SAN ANGELO: Consultant -- Mrs. Frank Bridwell (Abilene)

Membership--58; plan to keep up growth; chairman distributing "interest indicator" (See Meetings, General)

Finance--Successful drive just completed; raised \$1,135 (non-member) and \$80 (member).
Budget of \$1,795 -- will need to be revised

Support of State and National -- \$300 pledged; \$50 for SFS

Publications--Plans for good use of; plans for use of committee; are not receiving National standing orders.

Voters Service--Completed highly successful "get out the vote" campaign in April (School Board and City elections); plan to mail questionnaires.

Bulletin--Very good; plans made to use a committee for addressing and mailing.

Public Relations--present chairman also carries TCR portfolio; need speakers bureau made up of new people; need to do lots of work in this regard.

Meetings: 1. General -- not too well attended; membership committee acts as telephone committee.

 Board--well attended; 1 per month; had 100% attendance at early May meeting.

 Units--evidently interesting programs are being prepared for; board seemed worried about attendance; plan to start reaching consensus at Unit meetings.

Minut es--Beautiful

Program: 1. State--plan to present TCR resolution to precinct conventions; have in mind a local attorney (with new baby) for Jury Item.

National--beginning excellent plans for National I under the leadership
of a wonderful chairman. They've never worked in National Program before.

3. Local--KYCounty Survey; good chairman; plan to use KYState material (on county government) and special issue of Texas Law Review (section on county) to brief committee members before they begin survey. Members are attending County Commissioner Court, City Council and School Board meetings.

Legislative--If plans are carried out to study and reach consensus at Unit meetings they will be able to function in this regard.

Committees -- Being used to some extent

Calendar of Work--Bridwell to help them plan one in June.

By-laws--One unusual feature - section stating that members' husbands or families cannot be asked for contributions during finance drive.

Policy Sheet --?

State Visits--Bridwell has been meeting with this board monthly (since October).

Baggett and Bridwell did board training on May 26.

Remarks--Since October, 1957, when this League requested state help it has made a remarkable recovery. Bridwell has worked long and hard -- their board has worked long and hard to bring this recovery about. For the first time in its history this League is beginning to carry out a full League program.

Each committee member was requested to read her section of the survey in the know sour Country manual, ON THE HOME FROMT, the bibbook KYCounty survey, The state-local realations section of the Know your State survey, and the section on county government in th August 1957 Texas Law Review.

The ten steps to a successful local current agenda were discusess and the first three steps now have been taken. The plan is for an august 6, 1958 general membership meeting at which time the new subject will be introduced to the members. During September and through until Feb, it is hoped that once a menth a unit or a general meeting will be utilized for presentation of the material collected on county government? It was not feeled at this meeting the best methods of presentation.

This plan is now presented to the board at the June 25 meeting for discussion and suggestions.

On June 27, the committee is to met and decided the exact manner and presentation to be used at the August 6 meeting.

It was the infremal concensus of this group that publication of the know Your County Booklet could not be accomplished this year. It was thought wiser to present the material to the membership as it is compiled for discussion and concerns, and recommendations. (This was not the pattern followed in doing the knew Your City Survey.)

Dear Mrs. Gaspar:

Thank you for your letter of May 31, in regard to your plans about carrying out the "Know Your County Survey." Mrs. Bridwell has given you some good advice about starting this project, and you are to be congratulated on getting a committee of ten people. After your meeting of June 5, you will no doubt have an outlook for work compiled. It is good to be using the "Know Your County" booklet, Bor its outline is very comphrehensive - but it should be tailored to fit the needs of your community. No outline needs to be rigidly followed, as the booklet says. Your outline should be based on a realistic estimate of personnel and time available for the job.

You mentioned having the Lubbock booklet - it is a magnificant job, but don't think you have to do one as ambitious. Lubbock is a larger League, with more woman power than you are, you know. In fact, I don't think there is hardly a League in Texas that could come up to the standard set here by Lubbock. It might be better for you to plan a more modest booklet, and really get it done - than to plan one too large to accomplish in the time allowed.

