FORTY-THIRD DAY (Tuesday, March 19, 1974)

AFTER RECESS

The Convention met at 9:30 o'clock a.m., pursuant to recess, and was called to order by the President.

The roll was called and the following were recorded present: 157 Present, 7 Absent-excused, 16 Absent. (Record 1, Appendix)

The Reverend Charles A. Sumners, Rector, St. David's Episcopal Church, Austin, Texas, offered the invocation as follows:

Most Holy God, God of our fathers, our Father, as citizens of this great State, we stand in thy presence. Thou knowest, most Holy God, the glory of these moments when thy sons and daughters meet in freedom with the high responsibility of strengthening the foundations of law in this State. Forgive us, dear Father, when we have failed to perceive thy will, when we have not achieved the stature our task demands. Grant, we beseech thee, to each son and each daughter of thine in this Convention the grace to ask in every decision what thy will shall be, that thy will may prevail in the formation of this Constitution for thy children in this State of Texas. We ask thy special blessing, dear Father, upon thy daughter Marie Petri. Grant to her thy healing grace and to those who minister to her thy wisdom and love. In Jesus' name, we ask. Amen.

Question: Shall Article IV as amended be adopted?

Delegate Rosson offered the following amendment to Article IV, Section 2:

Amend Article IV, Section 2(c), by deleting the last sentence and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

Each officer shall serve the term for which appointed and until his successor has been selected and qualified; provided, however, no officer shall hold over for a period in excess of six months under the provisions hereof.

The amendment was read.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Delegate Andujar was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Harris of Galveston.

Delegate Von Dohlen moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table was lost by a non-record vote.

Question: Shall the amendment be adopted?

On motion of Delegate Rosson and by unanimous consent, the amendment was withdrawn.

Delegate Rosson offered the following amendment to Article IV, Section 2:

Amend Article IV, Section 2(c), by deleting the last sentence and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

Each officer shall serve the term for which appointed and until his successor has been selected and qualified; provided, however, no officer shall hold over for a period in excess of 90 days under the provisions hereof.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Meier moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 82 Yeas, 67 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 30 Not Voting. (Record 2, Appendix)

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegates Waters, Wyatt, Canales,

Hernandez, Lary, Slack, Hale, Cobb, Lewis and Reyes, who had previously been recorded as "Absent" were announced "Present".

Delegate Rodriguez who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" was announced "Present".

Delegate Sullivant offered the following amendment to Article IV, Section 13:

Amend Article IV, Section 13(a) by inserting the words "within 60 days after adjournment" between the words "again" and "the".

The amendment was read.

Delegate Schieffer moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table was lost by a non-record vote.

Question: Shall the amendment be adopted?

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Delegate Howard was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Craddick.

The amendment failed of adoption by the following vote: 70 Yeas, 93 Nays, 2 Present-Not Voting, 15 Not Voting. (Record 3, Appendix)

PAIRED VOTE

Delegate Hoestenbach (present), who would vote "Yea", with Delegate Sherman of Potter (absent), who would vote "Nay".

Delegate Vecchio offered the following amendment to Article IV:

Amend Article IV by adding a new section to read as follows:

All elected officers of the executive department may not serve more than two four year terms in succession.

The amendment was read and failed of adoption by a non-record vote.

Delegate Denson offered the following amendment to Article IV, Section 6:

Amend Article IV by striking all of Section 6 as amended and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

Disability of elective officers of the Executive Department shall be provided by law.

The amendment was read.

(Delegate Doyle in Chair)

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Bowers who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" was announced

"Present".

(President in Chair)

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Sanchez who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

Delegate Wyatt moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 91 Yeas, 68 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 20 Not Voting. (Record 4, Appendix)

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Leland who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

Delegate Patman offered the following amendment to Article IV, Section 2:

Amend Section 2(e) of Article IV to read as follows:

(e) The governor shall have authority to remove for just cause, as defined by law, all officers who were appointed by any governor and who were confirmed by the senate. Prior to removal, the governor shall provide the senate a proposal of removal containing the cause for the recommended action. The senate may refuse the removal by a majority vote of the membership, within 45 days of submission.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Schieffer moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 84 Yeas, 77 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 18 Not Voting. (Record 5, Appendix)

CORRECTION OF ROLL CALLS FOR FEBRUARY 18 AND FEBRUARY 22.

