SEVENTY-THIRD DAY (Wednesday, May 29, 1974)

#### AFTER RECESS

The Convention met at 9:30 o'clock a.m., pursuant to recess, and was called to order by the President.

The roll was called and the following were recorded present: 161 Present, 2 Absent-excused, 18 Absent. (Record 1, Appendix)

The Reverend Douglas White, Pastor Bellevue Baptist Church, Hurst, Texas, offered the invocation as follows:

Heavenly Father: We thank you this morning first and foremost for peace of mind, for that inner tranquillity that you do give to us when we seek divine guidance. Thank you for these men, Father, who represent scores of families, real live issues. Help them, Father, to deliberate with caution and yet, Father, to have an inventiveness and a creativity so that this whole constitution helps to administer justice in a more practical, benevolent way. Thank you, Father, for the kindness that has been shown personally while I've been here. I pray for these men and their families, the one who directs today, the deliberation. May what is done bring glory and strength to Thy name and we pray it in the name of Jesus Christ. Amen.

#### ARTICLE X ON SECOND READING

The President laid before the Convention as unfinished business Article X.

Shall Section 6 of Article X Question: as amended be adopted?

Delegate Hutchison offered the following amendment to Section 6, Article X:

Amend General Provisions Committee

Report by deleting Section 6 therefrom, renumbering Section 7 so as to become Section 8, and appropriately renumbering succeeding sections, and including a new Section 6 and a new Section 7, to read in their entirety, as follows:

Section 6. PROTECTION OF THE RONMENT. (a) It is the public policy to ENVIRONMENT. protect the quality of the State's environment, and the legislature shall enact laws implementing and enforcing this policy.

(b) Designated state agencies, as trustees for the benefit of the people of Texas, shall perform duties imposed on such agencies by laws enacted by the legislature conserving, protecting and regulating the use and appropriation of the State's air and surface waters and such other public natural resources as may be designated by law. Persons, as beneficiaries, can enforce this trust only by suits against such agencies and

only in the manner provided by law.

Section 7. DEVELOPMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES. The conservation and development of the natural resources of this State, including, but not limited to, the control, storing, preservation, and distribution of the State's storm and flood waters, the waters of its rivers and streams for all useful purposes; the reclamation and irrigation of its lands needing irrigation, the reclamation and drainage of its lands needing drainage; the preservation and improvement of the ambient air of the State and the collection and disposal or recycling of solid wastes; the conservation and development of the power, fuel and energy resources of the State; the conservation and development of the State's forests; and the navigation of its inland and coastal waters, are each and all hereby declared public rights and purposes, and the legislature shall pass all such laws as may be appropriate thereto.

Amend the Hutchison amendment by adding a paragraph 7(b) and designating the first paragraph as 7(a), Paragraph 7(b) to read as follows:

(b) No State funds provided for water development, transmission, transfer or filtration shall be used to finance any project which contemplates or results in the removal from the basin of origin of any surface water necessary to supply the reasonably foreseeable future water requirements for the next ensuing fifty—year period within the river basin of origin, except on a temporary, interim basis or except for interstate replacement.

CLAYTON WILLIAMSON ADAMS OF JASPER

The amendment to the amendment was read and was adopted by a non-record vote.

#### DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegate Barnhart offered the following amendment to the amendment:

Amend the Hutchison amendment to Article 10, Section 7 by adding after the words "lands needing drainage;" the following:

"the protection of lands by the abatement of subsidence;".

#### DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Mengden offered the following amendment to the amendment:

Amend Hutchison amendment to Section 6, Article X, by striking the phrase, "as trustees for the benefit of the people of Texas" and the sentence, "Persons, as beneficiaries, can enforce this trust only by suits against such agencies and only in the manner provided by law" in subsection (b).

The amendment to the amendment was read.

#### DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegates Doyle and Simmons who had previously been recorded as "Absent" were announced "Present".

Delegate Hutchison moved to table the amendment to the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 133 Yeas, 24 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 23 Not Voting. (Record 3, Appendix)

Delegate Gammage offered the following amendment to the amendment:

Amend the Hutchison amendment to delete Section 6 and renumber Section 7 as Section 6.

The amendment to the amendment was read.

Delegate Hutchison moved to table the amendment to the amendment.

The motion to table was lost by the following vote: 80 Yeas, 81 Nays.

#### DELEGATE PRESENT

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment to the amendment, shall the amendment to the amendment be adopted?

The President then announced that he would vote "Nay" on the motion to table, that the result of the vote would be 81 Yeas to 81 Nays, 0 Present-Not Voting, 19 Not Voting and that the motion to table was lost.

Delegates Hutchison and Gammage requested a verification of Record 4. The verification was ordered and reflected the following: 82 Yeas, 80 Nays, 0 Present-Not Voting, 19 Not Voting. (Record 4, Appendix)
