I herewith send you a Bill Lading and Invoice
of Goods shipped on the Sally Captⁿ Anderson
amounting to £ 50.0. 1^{1/2} which I wish safe to stand &
they may prove to Satisfaction, I think there is every
thing order'd except the Piece of Nankeen, which would
have sent, had there been any Entry on the Ship, for no
India Goods, but as there was no such Casket, the Expenses
would have been more than the Thing was worth, & the
risque too great, to ship it without ^{to take one out}. The Saddlery I am
afraid you will think dear, but I am confident you'll find
it extraordinary good. I ventur'd to break thro' your orders in
one of the Saddle Cloths I have sent one striped of a sort
of Cloth (much used in that Way here) of which tis said
the Sweat of the Horse will not go thro'. I speak of this only
from Report, for I have neither Horse, Saddle, or Saddle Cloth
^{of my own} nor never shall have during my stay in England
