 the son of Sir William Brown
 of England, one of the original
 grantee and adventurers,
 in the Virginia Charter
 granted May 23 1607.
 by King James I to Robert,
 Earl of Salisbury and
 several others named therein
 of whom said Sir William
 Brown was the fourth on
 the long list —