On motion of Delegate Bock (he having voted on the prevailing side) and by unanimous consent, the vote by which his amendment to Section 18 was adopted on yesterday was reconsidered.

Question: Shall the amendment be adopted?

Delegate Garcia offered the following amendment to Article IV, Section 18:

Amend Article IV, Section 18(b) by striking same and substituting the following:

(b) The Governor shall have the power to grant one reprieve in any capital case for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days. The Governor shall also have the power, on the written signed recommendation and advice of the Board of Pardons and Paroles, or a majority thereof, to grant pardons, reprieves, and commutations of punishment, to remit fines and forfeitures, and to revoke paroles and conditional pardons.

The amendment was read and was adopted by a non-record vote.

The amendment as amended was again adopted by a non-record vote.

Article IV as amended was then adopted by the following vote: 136 Yeas, 31 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 12 Not Voting. (Record 6, Appendix)

On motion of Delegate Meier and by unanimous consent the vote by which Article IV as amended was adopted was reconsidered and tabled.

ARTICLE IV REFERRED

The President then referred Article IV to the Committee on Style and Drafting.

ARTICLE XI ON SECOND READING

The Vice-President laid before the Convention on its second reading Article XI (full report having been printed on February 28).

Delegate Schwartz explained the full report on Article XI.

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Maloney who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" was announced "Present".

Delegate Jones of Taylor offered the following amendment to Article XI, Section 1:

Amend Article XI, Section 1(a), to read as follows:

Sec. 1. AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION.

(a) Amendments to this constitution may be proposed to the qualified voters of the state by a record vote of two-thirds of the membership of each house. The legislature may submit proposed revisions of one or more sections of an article as one proposal and in the same proposal amend other sections or articles that are germane thereto.

The amendment was read and was adopted by a non-record vote.

Delegate Leland offered the following amendment to Article XI, Section 1:

Amend Article XI, Section 1, by adding the following sentence at the end of Subsection (b): "Proposed amendments shall be publicized in the English language and in such other languages as may be provided by law."

The amendment was read and was adopted by a non-record vote.

Delegate Patman offered the following amendment to Article XI, Section 1:

Amend Article XI, Section 2(a), by adding prior to the word "majority" in the first sentence the following: "two-thirds".

The amendment was read.

(Delegate Finney in Chair)

Delegate Nowlin moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table was lost by the following vote: 45 Yeas, 106 Nays, 2 Present-Not Voting, 27 Not Voting. (Record 7, Appendix)

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment, shall the amendment be adopted?

The amendment was adopted by a non-record vote.

Delegate Davis offered the following amendment to Article XI, Section 2:

Amend Article XI, Section (2) by deleting paragraphs b, c, d, e and f.

The amendment was read.

(President in Chair)

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Delegate Wieting was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of state business on motion of Delegate Bock.

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Sherman of Potter who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" was announced "Present".

Delegate Schwartz moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table was lost by the following vote: 81 Yeas, 81 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 17 Not Voting, (Record 8, Appendix)

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment, shall the amendment be adopted?

ADDRESS OF GOVERNOR CARL RAMPTON

On motion of Delegate Blanchard and by unanimous consent, The Honorable Carl Rampton, Governor of Utah, was invited to address the Convention. Governor Rampton addressed the Convention.

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Williamson who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

ARTICLE XI ON SECOND READING

The President laid before the Convention as unfinished business Article XI.

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment, shall the amendment be adopted?

The amendment failed of adoption by the following vote: 72 Yeas, 92 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 15 Not Voting. (Record 9, Appendix)

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Delegate Schieffer was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Olson.

Delegate Reynolds offered the following amendment to Article XI, Section 2:

Amend Section 2, Article XI as follows: Strike in its entirety paragraph (b) of Section 2.

The amendment was read and was adopted by the following vote: 80 Yeas, 80 Nays, 20 Not Voting. (Record 10, Appendix)

Delegate Clark requested a verification of Record 10.

The verification was ordered and reflected the following: 80 Yeas, 80 Nays. (The President announced that he voted "Nay".)

