Stallion Fund of the State Department of Agriculture into the General Revenue Fund for the purpose of meeting said expenditure, or said additional compensation may be paid by the State Comptroller directly out of the Jack and Stallion Fund of the Department of Agriculture.

For the purpose of administering relief out of either Federal or State funds after December 31, 1935, there is hereby appropriated to the State Board of Control out of any relief bond moneys of any series remaining on hand on December 31, 1935, such amounts as may be necessary for the authorized relief, salaries, bonds and other administrative expenses as provided in S. B. No. 90, Acts of the Regular Session of the Forty-Fourth Legislature. The funds so appropriated herein shall be disbursed by warrants drawn by the Comptroller of Public Accounts on the Relief Bonds Fund upon invoices approved by the State Board of Control. The State Treasurer is directed not to transfer any sums of money (which have been derived from the sale of any of the relief bonds) from any of the relief bond accounts and/or special accounts to the "Texas Relief Bond Sinking Fund" until notified in writing by the State Board of Control that relief under said accounts and/or special accounts has been terminated.

All other receipts and any prior year's balance in the County and Road District Highway Fund are hereby appropriated for each of said years for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of Chapter 13, General Laws of the Third Called Session of the Forty-second Legislature and any amendments thereto, including the payment of road bonded indebtedness of Counties and Special Road Districts in accordance with said law, and any amendments.

For the purpose of paying the foregoing examination expense and such other expense as is necessary incident to the examination work and the payment of the salaries of any additional examiners, stenographers, clerks and such help as is necessary in the administration of the examining division (provided any additional employees performing similar work to the positions designated hereinabove shall not receive a greater sum of compensation than that herein provided), and for defraying all other expenses necessary for the administration of the provisions of Chapter 152 of the General Laws of the Regular Session of the Forty-second Legislature and the payment of such salaries and employees as provided therein, there is hereby appropriated all fees and assessments collected under authority of said Examining Law, together with any balances at the end of a preceding fiscal year, for each of the fiscal years ending August 31, 1936, and August 31, 1937. For supervising the examination of all companies doing business in Texas under the supervision of the Board of Insurance Commissioners, the Life Insurance Commissioner and Chairman of the Board shall receive five hundred ten dollars (\$510.00) per annum payable in equal monthly installments out of the Examination Fund by warrants drawn upon that Fund, as already itemized in said Examining Division. Before said employees, other than those itemized in the appropriation bill, are employed, the head of the department so employing shall make application to the Board of Control and receive its approval in writing therefor. Said application shall set out the reasons and necessity for the employment of the additional employees and be supported by affidavit.

Provided that the foregoing appropriations for the Casualty Division, Life Division and the Fire Division (the payments of the appropriations listed in the Examining Division have been provided for as set out at the close of said Examining Division) shall be paid out of revenues obtained from tax on gross premiums of insurance companies in accordance with existing laws, and any other unexpended balances remaining in these funds at the end of the respective fiscal years shall remain in the State Treasury as provided by law. That the portion of the gross premium tax on automobile fire insurance coverages, if and when collected from fire insurance companies, shall be added to and treated in the same manner as the gross premium tax on workmen's compensation insurance for the partial support of the Casualty Insurance Division.

derived and placed to the credit of this fund during the next ensuing two years ending August 31, 1937, are hereby appropriated and shall be used by the Game, Fish and Oyster Commission for the purpose of paying refunds, and for the establishment, construction and maintenance of fresh and salt water fish hatcheries; for the employment of superintendents, assistant superintendents and laborers for all fish hatcheries; for living quarters, fuel, water and lights for superintendents and assistant superintendents of fish hatcheries; for all necessary equipment and other expenses to enable the Game, Fish and Oyster Commission to carry out and administer the laws relating thereto; and for the salaries and expenses of employees and other expenses for the enforcement of the collection of royalties due the State for sand, shell and gravel. Provided, however, that no salary paid additional employees shall exceed the amount herein appropriated for similar positions. All disbursements shall be made on warrants by the Comptroller on State Treasury.

