MINUTES OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING APRIL 29, 1958

The Board of Directors of Texas Technological College met in a special session in the Colonial Room, Driskill Hotel, Austin, Texas, at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 29, 1958. The following Directors were present: Chairman Watkins, Mr. Callaway, Mr. Hinn, Mr. Wall and Mr. Wooldridge. In addition, President Jones, Vice President and Comptroller Pennington, Secretary Wells and Supervising Architect Barrick were present.

- 1576. The Board reviewed the building plans for an addition to the Textile Engineering Building and for a Classroom and Office Space Building as presented by Mr. Nolan Barrick, Supervising Architect.
- 1577. The Board recessed at 9:40 a.m. to go to the Hearing Room of The Texas Highway Building for the opening of the bids on the State of Texas Constitutional Tax Bonds, 1958 Series, the printing of the bonds and for the paying agency in connection with the bond issue.
- 1578. The Board Meeting reconvened in the Colonial Room of the Driskill Hotel at 11:05 a.m.
- Upon motion made by Mr. Wall, seconded by Mr. Callaway, the Board unanimously approved the Minutes of the Board Meeting of April 12, 1958.
- 1579. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Callaway, the Board unanimously approved the Agenda under the date of April 24, 1958, (Items No. 1407 through No. 1575). A copy of the approved Agenda is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 1.
- 1580. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Wall, the Board unanimously approved a letter supplement to the contract of Mr. Wyatt C. Hedrick, Architect and Engineer, Fort Worth, Texas, for the Proposed Additions, Alterations and Renovations of Jones Stadium, Texas Technological College, Lubbock, Texas. A copy of the letter from Mr. Wyatt C. Hedrick is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 3. (Re: Item No. 1406, Board Minutes of April 12, 1958).
- Mr. Wall emphasized the fact that Mr. Hedrick had agreed to proceed with the plans and specifications for the entire proposed project; that the plans and specifications are to be prepared so that bids may be taken on the entire project and/or by sections; and that the College would not be obligated to Mr. Hedrick for Architectural and Engineering fees except for the work that the Board contracted.
- 1581. Mr. Pennington reported to the Board that the fund-raising campaign had reached \$994,000.00 by 8:00 p.m. on April 28, 1958, and that he was sure the campaign would exceed one million dollars by the close of the day on April 30, 1958.
- 1582. Mr. Pennington reported to the Board that the contract with Cumerford, Inc., Kansas City, Missouri, would expire on April 30, 1958, and that it was very desirable that the present office be kept open for a short time while a temporary office is being erected on the college campus near the Athletic Business Office. The Board, by common consent, empowered the Campus Stadium Committee to make the necessary plans to keep a minimum operation for the fund raising campaign active, including the operation of the Avenue Q office and the erection of a small office on the campus, with all expenses of erecting and operating the office to be paid from the campaign funds.
- 1583. Upon motion made by Mr. Callaway, seconded by Mr. Wooldridge, the Board, by a unanimous vote, authorized the Secretary to sign Proxies to vote at Stockholders meetings in those companies in which Texas Technological College holds stock.
- 1584. Upon motion made by Mr. Wooldridge, seconded by Mr. Wall, the Board unanimously approved the following new courses for the School of Home Economics:

