

TWO FAMOUS CONFEDERATE VICTORIES: CHICKAMAUGA

"THE GREATEST CONFEDERATE MICTORY OF THE WAR"—In 's Tennessee battle on Sept. 17 the enemy interposed between him and Burnside, he was surprised by the enemy's sudden affack upon and 20, 1863; the southern General Bragg signally defeated the 'my of the Cumberland under his three widely scattered army-corps. mond with one force and turning his left flank with another. In the ... battle of Chancellorsville, which was brought on by Lee's divining all of Hooker's plans, the Union commander . . . was forced back across the Rappahannock with the severe loss of over 17,000 men." 




