 Wm. W. Allen

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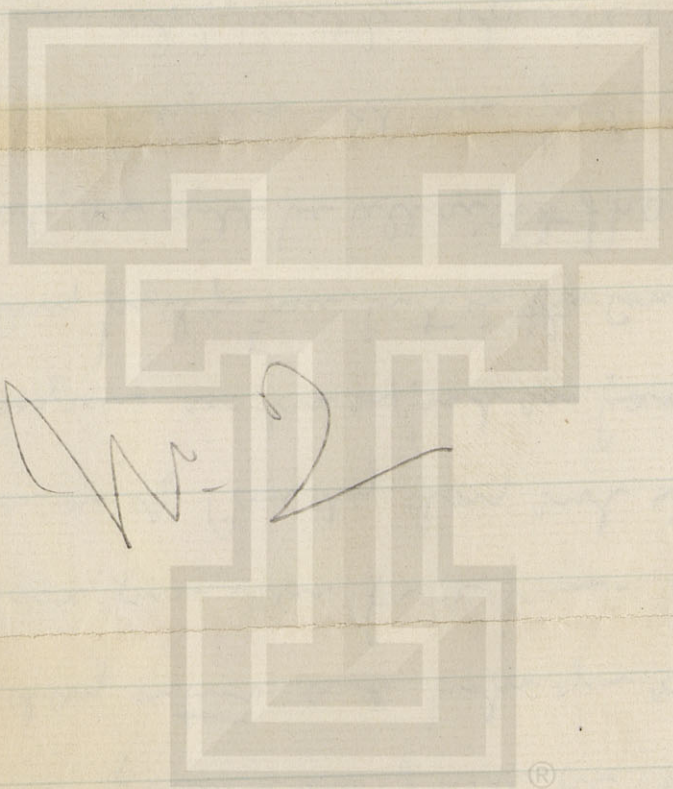
Jennie included are doing very well