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Provided, the Game Commission may direct the Comptroller to permit withdrawals of petty cash expense funds of not exceeding at any one time the respective sums of fifty dollars (\$50.00) and one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each small and for each large costal boat, respectively, to be used for the cash purchase of perishable supplies, and also to be used under rules promulgated by the Board of Control for small purchases of emergency needed supplies, materials and equipment. Provided, the withdrawals shall be permitted under the same rules of the State Comptroller as apply to the prison expense funds.

Fish Propagation and Protection Fund: All moneys to the credit of the Special Fish Propagation and Protection Fund on hand in the State Treasury on September 1, 1935, together with the current revenues to be derived and placed to the credit of this fund during the next ensuing two years ending August 31, 1937, are hereby appropriated and shall be used by the Game, Fish and Oyster Commission for the purposes of the establishment of fresh and salt-water fish hatcheries; for the dissemination of useful information pertaining to the fish of this State; for the propagation and distribution and protection of fish in the State of Texas; for printing and the purchase of record books, stationery and supplies; for the employment of superintendents, assistant superintendents, and laborers for all fish hatcheries; for all necessary equipment and other expenses to enable the Game, Fish and Oyster Commission to carry out and administer the laws relating thereto; and for salaries of game and fish wardens. Provided, that no game and fish warden shall receive more



than \$100.00 per month and expenses. Provided, that no superintendent or assistant superintendent of fish hatcheries shall be paid in excess of the amount appropriated out of the Sand, Shell and Gravel Fund. All disbursements shall be made on warrants drawn by the Comptroller on State Treasury.

Provided, that all revenues, including fines, fees and penalties collected by the Game, Fish and Oyster Commission, or by its authority, from any source whatsoever, together with any and all unexpended balances in the hands of the Game, Fish and Oyster Commission on August 31, 1935, shall be paid into the State Treasury, accompanied by a statement showing from whom and what purposes said revenues, fines, penalties, and other moneys were collected, which said funds shall be placed to the credit of the several funds to which same shall be credited, and all of said moneys are hereby appropriated to and for the use of the Game, Fish and Oyster Commission, as provided hereinabove and for the purposes enumerated above and for carrying out the several provisions of the law which the said Game, Fish and Oyster Commission is authorized to administer and enforce. Provided, that no additional or other position carrying typists, stenographers, or secretarial duties, shall be created by the Commission, or anyone connected with any of the divisions of the Commission, at a salary of more than \$105.00 each per month.

No person shall receive any amount appropriated herein who, directly or indirectly, received any pay or other consideration or compensation or performs any service of any character for any landowner or person in charge of any lands in the State used as a game preserve or as a place or range for raising, propagating, or protecting the wild life of this State.

There is hereby appropriated out of the State Highway Fund for each of the fiscal years ending August 31, 1936, and August 31, 1937, the sum of \$50,000.00, which amount shall be transferred from the State Highway Fund to the General Fund of the State of Texas, in order that the State Highway Fund will bear its just part of the expense incurred by other State Departments in serving the Highway Department, and also to cover the cost of furnishing heat, water and power to the State Highway Department. The State Comptroller and the State Treasury are hereby authorized and directed to transfer the amounts herein appropriated from the State Highway Fund to the General Revenue Fund either annually or semi-annually at any time during each of the said fiscal years.

For the purpose of enabling the State Highway Commission to investigate the facts necessary for the Attorney General to defend litigation arising out of suits authorized against the State and/or the State Highway Commission, and for the purpose of enabling the State Highway Commission to investigate claims against the State of Texas and/or the State Highway Commission, growing out of Highway contracts and any and all other claims of every kind and character, and to enable the State Highway Commission to employ competent investigators and attorneys and clerical assistants, and to defray expenses in connection with such work, there is hereby appropriated out of the State Highway Fund for each of the fiscal years ending August 31, 1936, and August 31, 1937, the sum of \$35,000.00 each year. Provided, however, that no salary shall be paid in excess of the compensation allowed for the same or similar services of other employees of State departments. Provided further that all such employees shall be under the direction of the State Highway Engineer, and shall render such assistance as may be directed by the Attorney General in the investigation of any suits against the State of Texas out of the amount appropriated herein. The Attorney General of the State of Texas shall have authority to name an Assistant Attorney General who shall be assigned by said Attorney General to this particular work.