- 1585. Upon motion made by Mr. Wall, seconded by Mr. Callaway, the Board unanimously approved incorporating the Notice of the Special Meeting of the Board of Directors of Texas Technological College in the Board Minutes. A copy of the notice is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 8.
- 1586. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Callaway, the Board unanimously approved the Schematic Plans for an addition to the Textile Engineering Building and authorized the Administrative Officers of the College to proceed with the plans and specifications. The estimated cost of the addition is \$290,000.00 and will be financed from funds secured through the sale of Board of Directors of Texas Technological College, State of Texas, Constitutional Tax Bonds, Series 1958.
- 1587. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Callaway, the Board unanimously approved the Schematic Plans for a New Classroom and Office Space Building and authorized the Administrative Officers of the College to proceed with the plans, specifications, and cost estimates for a building with straight walls and plans, specifications, and cost estimates for a building with off-set walls and to report on the comparative cost at the July Board meeting. The estimated cost of the Classroom and Office Space Building is \$1,118,000.00 and will be financed from funds secured through the sale of Board of Directors of Texas Technological College, State of Texas, Constitutional Tax Bonds, 1958 Series.
- 1588. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Callaway, the Board, by a unanimous vote, approved the employment of Haynes and Kirby, 1902 Dixie Drive, Lubbock, Texas, as Architects and Engineers for the Addition to the Textile Engineering Building and the Remodeling of the Old Textile Engineering Building.
- 1589. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Callaway, the Board, by a unanimous vote, approved the employment of Butler-Kimmel Company, 412 Avenue M, Lubbock, Texas, as Architects and Engineers for the New Classroom and Office Space Building.
- 1590. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Wall, the Board, by a unanimous vote authorized President Jones to approve the fees to be charged for the 1958 Summer School Workshop Courses in Home Economics.
- 1591. President Jones read a letter from Mr. Charles C. Thompson expressing his appreciation for the action of the Board in voting to confer upon him the LL.D. degree on June 2, 1958. A copy of the letter from Mr. Thompson is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 14.
- 1592. Upon motion made by Mr. Wall, seconded by Mr. Hinn, the Board, by a unanimous vote, authorized the inclusion of an annual salary of \$18,000.00 for the President of Texas Technological College in the Legislative Budget Requests for the fiscal years ending August 31, 1960 and 1961.

1593. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Wooldridge, the Board, by a unanimous vote, accepted the bid of Phelps, Fenn and Company and Associates, 39 Broadway, New York City 6, New York, for the Board of Directors of Texas Technological College, State of Texas, Constitutional Tax Bonds (Obligations Payable from A Tax Levied by The Constitution of the State of Texas, Article VII, Section 17, as Amended), Series 1958, in the amount of \$3,710,000.00 to provide funds for the purpose of Acquiring, Constructing and Initially Equipping New Buildings and Other Permanent Improvements at Texas Technological College. The bids were opened in Austin, Texas, on April 29, 1958, at 10:00 a.m. A copy of the Official Notice to the purchaser is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 10. A tabulation of the low bids is attached and made a part of the Minutes. Attachment No. 13.

1594. Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Wooldridge, the Board, by a unanimous vote adopted a Resolution authorizing the issuance of Captioned bonds by the Board of Directors of Texas Technological College, designated as Constitutional Tax Bonds, Series 1958, in the amount of \$3,710,000.00 to provide funds for the purpose of acquiring, constructing and initially equipping buildings and other permanent improvements at Texas Technological College. The caption on the Bond Resolution is given below:

RESOLUTION

BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TEXAS TECHNOLOGICAL COLLEGE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$3,710,000.00, BEARING INTEREST AT THE RATES HEREINAFTER SET FORTH, AND MATURING AS HEREINAFTER PRESCRIBED, TO PROVIDE FUNDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING, CONSTRUCTING AND INITIALLY EQUIPPING BUILDINGS AND OTHER PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS AT TEXAS TECHNOLOGICAL COLLEGE, PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF THE BONDS, PLEDGING TO THE PAYMENT OF THE INTEREST AND PRINCIPAL THEREOF THAT PART OF THE MONEY ALLOCATED TO SUCH INSTITUTION FROM THE CONTINUING TAX LEVIED BY THE CONSTITUTION UNDER ARTICLE VII, SECTION 17, AS AMENDED, PROVIDING FOR THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF SAID BONDS AND PRESCRIBING THE DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS OF SAID BOARD AND OF THE STATE IN REFERENCE THERETO, AND MAKING CERTAIN COVENANTS WITH RESPECT TO SECURING PAYMENT OF SAID BONDS AND INTEREST.

Attachment No. 13. The bids were opened in Austin, Texas, on April 29, 1958, at 10:00 a.m.