The 10 steps in the state publication: "On the Home Front" along with the booklet "County Government" I'm sure will furnish you with sufficient guide in making your plans. When you take Step 3 of presenting your plan to the Board, they will discuss and determine if the League is able to undertake the plan you suggest. So you are not alone in making plans - you have your entire Board to discuss this with you, and to make suggestions.

Good luck to you, and I will be glad to hear from you any time. I would particularly like to hear what plans you made in your June 5 meeting.

Mrs. Gaspar gave a report on the Know Your County Survey. The data gathered will be published in booklet form for distribution. Mrs. Gaspar recommended, as the board recommended following consensus of general membership, that the Local agenda for 1960-61 be: The League of Women Voters of San Angelo will work for a program to obtain a county-wide tax equalization by: A. Obtaining detailed information on the property valuation of this county. B. Bringing to the attention of the commissioners court discrepancies in evaluation of rural and urban properties. C. Supporting the tax assessor-collector's request for additional qualified personnel to expedite tax equalization. D. Stimulating citizen interest and participation in this program. Mrs. Caspar moved the above Local Agenda be adapted, seconded by Mrs Childress, themotion carried. The motion was made by Mrs. Tillery, seconded by Ruby McCollum, and passed, that the Local Continuing Responsibilities bet 1. Support of the revision of the San Angelo Charter. 2. Support of the development of water resources of our community. 3. Support of election procedures to: A. Encourage economy by consoledation of some voting precincts. B. Adherance to the Election Code. C. Selection of more suitable locations for voting in some precincts. D. Encourage use of voting booths. Miss Ward announced the delegates to the State Convention in Dallas would be: Miss Elizabeth Ward, Mrs. Gaspar, Mrs. Randhawa, and Miss Kathryn Brown. Looking ahead to the year 1960-61, Miss Ward emphasized the emportance of: 1. Successful Finance Drive, the next project.

3. Getting new members

4. Ever member belonging to a committee.

Each year our local League adopts a Local Current Agenda (LCA). This is the governmental issue or issues which a local League membership, at its annual meeting, decides that it wishes to devote time and effort to study, arrive at a concensus and possibly take action upon.

At the February 1 unit meeting, quite a few proposals were presented for consideration to the 17 members present. Issues presented for discussion were:

- 1. We would move our previous position on precinct realignment and consolidation of precincts from the Continuing Responsibilities up to Local Current Agenda and add the study of voting machines to this.
- 2. A study of the reports issued by the San Angelo Junio College in preparation for making the college a four-year institution.
- 3. A Know-Your-City-School Survey.
- 4- City Planning.
- 5. A study of the tax-supported recreational facilities of our city.
- 6. A study of the Board of City Development to determine whether this Board should continue to be tax-supported or privately financed.
- 7. Study the County finances taxation, budgets, etc.
- 8. Evaluation of reports of the Citizen's Progress Committee in preparation for pending bond issues.

Of these eight items, the Election procedures - Voting lachines item and the Know-Your-City-School Survey - gained the most votes.

At the Feb. 13 Board meeting, it was voted to present the following worded items to the annual membership meeting for consideration and selection. It was the concensus of the Board that womanpower would limit us to one LCA. At the time of presentation, an outlook

for work - how many meetings will be needed, the manner of presenting the material to the membership, cost of the research needed, presentation of the League's concensus to the community, etc. - will be outlined for each of the items.

- I. The League of omen Voters of San Angelo will work to secure:
 - .. Consolidation of some voting precincts.
 - B. Realignment of some precinct lines.
 - C. Strict adherence to the Election Code.
 - D. Selection of more suitable locations for voting in some precincts.
 - L. Voting booths at all precincts.

The League will study the legal provisions and general information governing the use of voting machines in counties in Texas.

II. The League of Jomen Voters of San Angelo will conduct a Know-Your-School Survey.

If it is your wish to adopt one of the other items sugges ed, make your plans for your "sales pitch" at the annual meeting March 17. Tell the members why you think it is better tailored for local League activity, what you anticipate we could do with the item, how much it would cost, how much womanpower would be needed, etc.

Recommended Items for Local Continuing Responsibilities (CR):

- 1. Support of the revision of the San Angelo Charter.
- 2. Support of the development of water resources of our community.
- 3. Votingprocedures (I. A, B, C, D, E) if not selected as the Current Agenda.
