While in the 8th Ga. I served in the valley of Va. was in the first battle of Manassas, Winchester Va. Harper's Ferry, Martinsburg Va. Leesburg Va. New Market, Yorktown, Aitinton Maryland, Fredericksburg, Cold Harbor, Seven Pines, Second battle of Manassa.

I was wounded near Culpepper court house Va. on picket duty and afterwards assigned to the 9th Ga. battallion of artillery company A. We accompanied Longstreets down to Chickamauga Ga. was in the fight at Campbell's Station while on the way to Knoxville Tenn.

Battle of Knoxville, after this time was sent back to northern Va. I was with Breckenridge at Lynchburg. Then transferred to north side of James river near Richmond Fort Gilmore in heavy artillery. Captain Barnes was killed the day before Lee surrendered to Grant at Appomattox. and surrendered with Lee. There are other battles I participated in but the wilderness and Petersburg is all I remember now. was in the last battle fought day before surrender. I have W. L. Shaw & W. B. Miller O. L. Townsend.