Upon motion made by Mr. Hinn, seconded by Mr. Wooldridge, the Board, by a unanimous vote, accepted the bid of the American Bank Note Company, 118-132 E. 20th Street, Chicago 16, Illinois, for the printing of the Board of Directors of Texas Technological College, State of Texas, Constitutional Tax Bonds, Series 1958. 1597. Upon motion made by Mr. Wooldridge, seconded by Mr. Wall, the Board, by a unanimous vote, approved a resolution of appreciation to Mr. Maurice M. Hatcher, Vice President, First National Bank of Dallas, Dallas, Texas, expressing the gratitude of the Board of Directors of Texas Technological College, for his assistance as Fiscal Agent on the sale of the Constitutional Tax Bonds, Series 1958. Dear Mr. Watkins:

Confirming conversation with you and five members of your Board, your president and others present, Saturday afternoon, April 12, in the President's office at the college in Lubbock, we were asked by your Director, Mr. C. I. Wall, the following question: Would you be willing to proceed on the basis of getting out plans so that we may take bids to determine what the over-all picture will cost on the proposed stadium? We do not have sufficient money at this time to carry out the entire program. We have approximately \$900,000.00 plus which will go towards the work, subject of this letter. We need, however, to know what we can do and how we can do it through plans or otherwise, and we now ask your suggestion and recommendation.

To which question I stated, "Mr. Wall, Mr. Watkins and other members of your Board and those present, it will be our pleasure to proceed immediately to get out sufficient plans in detail, including specifications, to take bids in sections, showing what can be built by the contractor's bids in detail from said completed plans and specifications within a period of 90 days from this date. This 90-day period would be governed largely by our ability to get all preliminary details settled within 30 days."

I further stated on subject matter above in answer to Mr. Wall's question that the college would owe us only for what work they let a contract for, that at the time of receiving bids they would know what the whole project would cost and they could let what work they had money for or otherwise arrange for. I further requested the moral support of the Directors that if, as and when the final work went ahead that we would then, of course, be retained as the architect-engineer to superintend and handle the work in this connection.

This supplemental letter is now given to you with a copy to Business Manager, Mr. M. L. Pennington and President Jones as a matter of record that we are pledging ourselves to proceed with this work based on the contract dated April 16, 1957, between the college, represented by you as President-Owner and Hedrick and Stanley, Architect-Engineer. All other conditions for the contract will remain as heretofore agreed upon and this is merely a supplement to certain contract in the form of a further agreement to permit the work to proceed without delay if at all possible.

It was my understanding at the conclusion of the meeting that this suggestion on our part in answer to the request of Mr. Wall was acceptable.

We then agreed to have our Mr. William Parrish at Lubbock in the College Architects' office not later than noon Tuesday the 15th and then and there, with your coach and other committeemen proceed to get preliminary details finally agreed upon for the development of working drawings, etc.

Accordingly, Mr. Parrish will present a copy of this letter tomorrow to Mr. Pennington and President Jones and yours is being mailed to you today, and if there are any additions, corrections or supplements to this letter they will be acceptable in the spirit and in the kind of their intent.

Thank you, and through you all members of the Board and the Committee, for this valued business and trusting all of us will be able to bring forth a finished product that will be the source of much revenue and great public relations and happiness to the student body and to the officers of the school.

RESOLUTION

BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TEXAS TECHNOLOGICAL COLLEGE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$3,710,000.00, BEARING INTEREST AT THE RATES HEREINAFTER SET FORTH, AND MATURING AS HEREINAFTER PRESCRIBED, TO PROVIDE FUNDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING, CONSTRUCTING AND INITIALLY EQUIPPING BUILDINGS AND OTHER PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS AT TEXAS TECHNOLOGICAL COLLEGE, PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF THE BONDS, PLEDGING TO THE PAYMENT OF THE INTEREST AND PRINCIPAL THEREOF THAT PART OF THE MONEY ALLOCATED TO SUCH INSTITUTION FROM THE CONTINUING TAX LEVIED BY THE CONSTITUTION UNDER ARTICLE VII, SECTION 17, AS AMENDED, PROVIDING FOR THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF SAID BONDS AND PRESCRIBING THE DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS OF SAID BOARD AND OF THE STATE IN REFERENCE THERETO, AND MAKING CERTAIN COVENANTS WITH RESPECT TO SECURING PAYMENT OF SAID BONDS AND INTEREST.

