Benjamin Jefferson Turner was born February 4, 1845 in Henry County, Georgia to Pleasant Barnett Turner 1821-1860 and his wife, Aholibamah B. (Harper) Turner 1818-1900.

On October 2, 1869, Benjamin married Indiana "India" Cincinnatus Fleming in Rusk, Cherokee Co., Texas.

The couple spent most of their married life in Texas, moving to the towns of Henderson, Cooke, then Castro Co., and Texico in Curry Co., New Mexico before moving back to Texas.

Known as B. J. or B. Turner on his military records, Private Turner served during the Civil War with the Confederate States of America, Co. B, 3rd Regiment, Texas Cavalry (South Kansas-Texas Mounted Volunteers). Source: Civil War Soldiers and Sailors System and Ancestry.com.

Benjamin Jefferson Turner was 76 years old when he passed away in Hereford, Texas. His wife, Indiana, and several children survived him.

History of Private B. J. Turner's regiment:

3rd Cavalry Regiment, organized at Dallas, Texas, in June, 1861, contained men recruited at Marshall, Henderson, Ladonia, Greenville, and Dallas. It was also called

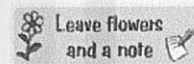

"South Kansas-Texas Regiment" probably because it was organized to serve in Kansas. It fought at Wilson's Creek and in October, 1861 had 38 officers and 669 men present for duty. Later the unit fought at Chustenahlah and Elkhorn Tavern, then moved east of the Mississippi River. After participating in the Battles of Iuka and Corinth, it was assigned to Ross' Brigade and served with the Army of Tennessee during the Atlanta Campaign. The regiment skirmished in Tennessee and ended the war in Mississippi attached to the Department of Alabama, Mississippi, and East Louisiana. It was included in the surrender on May 4, 1865. The field officers were Colonels Robert H. Cumby, Elkanah Greer, and Hinchie P. Mabry; Lieutenant Colonels Giles S. Boggess and Walter P. Lane; and Majors J.J.A. Barker, George W. Chilton, and Absalom B. Stone.

Before me the undersigned authority on this day personally appeared India Turner to me personally known and who being by me duly sworn does upon her oath state that the following facts are true. to wit;

THAT I am the widow of Benjamin Jefferson Turner a Confederate soldier who was a member of Company B Third Texas Regiment under command of Sull Ross, that he was a volunteer private.

THAT my husband rendered valuable service to the Confederacy and that the War closed while he was away at home on an honorable furlough.

THAT he served with Jackson and Johnson when they called for volunteers.

THAT he was paralyzed for fifteen years prior to his death as result of hardships endured during the war.

SWORN TO AND SUBSCRIBED before me this the 10th day of July 1925 A.D.
