### MUSTER-PAYMENT OF TROOPS

- 1. Units of the 36th Inf Div and attachments will be mustered for pay on Thursday 12 June 1952 at an hour and place prescribed by the Mustering Officer, who will permalty be the unit Army Instructor. (Have quadruplicate copy of payroll available for Mustering Officer.) It is requested that Mustering Officers complete muster certificates at the Finance Office as soon as possible following muster. Muster certificate must show total number of military personnel present at anytime during camp period.
- 2. Uniforms will be the same the troops are to wear for the day's duty.
- 3. Unit commanders will instruct all personnel on the importance of troop muster. No member can be paid unless mustered for pay.
- 4. Troops will be paid on Friday 13 June 1952. Class A Agents will report to the Finance Officer, 36th Inf Div, Bldg 104, at 0730 with adequate armed guard.
- 5. Officers and enlisted men will sign the payroll when paid by the Class A Agent Officer. An individual whose name is listed on the payroll as <u>Doe</u>, <u>John J.</u> will sign his name <u>John J.</u> <u>Doe</u>.
- 6. The Witnessing Officer (NOT THE AGENT) must witness payment and verify signature at the time of payment and ascertain that signature agrees with the name as typed on payroll and that the signature is on the CORRECT LINE of the payroll.
- 7. All men not present for pay, or who cannot be reached in medical installations, etc, will be redlined by the Agent Officer. All redlines will be marked "Not Paid" in signature column and initialed by the Agent Officer. Corrections made by Fin Office in amount paid column will be initialed by the Witnessing Officer. Corrections made by Fin Office in section, "Days Pay Claimed", etc, must be initialed by the CERTIFYING OFFICER.
- 8. Returns will be made by agents to the Finance Officer promptly upon completion of payments and AFTER payroll clerk has extended amounts to Organization file copy of payroll. Agents are cautioned to verify initialing required of both Witnessing and Oertifying Officers in order that their account can be cleared promptly.
- 9. After completion of paying all individuals present for pay, the Witnessing Officer will sign the original roll in the lower right hand corner, and the duplicate roll at the bottom of the page. (The Original and Duplicate rolls, together with returned funds, will be returned to the Finance Officer).

Page 2, MEMORANDUM, Muster-Payment of Troops 10. Extreme care must be exercised in making payments, and it is suggested that money be placed in separate envelopes with the individual's name thereon, showing the amount due the individual. 11. Necessary supplemental payrolls should be presented to the Finance Officer promptly in order that every individual entitled to payment may be paid prior to their departure from camp. Such payrolls as are not paid by agents will be paid at the Finance Office beginning at 1300 on payday. It will be necessary that a Witnessing Officer be present for the payment of such rolls. 12. All payrolls where check payment will be necessary (individuals who have departed prior to payday) should also be promptly turned in at the Finance Office in order that preparation for payment can be made. #### MOTOR MAINTENANCE

The following report of Col. HARRY J. LIMLEY, President of the Inspection Board, dated 4 June 1952, is forwarded to all units as a check list on Motor.

Maintenance:

"We looked into the motor maintenance today and I believe it needs a lot of improvement. My inspectors report a general lack of supervision and it appears that maintenance records being used are the Armory type rather than the field type. I believe you should use the latter system of weekly, monthly, and semi-annual maintenance during the field training period so as to familiarize personnel with the system.

"I personally made a maintenance inspection of the (---) Infantry which I shall go into in some detail and believe it reflects fairly widespread conditions. First I inquired into the scheduled maintenance and found that no after operation services are being performed in the afternoon. I believe this is wrong as no vehicle should ever be left until it is ready to move out again. A period is held at 0630 in the morning but a good many vehicles on early dispatch miss this period. I walked all thru the park and found a great many idle drivers - some picked up a rag when they saw me; others didn't. They had taken the troops to the range at 0630 and were waiting to go back after them. I spot checked a number of vehicles and found all CV Joints dirty and/or rusty. Not a single driver knew what a CV joint was or what he was supposed to do about it. I found a number of battery cases which had obviously not been taken off recently and, in fact, had broken wing nuts which made it hard for the driver to service the battery. The water in one battery was low and a number of terminals needed cleaning and recoating with grease. I found several radiators low on water and one rusty. A few valve caps were missing and a number of spare tires were mounted wrong with the valve stem in a spot that could only be reached with extreme difficulty if at all. All the winches I looked at, and there were several outside the (---), were in bad shape. The grease fittings on the left side were coated with dust and obviously hadn't been touched in a long time. The plugs on the gear boxes looked as if they hadn't been out in many a day. The cables are coated with a heavy rust preventative compound and some are in bad shape. I really believe that this compound should be removed during the field training period and that the winch cables should be cleaned and coated with light oil. I say this for two reasons. First there should be some training with the winch and secondly I believe it would be worthwhile to remove and replace this compound once a year.

