



Their son, John Brayton Pitts, was born on the Atlantic Ocean, August 26, 1798, in a sailing ship. He was one month old when the ship landed at Charleston, S. C. Thus was founded the American branch of the Pitts family. The Sir Christopher Wren tower was added to the church in 1698. The church had been rebuilt by Mren in 1671. 



Funeral Set Monday For C. M. Malone

Funeral services for Clarence M. Malone, 75, one of Texas' most noted leaders in finance and agriculture, will be held at 11 a.m. Monday at St. Luke's Methodist Church.

A Houston resident 55 years, Malone died Friday in his home at 4 Westlane.

He was vice-chairman of the board of the Bank of the Southwest, a director of the Mount Co., General Crude Oil Co., Gulf Atlantic Warehouse Co. and the Ft. Worth Passenger Terminal.

Malone also was a trustee of the Robert A. Welch Foundation, a director of the Chamber of Commerce and a member of Texas Bankers and American Bankers associations.

He was organizer of the Houston Dairy Fund Assn., which finances stock in Houston area dairy plants, and the founder of the Texas Friends of the Land, which promotes conservation.

Born in San Angelo, Malone was reared on a Hayes County farm.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Alice Malone; daughters, Mrs. Eldredge B. Ryman, Lufkin; Mrs. Jack Williams, Jr., Saratoga, Cal., and Miss Dorothy Malone, a student at the University of Texas; son, Clarence M. Malone, Jr., Houston; and brother, Clayton E. Malone, Waco.