WHEREAS, Section 17 of Article VII of the Constitution of Texas adopted on the 23rd day of August, 1947, in addition to all other taxes permitted by the Constitution of Texas, levied a continuing ad valorem tax on all of the taxable property in the State at the rate of Five (5ϕ) Cents on the \$100.00 valuation to create a fund for the purpose of acquiring, constructing and initially equipping buildings or other permanent improvements at the institutions of higher learning designated therein; and

WHEREAS, such provision of the Constitution authorized the governing boards of the institutions therein designated to issue bonds and notes
payable from such fund therein created, and pursuant to such authorization the
Board of Directors of Texas Technological College has heretofore issued and
sold bonds and notes; and

WHEREAS, all such bonds and notes have been paid in full and are no longer outstanding; and

WHEREAS, Section 17 of Article VII of the Constitution of Texas was amended as a whole by an amendment thereto adopted at the general election November 6, 1956, which became operative and effective January 1, 1958; and

WHEREAS, Section 17, as amended, of Article VII of the Constitution (hereinafter called the "Constitutional Provisions") has levied and thus renewed a continuing ad valorem tax on all of the taxable property in the State at the rate of Five (5¢) Cents on the \$100.00 valuation for the purpose of creating a fund (hereinafter called the "Fund"), for acquiring, constructing and initially equipping buildings or other permanent improvements at the institutions of higher learning designated in the Constitutional Provision; and

WHEREAS, such continuing tax levy became effective as of January 1, 1958 and such tax will become due and payable in each year until the bonds and notes authorized by the Constitutional Provision are paid; and

WHEREAS, the Constitutional Provision provides for an allocation of the Fund for the ten year period commencing January 1, 1958, among the 12 designated institutions of higher learning (hereinafter sometimes called "Eligible Institutions") and has authorized the governing board of each of the Eligible Institutions to pledge all or any part of the Fund allocated to it to pay the principal of and interest on bonds scheduled to mature on or before September 1, 1968, and provides for reallocation of the Fund at the beginning of the subsequent ten year period and for the pledging anew by the governing board of each such institution the part of the Fund reallocated to such institution to secure bonds scheduled to mature during such ten year period; and

WHEREAS, the Constitutional Provision provides that the Comptroller of Public Accounts of the State of Texas will, on June 1, 1958, make to the Eligible Institutions, including Texas Technological College, the allocations of the funds to be raised by such tax for the ten year period beginning January 1, 1958, the allocation to each such institution to be based on the ratio that the figure representing its average long session full-time student equivalent enrollment for the preceding five year period bears to the figure representing the average long session full-time student equivalent enrollment for all of the Eligible Institutions for the preceding five year period of time; and

WHEREAS, the money placed in the Fund and allocated to Texas
Technological College (hereinafter called the "College") shall be hereinafter
referred to as the "Allocated Fund"; and

WHEREAS, although the figures for the last half of the fifth year of the preceding five years are not yet available, however, the long session full-time student equivalent enrollment for Texas Technological College as well as all other Eligible Institutions has now been ascertained for four and one-half of the five preceding years, viz.: (a) for the College - 58,292,

(b) for all 12 of the Eligible Institutions - 276,021;

and

WHEREAS, the assessed value of property in the State of Texas (less homestead exemptions) subject to such tax levy, according to the approved tax rolls for the year 1957 was \$9,369,280,580.00, which valuation, together with the figures representing the average long session full-time student equivalent enrollment for four and one-half of the preceding five years, affords a basis for estimating the amount of money to be received by the College under such tax levy for the year 1958; and

WHEREAS, based on such valuation and the official estimates of the valuations for the other years of the ten year period beginning January 1, 1958, and on the long session full-time student equivalent enrollment for four and one-half of the five preceding years, it has been officially estimated that the College will receive in the Allocated Fund a total of \$10,372,789.00 during the ten year period beginning January 1, 1958; and