Delegate Ogg offered the following amendment to Article XI, Section 2:

Amend Section 2(d) of Article XI to read as follows:

(d) The membership at the convention shall have such qualifications and shall be elected in a manner prescribed by law. Any person elected as a delegate to the convention is ineligible to run for or hold elected public office in this state or its political subdivisions for a period of five years after the adjournment of the convention.

The amendment was read.

(Delegate Wyatt in Chair)

Amend Section 2(b), Article XI Committee Report as follows:

Strike the words "once every 20 years" on line 6 and substitute the following words: "once every 50 years".

The amendment was read.

Delegate Nowlin offered the following amendment to the amendment to Article XI, Section 2:

Amend the Reynolds amendment to Section 2(b) of Article XI by deleting the figure "50" and inserting in lieu thereof the figure "30".

The amendment to the amendment was read and was adopted by a non-record vote.

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment as amended, shall the amendment as amended be adopted?

The amendment as amended was adopted by a non-record vote.

Delegate Clayton offered the following amendment to Article XI, Section 2:

Amend Article XI, Section 2(e) by

striking the word "majority" and placing in its place the figure "2/3".

The amendment was read and was adopted by a non-record vote.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Delegate Donaldson was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Lary.

Delegate Leland offered the following amendment to Article XI, Section 2:

Amend Article XI, Section 2, by adding the following sentence at the end of Subsection (e): "Proposals shall be publicized in the English language and in such other languages as the convention determines."

The amendment was read and was adopted by a non-record vote.

Hale offered the following Delegate amendment to Article XI, Section 1:

Amend Article XI in Section 1(b) by changing the period to a comma at the end of the first sentence, and adding thereto the following: "or at such other time as the legislature may determine."

The amendment was read and was adopted by a non-record vote.

Delegate Geiger offered the following amendment to Article XI, Section 2:

Amend Article XI, Section 2 to read as follows:

Sec. 2. CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION. (a) The legislature by a record vote of a 2/3 majority of the membership of each house may submit to the qualified voters of the state question of whether to call a question. The question constitutional convention. The question shall be submitted at the first statewide general election occurring at least six months after the legislature proposes A constitutional convention shall question. be called if approved by a majority of the qualified voters voting on the question.

(b) The legislature shall, at the next legislative session following approval of a constitutional convention by the qualified voters, provide by law for the time, place, and duration of the convention; fix and provide for the pay, allowances, and expenses of delegates and officers; and provide for

the expenses of the convention.

One delegate shall be elected from (c) each representative district in existence at the time of such election and shall have the same qualifications for office as a member of the house of representatives. Delegates shall be elected and vacancies filled as provided by law. No other provision in this constitution shall prohibit a public officer from serving as a delegate.

(d) The constitutional convention may, by a 2/3 vote of its membership, propose any revision or amendments to the constitution in

a manner consistent with this section. The convention shall determine the manner of submission, the date of the election, and the manner of publicizing the proposals to be Proposals shall be publicized in voted on. the English language and in such other languages as the convention determines.

(e) Any proposed revision or amendments shall become effective, as the convention provides, if approved by a majority of qualified voters voting on the question.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Schwartz moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by a non-record vote.

(b) Initiative petitions containing the required number of signatures shall be filed with the Secretary of State for verification. The question shall then be put on the ballot at the first statewide election held more than 90 days after the petition is filed. An initiative measure is adopted if it is approved by a majority of those voting on the question, and if the total votes cast in the election equal one—third of the votes cast for Governor in the last preceding gubernatorial election. The adopted measure goes into effect 90 days after the final canvass and declaration of the results of the election.

Amend Article XI, Section 2(d) by striking the first sentence thereof.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Schwartz moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table was lost by a non-record vote.

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment, shall the amendment be adopted?

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Poerner who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" was announced "Present".

The amendment was adopted by the following vote: 89 Yeas, 72 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 18 Not Voting. (Record 13, Appendix)

Question recurring on the adoption of Article XI as amended, shall Article XI as amended be adopted?

Article XI as amended was adopted by the following vote: 149 Yeas, 13 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 17 Not Voting. (Record 14, Appendix)

On motion of Delegate Schwartz and by unanimous consent, the vote by which Article XI was adopted was reconsidered and tabled.