"I really think motor maintenance needs a good deal of pushing and that driver training needs lots of supervision. I believe most of the drivers are carried as on the job training and the job is going to need lots of supervision to make it go."

#### CORRESPONDENCE COURSE IN ECONOMIC MOBILIZATION

- 1. The Industrial College of the Armed Forces offers a correspondence course in Economic Mobilization which is available to National Guard Officers who meet the following prerequisites:
  - a. Grade of Major or above;
  - b. Not more than 53 years of age;
  - c. Meet one of the following:

    - (4) Possess a baccalaureate degree in economics or related field.
    - (5) Possess a MOS allied to the field of economics.
  - d. Unusually well qualified officers below the grade of Major may be considered for enrollment providing they meet at least three of the prerequisites listed in the preceding sub-paragraphs (1) through (5).
- 2. The scope of the course includes, in addition to a review of the essential fundamentals, a study of priorities, allocations, profit and wage controls, procurement and purchase functions, and essentials of production, with the object of developing thought as to the best method for organizing and mobilizing the national economy in the event of a future energency.
- 3. Officers seeking to enroll in this course should submit their applications through the Division Senior Army Instructor to the AG Texas.

#### SIGNAL COMMUNICATIONS

1. Following will govern Signal Communications during Summer Training FY 1952.

#### 2. Radio

a. Division Command Net.

The Division Command Net, as outlined in Item No. 21A-4 of SOI will begin operation at 0800 hours 3 June 1952, and continue in operation for the remainder of the Field Training period unless sooner terminated by the Division Signal Officer. Type A-1 emission will be employed, depending on the availability of proficient CW operators. In the event no CW operators are available, type A-3 emission will be employed. In this case, call words as outlined in Item No. 21-5 of the SOI will be used instead of call signs.

- b. Other commands will establish a Command Net or Administrative Net as designated by the Communications Officer.
- c. Stations will comply with requirements of authentication (station and message) as outlined in SOI and SSI.
- d. Message centers will prepare "Dummy" or "Canned" messages for transmission when normal traffic matter is exhausted. Each station will transmit a minimum of one message per hour.
- e. Station interference will be referred to the Division Signal Officer immediately upon establishing identity of offending station. Net control stations will maintain nets on assigned frequencies.

#### 3. Wire.

- a. Normal wire communications will be established by all units immediately upon arrival at North Fort Hood. Line route maps and traffic diagrams will be submitted to the Division Signal Officer at the earliest possible time. Major commands will consolidate line route maps and traffic diagrams before submitting them to the Division Signal Officer.
  - b. Identification of wire circuits.
    - (1) Number designations for wire circuits are as follows:



#### 3. Message Centers.

- a. Message traffic transmitted by electrical means will be cryptographed per SOI Item No. 11-3. No message traffic classified higher than "Confidential" will be transmitted in this system.
- b. Scheduled messenger service will be maintained between major commands.
  - c. Message centers will be operated continuously.
  - 4. Signal Supply and Maintenance.
- a. Signal supply and maintendnee matters will be referred to the Division Signal Supply Officer located at the intersection of Headquarters Avenue and 19th Street in Building # B-3.
- b. Requisitions for signal supplies will be accepted from Regimental, Division Artillery, Separate Battalion and Separate Company S-4's only. Need not consolidate requisitions.

- c. Only signal equipment requiring third or fourth echelon maintenance will be accepted. Equipment may be submitted for repair from company level. Work orders are not necessary.