WHEREAS, it has been and is hereby determined to be to the best interest of the College that \$3,710,000.00 in principal amount of bonds payable from the Allocated Fund be issued at this time, and that action necessary to the issuance thereof be taken by this Board;

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TEXAS TECHNOLOGICAL COLLEGE:

1. <u>Definitions</u>: That throughout this Resolution, in the bond form prescribed herein and in the bonds authorized hereby, the following terms and expressions as used herein shall have the meanings set forth, to-wit:

The term "Additional Bonds" shall refer to the additional parity bonds that are permitted to be issued by Section 12;

The term "Board" shall refer to the Board of Directors of the College;

The term "Bonds" shall refer to the bonds authorized to be issued under the provisions of this resolution;

The term "Resolution" shall mean this resolution authorizing the Bonds.

2. <u>Authorization</u>. That in order to provide funds for the purposes of acquiring, constructing and initially equipping buildings and other permanent improvements at Texas Technological College, Bonds are hereby authorized to be issued known as "Texas Technological College Constitutional Tax Bonds, Series 1958".

3. Principal Amount; Denomination; Interest Rates. That the Bonds shall be in the denomination of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars each, shall be numbered from One (1) to Three Thousand Seven Hundred Ten (3,710), both inclusive, and shall bear interest at rates as follows:

Bonds Nos. 1 to 850, both inclusive, 3% per annum; Bonds Nos. 851 to 3,710, both inclusive, 2% per annum. Such interest shall be payable on January 1, 1959, and semi-annually thereafter on each July 1 and January 1.

4. Date of Bonds; Maturity Schedule. That the Bonds shall be dated April 1, 1958, and shall become due and payable serially as follows:

- 5. Banks of Payment. That the principal of and the interest on the Bonds shall be payable, without exchange or collection charges to the owner or holder thereof, at The Fort Worth National Bank, Fort Worth, Texas, (hereinafter called "Principal Bank of Payment") or, at the option of the holder, at Bankers Trust Company, New York, New York (hereinafter collectively called "Banks of Payment") in lawful money of the United States of America upon surrender of proper Bond or coupon.
- 6. Bonds of Issue on Parity. That no one of said Bonds shall be entitled to priority over any other Bond of this issue in the application of the money in the Allocated Fund which has been pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds, irrespective of the fact that some of the Bonds may be delivered prior to the delivery of other Bonds, it being the intent of this Resolution that all Bonds of this issue shall rank equally.

- 7. Execution of Bonds and Coupons. The Bonds of which this is one are secured by a pledge of that part allocated to Texas Technological College of the proceeds of a continuing tax on all of the taxable property in the State levied by Section 17, as amended, of Article VII of the Constitution, at the rate of Five (5ϕ) Cents on each \$100.00 of assessed value thereof, accumulated and held in the State Treasury to be used solely to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds. The levy of such tax supporting the Bonds and the pledge thereof will remain effective so long as any of the Bonds are outstanding and unpaid.

The Board of Directors reserves the right to issue additional parity bonds under the terms and conditions stated in the Resolution authorizing this Bond and the series of which it is a part, and said bonds may be made payable from the same source, secured in the same manner and placed on a parity with this Bond and the series of which it is a part.

That official recognition is hereby given to these facts: (a) That Article VII, Section 17. as amended, of the Constitution has levied a continuing ad valorem tax on all property in the State of Texas, at the rate of Five (5¢) Cents on the One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) of valuation; (b) that such tax has been effective since January 1, 1958 and will remain effective so long as any of the Bonds is outstanding and unpaid; (c) that as and when the proceeds from such tax levy are received by the Comptroller of Public Accounts the net amounts realized therefrom (including the portion thereof allocated to the College) are deposited in the State Treasury to be held for the purposes set forth in such section of the Constitution; (d) that it is the duty of the Comptroller of Public Accounts to draw all necessary and proper warrants upon the State Treasury to effectuate the pledge of such money made in this Resolution and to facilitate payment of the Bonds, the Additional Bonds and interest thereon; and (e) that while such tax will remain effective so long as any of the Bonds or the Additional Bonds is outstanding and unpaid, for practical purposes the Board must arrange the installment maturities of the Bonds and the Additional Bonds and make its pledge of the Allocated Fund so that the Bonds and Additional Bonds will be actually retired out of taxes collected during the ten year period beginning January 1, 1958. Accordingly, the Board pledges to the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds the following:
 - (1) All of the money, of any, now in the State