Provided, that the above and foregoing amounts appropriated herein for the State Highway Department, and for services rendered by other Agencies of the State Government to the Highway Department, shall be paid out of the State Highway Fund upon warrants issued by the State Comptroller, as provided by Chapter 1, Title 116, Revised Civil Statutes, 1925, and amendments thereto; provided, further, that all funds or balances of funds on hand September 1, 1935, and all funds coming into the State Highway Fund, and derived from registration fees or from other sources, after deducting the total of the specific appropriations herein made, are hereby appropriated to the State Highway Department for the establishment of a system of State Highways and the construction and maintenance thereof, as contemplated and set forth in said Chapter 1, Title 116, and Chapter 186, General Laws of the Regular Session of the Thirty-ninth Legislature, and amendments thereto.

The State Highway Commission is hereby expressly authorized to purchase, through the Board of Control, any additional equipment, motor vehicles and any and all other equipment of any kind or character necessary in the opinion of the State Highway Commission to properly carry out the work of said Highway Department, and said Highway Commission is expressly authorized and empowered to purchase as herein provided, through the Board of Control, any and all equipment, which is necessary, in the opinion of the Highway Commission, in order to make air maps of highways of Texas, or proposed highways.

Provided that no State Highway Funds shall be used or expended in the payment of full or partial salaries, or to participate in the supplementing of any salaries for any kind of work done for, by or under the supervision or direction of the State Highway Department, other than those amounts specifically provided in the above appropriations, where the total to be paid such additional respective employee from Federal, State, County, or other funds, exceeds the respective amount below listed, to-wit: File clerks at not exceeding \$1,050.00 each per year; bookkeepers

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at not exceeding \$1,800.00 each per year; registration, warrant, voucher, comptometer or tabulating clerks, typists, stenographers or those performing secretarial duties at not exceeding \$1,575.00 each per year; resident engineers and division engineers at an average salary of not to exceed \$3,672.00 each per year, none to exceed \$4,896.00 per year; assistant division engineers, at not exceeding \$3,060.00 per year; any other additional positions not herein specifically listed, having like duties to similar positions listed in the above itemized appropriations, at not exceeding the amounts specifically appropriated therein for such similar positions.

The State Highway Commission is hereby expressly authorized and empowered to publish a State Highway Magazine, which magazine shall be published under the direction of the State Highway Engineer, and the State Highway Commission shall be authorized to sell sufficient advertising space therein to maintain said magazine; it being the intention of the legislature that said magazine shall be operated at no expense to the State and at cost only. Employees for said magazine shall be named by the State Highway Engineer, and shall work under his direction. All sums received from advertising shall be deposited in the State Treasury in a fund to be known as State Highway Magazine Fund, and shall be withdrawn on vouchers properly issued as now required by law, and all moneys deposited in said fund are hereby expressly appropriated for the support and maintenance of said magazine. It is expressly provided, however, that said magazine shall be operated at no cost to the State. The State Highway Commission is hereby authorized to permit any other State Department or Institution to have a section in said magazine, or contribute to its publication in the way of material, information, etc., but the publication thereof shall be under the supervision of the State Highway Commission.

Provided, further, that the authorization that permits State Departments to excuse one-half of their employees at noon on Saturday is modified for the State Highway Department to provide that said Department may set its closing time on Saturday and permit all employees to leave, provided the number of hours' work during the week shall be the same as provided in the General Appropriation Bill. This provision being granted inasmuch as the Highway Department cannot function efficiently with only half of the employees present.

Provided that all printing and stationery shall be purchased through the Board of Control and shall be confined to such articles and qualities as selected and contracted for by the Board of Control.

The Highway Department of the State of Texas is specifically authorized to supervise beautification of the state highways in the State of Texas and provide necessary assistance therefor.

Provided that the Assistant Secretary of State and the Cashier shall give surety bonds payable to the Governor and his successors in office in the sum of ten thousand dollars and twenty-five thousand dollars, respectively, conditioned that they each will faithfully perform their duties and will pay over all moneys coming into their hands into the State Treasury to the credit of the State under the direction of the Secretary of State, same to be approved by the Attorney General and the Governor.
