

Dear Sir:

After the abortive December 9, 1986, COMA election evening, the committee appointed to study the proxy vote did meet on the following Saturday, December 13, 1986, to study the matters. Subsequent thereto on December 16, 1986, the same committee did write a letter to the executive committee, wherein it advised that in our considered opinion the proxy vote was still valid for the reasons as pointed out in that letter. I do not believe that the contents of this letter were made known to the general membership by the executive committee, and in fact it is my understanding that the executive committee saw fit to seek another "legal opinion", which other legal opinion concurred entirely with the recommendation made previously by the appointed committee.

At any rate, my purpose in writing is to point out again to the membership what we had hoped the executive committee would point out, and this being that aside from the proxy vote validity, that we as a committee simply felt that there was too much danger of abuse of the proxy vote as it currently stands. However for whatever reason, that recommendation was not made known to the membership and the concern that the committee felt in having to live with the proxy.

It is now my further understanding that there are certain factions within the COMA membership that are seeking to solicit the proxy vote. I myself, speaking individually, am still much against the proxy vote. I believe the committee called its shots as it had to, but I would again express my concern that our displeasure with the proxy situation was not made known to the rest of the membership.

I would at this point solicit and encourage each and every COMA member to not sell or so lightly give away his or her individual vote and that instead to be present at the COMA elections and cast his vote and not give a blanket endorsement of any particular group of candidates. I believe this committee very carefully considered what it had to do and it at this time would be a shame that at the other extreme we have a possible abuse of this unfortunate situation.

In order to make the selection of the outstanding businessman a fair and equitable proposition, we have adopted the following procedures:

- Each chamber selected their representative based on their own selection criteria.
- 2. The resume was then forwarded to San Antonio.
- The committee in San Antonio collected all the resumes and made copies of them to distribute.
- 4. The San Antonio committee now is mailing each chamber a copy of all of the resumes received.
- We are asking each chamber to review and study all of the resumes.
- 6. After thorough consideration has been given, we are asking each chamber to pick the top three candidates and rank them in their order of selection, i.e. first, second and third.
- Mail the results to San Antonio, where they will be tabulated. The winner will be the individual who receives the most votes.

- 9. The chamber that sponsored the winner will have to notify the winner and take appropriate steps to insure that the recipient will be present at the annual meeting to receive his award.

It is imperative that you act on this matter promptly as we must have all replies in by July 5, 1976 in order that we can tabulate the votes and notify all the members of the results on a timely basis.

In response to your letter regarding future funding for CCMA, I want to report that during the negotiations currently underway between representatives of the City Council and representatives of the Board of City Development Board of Directors, the city negotiators verbally requested the following:

- That funding provided by the Board of City Development to CONA for fiscal 1985-86 be at the same level and amount as was the funding for fiscal 1984-85 (\$52,750).
- That funding from the Board of City Development to COMA for fiscal 1986-87 be one-half of 1985-86 funding (\$26,375).
- That the funding be deleted and eliminated in its entirety for fiscal 1987-88.

In line with this request, the Board of Directors of the Board of City Development has approved an amount in its budget for 1985-86 for COMA in the amount of \$52,750 which is the same level of funding as was that for fiscal 1984-85.

We would be most happy to meet with you and your group to discuss this budget and future CONA budgets at a time mutually agreeable to all.

Pursuant to your request to appear before the Implementation Team regarding COMA's funding for the 1985-86 year, such an appearance is not necessary.

It is not this Team's prerogative to set the budget for the Board of City Development or the Chamber of Commerce. In fact, while the Team discussed the BCD budget in detail and made comments, the BCD half of the implementation Team was told that the ultimate decision regarding the budgetary appropriation of their funds rested within their Board. Any discussion or disagreement C.O.M.A. has with their budget appropriation should be discussed with the Board of City Development.

To date, in fact, the City Council has not seen nor approved the BCD adopted budget for 1985-86, though such an approval was agreed upon by this Team. If you have any questions, please contact me.
