THE CHIPMUNKS

URBAN CHIPMUNK

Thank God I'm a country boy/ The Gambler/ Lunch box (with Jerry Reed)/

of the Country/ Made for each other (with Brenda Lee)/ On the road again.

Three recent releases on the mid-priced RCA International  
range prove how wide the spectrum of Country music <sup>really</sup> is.

The Rockabilly collection which features British acts, includes  
two, Matchbox and Shakin' Stevens, who have been featured on the British  
pop charts recently. Of the remainder, Crazy Cavan and the Rhythm Rockers,  
have been around for years, while the Deltas are relative newcomers who  
show great promise. Rock Island Line and Johnny Storm complete this  
compilation, with each artist featured on two tracks. Some further  
historical notes about the recordings would have completed this collection.

Although Helen Cornelius has now gone solo, the 'Greatest Hits' collection traces her duet career with Jim Ed Brown and is for those who like easy listening music. The ten tracks include five Country No1's starting with the controversial, (at the time), 'I don't want to have to marry you', which launched their career together in 1976.

Finally, hot on the heels of last year's 'Urban Cowboy' movie soundtrack album, comes the comedy reply, 'Urban Chipmunks' from those three little rodents. The ten tracks album includes some of the best country songs of the last few years, like, 'On the road again' and 'The Gambler'; it <sup>also</sup> features guest appearances by Brenda Lee and Jerry Reed. Cast in the Chipmunks own inimitable mould, this is one for the younger generation.
