work.

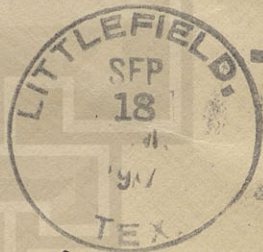
Does Yada get a salary?
