from Report, for I have neither Horse, Saddle, or Saddle Cloth ^{of my own}
nor never shall have during my stay in England

I also send your Ac^t. Sales for four h^{ds}. Tob^o. by
Fearon Nett Proceeds £48.4.6¹/₂ to your Credit, I was a
little mistaken in the account wrote you by Dobbin of Frye
three h^{ds}. the Calculation was made only by Head, however
^{or} the Whole I hope the Ac^t. will prove satisfactory