 Treasury to the credit of the College, realized to date

 from the collection of such continuing tax levied for

 the year 1958;
 - (2) All of the proceeds from such continuing tax to which it is entitled levied for each of the years 1958 to 1967, both inclusive, being the tax which according to law becomes due on October 1 of each of said years;
 - (3) In the event that any of the Bonds or any interest thereon remains outstanding and unpaid on the date the last of the Bonds is scheduled to mature, and

in the event the Interest and Sinking Fund, created by Section 13 hereof shall then contain insufficient money to pay all of such principal and interest and the expense incidental to the making of such payments, to the extent of such deficiency, the proceeds from such continuing tax to which the College may be entitled under the original allocation or the reallocation arrangement then in effect are pledged and such pledge shall remain effective until the Bonds shall have been paid in full with interest thereon; but when full provision shall have been made for the final payment of the Bonds by depositing money sufficient for the purpose in the Interest and Sinking Fund, the obligation under this subsection (3) will have been fully satisfied and the pledge will have been released; and

(4) The money pledged to the payment of the Bonds shall be used solely to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds and to defray the expense incident to such payments so long as any of the Bonds or interest thereon is outstanding and unpaid. After full provision shall have been made by accumulating in the Interest and Sinking Fund sufficient money available for the purpose, which can be used for no other purpose, to pay all of the Bonds and interest calculated thereon to maturity, the Board reserves the right to use money in excess thereof for such purposes as may be permitted under the Constitutional Provision.

Provided, however, the Board of Directors reserves and shall have the right and power to issue pursuant to the Constitutional Provision additional parity bonds in one or more series, (herein defined as "Additional Bonds") which Additional Bonds, when issued, shall be secured by and payable from the Five Cent (5ϕ) tax levied by the Constitutional Provision for the ten year period beginning January 1, 1958, in the same manner and to the same extent as the Bonds; and the Additional Bonds permitted by this Section 12, when issued,

shall be in all respects of equal dignity and on a parity with the Bonds. Provided, further, that Additional Bonds will not be issued in an aggregate principal amount that will cause the total amount required for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds and the Additional Bonds in any year to be more than 85% of the amount of such taxes officially estimated by the Comptroller of Public Accounts to be collected in such year for the credit of the Allocated Fund.

- (b) Upon receipt by him of a certified copy of this Resolution the State Treasurer shall place to the credit of the Interest and Sinking Fund all money, if any, of the Allocated Fund of the College;
- (c) As received into the State Treasury the Allocated Fund of the College shall be credited to the Interest and Sinking Fund in the manner and to be held in accordance with the pledge contained in Section 12 hereof.
- accordance with the requirement of the Constitutional Provision that "The State Comptroller of Public Accounts shall draw all necessary and proper warrants upon the State Treasury, in order to carry out the purpose of this amendment", to the end that money will be available at the Banks of Payment in ample time to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds, as such principal and interest, respectively, matures, the Comptroller of Public Accounts of the State of Texas, on or before December 15, 1958, and on or before June 15, 1959, and thereafter on or before December 15 and June 15 of each year while any of Bonds is outstanding and unpaid, shall draw a warrant against the Interest and Sinking Fund in the amount of the interest or interest and principal (when both are scheduled to mature) which will become due on the January 1 or July 1 next following. The amount of each such warrant shall be increased by the

amount of the charges of the Banks of Payment for making payment of the Bonds or coupons or both Bonds and coupons scheduled to mature in each such instance. Within the discretion of the Comptroller of Public Accounts he may draw a separate warrant for the payment of such charges.
